

ORDER OF THE BOARD OF  
AGRICULTURE AND FISHERIES.

(DATED 3RD DECEMBER 1907.)

The Board of Agriculture and Fisheries, by virtue and in exercise of the powers vested in them under the Diseases of Animals Acts, 1894 to 1903, and of every other power enabling them in this behalf, do order, and it is hereby ordered, as follows:

*Authorised Exhibitions of Fat Swine.*

1. Notwithstanding anything contained in the Swine-Fever (Infected Areas) Order of 1902, and Orders of the Board dated the twenty-seventh and twenty-eighth days of September, 1907, exhibitions and sales of fat swine may be held at the premises and on the dates mentioned in the Schedule hereto, on the following conditions:—

(i.) The swine must be moved to the exhibition with a Licence under the Swine-Fever (Infected Areas) Order of 1902, which Licence shall be delivered up at the entrance to the sale by the person in charge of the swine to a person appointed by the Local Authority to receive the same.

(ii.) The swine exposed at the exhibition may be moved from the exhibition along over or across a highway or thoroughfare in the administrative county of the Isle of Wight to any bacon factory or slaughter-house specified in the Licence if accompanied by a Licence authorising such movement—in the Form set forth in the Schedule to the Swine-Fever (Infected Areas) Order of 1902 or to the like effect—granted by the Local Authority of the county of the Isle of Wight.

(iii.) The swine shall before being moved from the exhibition be marked by and at the expense of the owner by the painting, with an indelible composition of red colour, of a broad line down the back and another broad line across the loins of each of the swine, thus +, each line being not less than nine inches long.

(iv.) The Licence shall be in force for not more than four days inclusive of the day of issue.

(v.) The swine shall be moved by the nearest available route and without unnecessary delay.

(vi.) The Licence under this Order for the movement of swine from the sale to a bacon factory or slaughter-house shall forthwith after completion of the movement be delivered up at, or sent by post to, the nearest Police Station by the person in charge of the swine at the time of completing the said movement.

(vii.) The swine shall be detained at the bacon factory or slaughter-house and there slaughtered within five days after their arrival at such premises.

(viii.) A copy of every Licence granted under this Article shall be sent by the Inspector granting the same to the Local Authority of the District wherein the place of destination of the swine is situate.

*Production of Licences; Names and Addresses.*

2.—(1.) Any person in charge of a pig being moved, where under this Order a Movement Licence is necessary, shall, on demand of a Justice, or of a constable, or of an Inspector or other

officer of the Board or of a Local Authority, produce and show to him the Licence, if any, authorising the movement, and shall allow it to be read and a copy of or extract from it to be taken by the person to whom it is produced.

(2.) Any person so in charge shall, on demand as aforesaid, give his name and address to the Justice, or constable, or Inspector or other officer.

*Local Authority to enforce Order.*

3. The provisions of this Order shall be executed and enforced by the Local Authority.

*San Luis Obispo Bay—Non-Existence of Shoal in.*

With reference to Notice to Mariners No. 1577 of 1907:—

The United States Government has given further notice, dated 9th November, 1907, that a careful but unsuccessful search has been made for the shoal reported by the steamship Catania to be situated at a distance of about 2½ cables N. 78° W. from White Rock in San Luis Obispo Bay. As no indication of danger was found in this locality the shoal has been erased from the chart.

Approximate position, lat. 35° 9½' N., long. 120° 42½' W.
