following species of Wild Birds in the same manner as if those species were included in the

schedule to the Act:

Chaffinch, Chiffchaff, Buzzard, Falcon, Flycatchers, Harriers, Hawfinch, Hobby, Kestrel, Linnet, Martins, Merlin, Nuthatch, Osprey, Ousels, Pipits, Redpole, Shrikes, Swallow, Swift, Tits, Wagtails, Warblers, Wheatear, White-throats, Wrens, Wryneck.

Certain Birds protected during the whole of the Year.

III. During the period between the 31st day of July in any year and the 2nd day of March following, the killing or taking of the following species of Wild Birds is prohibited throughout the County Borough of Bath:—Bitterns, Buzzards, Chough, Crossbill, Dotterel, Peregrine Falcon, Godwits, Goldfinch, Grebes, Hobby, Kestrel, Kingfisher, Kite, Merlin, Nightjar, Osprey, Ring Ousel, Owls, Oystercatcher, Raven, Redshanks, Redstarts, Siskin, Spoonbill, Terns, Wantails Woodpackers Wrens Wagtails, Woodpeckers, Wrens.

All Birds protected on Sundays throughout the County Borough.

IV. During the period between the 31st day of July in any year and the 2nd day of March following, the killing or taking of Wild Birds on Sundays is prohibited throughout the County Borough of Bath.

LONDON CAB AND STAGE CARRIAGE ACT, 1907.

The Secretary of State for the Home Department being satisfied that it will not be possible to obtain a sufficient supply of cabs for the proper accommodation of the public at certain London railway stations unless the operation of so much of section 2 of the London Cab and Stage Carriago Act, 1907, as requires the Railway Company to show no preference to any cab, nor to give any cab a privilege which is not given to other cabs, be suspended, has exercised the power conferred on him by sub-section 2 of section 2 of the said Act by issuing Orders, dated the 5th December, 1907, exempting from the operation of the said section:

All stations on the Great Central Railway except Marylebone Station;

All stations on the Great Eastern Railway except Liverpcol-street and Fenchurchstreet Stations;

All stations on the Great Northern Railway except King's Cross Station;

All stations on the Great Western Railway except Paddington Station;

All stations on the London Brighton and South Coast Railway except Victoria and Loudon Bridge Stations:

All stations on the London and North-Western Railway except Euston Station.

All stations on the London and South-Western Railway except Waterloo,

All stations on the Midland Railway except St. Pancras Station;

All stations on the South Eastern and London Chatham and Dover Railway except Victoria, Charing Cross, London Bridge, Cannon-street, Holborn Viaduct, and Ludgate Hill Stations.

The Secretary of State has allowed a sum not exceeding one penny as the amount which may be charged for each admission of any cab for the purpose of plying for hire at the stations named above which are not exempted from the operation of the section, and also at all stations of the North London Railway Company.
