

Military Service of the Crown named in the first part of the Schedule hereto, and shall not apply to any of the vehicles employed in the Military Service of the Crown named in the second part of the Schedule hereto if and whenever any of such vehicles named in the second part of the said Schedule are employed in connection with the field training or manœuvres of any portion of the Military Forces of the Crown, or if and whenever the military necessities of the public service in the discretion of the General Officer Commanding-in-Chief that portion of the Military Forces of the Crown with which any of such vehicles are employed or in the discretion of His Majesty's Principal Secretary of State for the War Department require that any of such vehicles named in the second part of the said Schedule shall not for the time being carry or display the light or lights required to be carried or displayed by vehicles in accordance with the provisions of the said Lights on Vehicles Act, 1907.

SCHEDULE.

FIRST PART.

Gun carriages or limbers, ammunition wagons or limbers, general service wagons carrying ammunition, machine guns, small arm ammunition carts, tool wagons, tool carts, technical stores wagons, technical stores carts, cable wagons, limbered general service wagons, air-line wagons, balloon wagons, gas reservoir wagons, wagons for collapsible boats, trestle wagons, pontoon wagons, travelling ovens and water carts.

SECOND PART.

General service wagons, bread and meat wagons, forage carts, ambulances, Maltese carts, bicycles and road locomotives not falling within the Motor Car Acts 1896 and 1903.

The KING's Most Excellent Majesty in Council.

WHEREAS by the "Weights and Measures Act, 1904," it is (among other things) enacted, that it shall be lawful for His Majesty, by Order in Council, to specify new fees to be paid in respect of the verification and stamping of weights, measures, and weighing and measuring instruments in substitution for the fees specified in the first schedule to the Weights and Measures Act, 1889, and that any Order in Council so made may be varied or revoked by a subsequent Order in Council:

And whereas His Majesty, by Order in Council dated the twelfth day of January, one thousand nine hundred and five, directed that the fees specified in the schedule to that Order should be taken in substitution for the fees specified in the first schedule to the Weights and Measures Act, 1889:

And whereas the Board of Trade have represented to His Majesty that it would be expedient

to vary the said Order in Council of the twelfth day of January, one thousand nine hundred and five, and to substitute new fees to be taken in respect of the verification and stamping by Inspectors of Weights and Measures of the weights, measures, and weighing instruments mentioned in the schedule hereto:

And whereas it has been made to appear that the fees specified in the schedule hereto are reasonable and proper:

Now, therefore, His Majesty, by virtue of the power vested in Him by the said Act, by and with the advice of His Privy Council, is pleased to direct that the fees specified in the schedule hereto annexed shall be taken accordingly in substitution for the fees specified in the schedule to the Order in Council dated the twelfth day of January, one thousand nine hundred and five.

This Order shall come into operation on the first day of February, one thousand nine hundred and eight.
