LIGHT RAILWAYS ACT, 1896. Halesowen Light Railways (Transfer, &c.) Order.

WHEREAS a new church has lately been built within the parish of Corsenside, in the county of Northumberland, and in the diocese of Newcastle, and has been consecrated and dedicated to All Saints.

And whereas the Right Reverend Norman Dumenil John, Bishop of the said diocese of Newcastle, as such Bishop, and the Reverend Walter Ernest Holme, Cierk in Holy Orders, as Patron of the vicarage of the said parish of Corseuside, and also as Vicar or Incumbent of the same vicarage, have by an Instrument under their hands bearing date on or about the fifteenth day of November, in the year one thousand nine hundred and seven, certified to us, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, that it would be for the convenience of the said parish of Corsenside, that the said new church of All Saints, situate within such parish, should be substituted for the old parish church (dedicated to Saint Cuthbert) of the same parish.

Now, therefore, we the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, in exercise and execution of the power or authority in that behalf contained in the Act of the eighth aud ninth years of Her late Majesty Queen Victoria, chapter seventy, and in the Act of the nineteenth and twentieth years of Her said late Majesty,

chapter fifty-five, and of all other powers or authorities in anywise enabling us in the same behalf, do by this Instrument under our common seal, with the consent (testified as hereinafter mentioned) of the said Norman Dumenil John, Bishop of the said diocese of Newcastle, and of the said Walter Ernest Holme, hereby declare that the said new church of All Saints, situate within the said parish of Corsenside, and duly consecrated as aforesaid shall be and the same is hereby substituted for the said old parish church (dedicated to Saint Cuthbert as aforesaid) of the same parish, and that such new church shall henceforth be the parish church of the said parish of Corsenside, in lieu of the said old parish church of Saint Cuthbert as fully in all respects as if the said new church of All Saints, so hereby substituted had been originally the parish church of the same parish; and we, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, in further pursuance and exercise of the powers and authorities aforesaid, and with such consents as aforesaid (testified as hereinafter mentioned) do hereby transfer all the endowments, emoluments and rights of or belonging to the said old parish church (dedicated to Saint Cuthbert as aforesaid) of the said parish of Corsenside, or of or belonging to the Vicar or Incumbent thereof, to the said new church of All Saints (now being by virtue of these presents the parish church of the said parish of Corsenside) and to the Vicar or Incumbent thereof and his successors for ever.

In witness whereof to these presents we, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England have set our common seal, and the said Norman Dumenil John, Bishop of the said diocese of Newcastle, has set his hand and affixed his episcopal seal, and the said Walter Ernest Holme has set his hand and affixed his seal this fifth day of December, in the year one thousand nine hundred and seven.

No. 1883.—MEDITERRANEAN—EGYPT, ALEXANDRIA HARBOUR.

Great Pass—Beacon Light Exhibited; Intended Leading Lights and Beacons.

With reference to Notice to Mariners No. 1419 of 1907:

The Egyptian Government has given further notice, dated 18th November, 1907, that an iron framework beacon, painted brown, has been erected, in a depth of about 25 feet, on the southern side of the entrance to the Great Pass, in a position from which Boghaz Gas-beacon bears N. 59° E., distant 10 6 cables.

A white fixed light, elevated 47 feet above the

sea, and visible in clear weather from a distance of 5 miles, will be exhibited from this beacon until the Great Pass is opened to traffic; and at the same time the gas-buoy moored close northward of its position will be removed.

II. Also, that the dredging of the Great Pass having been completed, the dredging lights have been discontinued, and the poles on which they were placed will shortly be removed.

The pass, which is 600 feet wide, and has a least depth of 35 feet throughout its length, will probably be available for navigation about the end of the present year.

Approximate position, Great Pass Beacon, lat. 31° 10′ N., long. 29° 48½′ E.

III. Further, that on the opening of the Great Pass to navigation, the undermentioned lights and leading marks will be established:-

a. Three fixed lights, the upper and lower being red and the centre one white, placed vertically 15 feet apart, the upper light being elevated 58 feet above the sea, and visible in clear weather from a distance of 5 miles, will be exhibited from a cylindrical masoury lighthouse, 64 feet in height, painted in red and white bands, erected near the shore, in a position from which Mex High Lighthouse bears S. 63° E., distant $4\frac{1}{10}$ cables, and Mex Low Lighthouse N. 27° E.

The lights will be catadioptric of the 4th The lantern is surmounted by a spike and ball, and dwellings with red roofs stand near the lighthouse.

This lighthouse in line with Mex High Lighthouse by day, or the five vertical lights in line by night, S. 63° E., will lead through the centre of the pass.

b. The character of the light exhibited from Great Pass Beacon will be altered from white fixed to white occulting every five seconds (unwatched).

c. An iron framework beacon will be erected on the southern side of Great Pass, on a rock with a depth of 8 feet over it, situated northward of Hydrographer Shoal, and within 30 yards of the side line of the pass.

d. A similar beacon will be erected on the northern side of the pass, on the southern end

of North Shoal.

e. Leading beacons to mark the sides of the pass, in the same manner as Boghaz Pass is marked, will be erected on the shore.

When the Great Pass is opened, the Boghaz Pass will be closed for night traffic, and the two red lights in Mex Low Lighthouse, and the white occulting light shown from Boghaz Gas-beacon, will not be exhibited from that date until further
