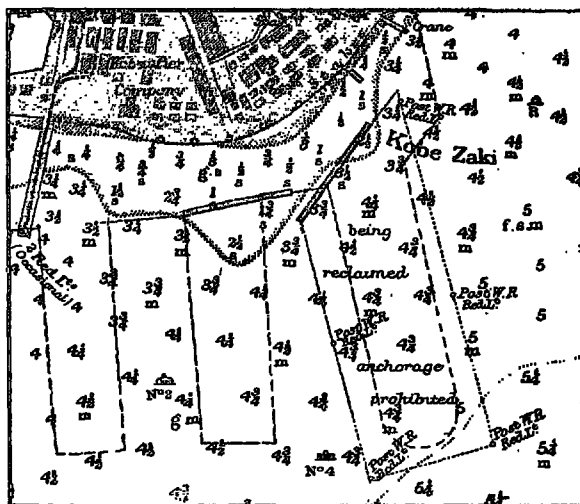
NOTICE TO MARINERS.

Kobe Bay—Prohibited Anchorage.

The Japanese Government has given notice, dated 2nd November, 1907, that anchorage is prohibited to the southward of Kobe Zaki, Kobe Bay, within an area marked by red and white poles, each carrying a red light, as shown on the accompanying reproduction of a portion of Admiralty Chart No. 2265 :—
