III. His Majesty, His heirs and successors, in Council may at any time revoke, alter or amend this Order.

IV. This Order shall be published in the Nyasaland Government Gazette, and shall thereupon commence and come into operation.

And the Right Honourable the Earl of Elgin, K.G., one of His Majesty's Principal Secretaries of State, is to give the necessary directions herein.
