The KING has been pleased, by Letters Patent under the Great Seal of the United Kingdom of Great Britain and Ireland, bearing date the 14th January, 1908, to confer the dignity of a Knight of the said United Kingdom upon Charles George Hillersden Allen, Esq., Indian Civil Service, Chairman of the Corporation of Calcutta.

The KING has been pleased, by Warrants under His Majesty's Royal Sign Manual, bearing date the 11th instant, to direct Letters Patent to be passed under the Seal appointed to be kept and made use of in place of the Great Seal of Scotland, granting the rank and dignity of Counsel to His Majesty to James Clark, Esq., Advocate, and Edwin Adam, Esq., Advocate, Members of the Scottish Bar.

By virtue of an Act passed in the twenty-fourth year of the reign of His Majesty King George III, intituled "An Act to repeal so much of two Acts made in the tenth and fifteenth years of the reign of His present Majesty, as authorizes the Speaker of the House of Commons to issue his Warrant to the Clerk of the Crown

for making out Writs for the Election of Members to serve in Parliament in the manner therein mentioned, and for substituting other provisions for the like purposes"; and of an Act passed in the twenty-sixth year of the reign of Her Majesty Queen Victoria, intituled "An Act to further limit and define the time for proceeding to Election during the Recess."

I DO hereby give notice, that the death of John Hammond, Esq., late a Member serving in this present Parliament for the county of Carlow, hath been certified to me in writing under the hands of two Members serving in this present Parliament, and that I shall issue my Warrant to the Clerk of the Crown to make out a new Writ for the Electing of a Member to serve in this present Parliament for the said county of Carlow, at the end of six days after the insertion of this notice in the London Gazette.
