*Bata Bay Light—Alteration in.*

The Spanish Government has given notice, dated 31st December, 1907, that on 15th October last the white fixed light at Bata was replaced by a red fixed light, elevated 64 feet above high water, visible in clear weather from a distance of 10 miles, and shown from an iron framework support surmounting a small house erected at a place known as Nueva Bata; it has been placed on the chart at a distance of 14½ cables N. 62° E. from the former light.

Approximate position on Chart No. 1361, lat. 1° 52' N., long. 9° 48¾' E.

*Calatrava (Mosquito Point)—Light Established.*

The Spanish Government has given notice, dated 31st December, 1907, that on 19th October last a green fixed light, elevated 59 feet above high water, visible in clear weather from a distance of 8 miles, was established on an iron framework support surmounting a small house erected on the extremity of Mosquito Point in the vicinity of a new town named Calatrava:
