ORDER OF THE REGISTRAR-GENERAL IN ENGLAND.

Whereas by the 10th section of the Marriages and Registration Acts Amendment Act, 1837 (7 Wm. 4 and 1 Vict. c. 22) it is enacted that the Registrar-General may unite any two or
