in charge of such dog or other animal from the carriage, immediately upon request by the conductor, and in default of compliance with such request may be removed by or under the direction of the conductor.

- 23. No person shall enter, mount, or remain in or on any carriage with loaded fire-arms, or with any article, instrument, or implement which may be dangerous or offensive to any passenger.
- 24. No person shall wilfully obstruct or impede any officer or servant of the Company in the execution of his duty, upon or in connection with any carriage or tramways of the Company, or interfere with any portion of the machinery or appliances used in the operation of the car, or remove any implement or other property of the Company therefrom.
- 25. The conductor of each carriage shall enforce or prevent the breach of these Bye-laws and Regulations to the best of his ability.
 - 26. Any person offending against or commit-

ting a breach of any of these Bye-laws or Regulations shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding forty shillings for each and every such offence.

- 27. The expression "conductor" shall include any officer or servant in the employment of the Company and having charge of a carriage.
- 28. There shall be placed and kept in a conspicuous position inside of each carriage in use a printed copy of these Bye-laws and Regulations.
- 29. The Bye-laws made by the Company on the 17th July, 1905, are hereby repealed.
- 30. These Bye-laws shall come into force on the 1st day of July, 1908.
