The KING's Most Excellent Majesty in Council.

WHEREAS the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England have in pursuance of an Act of the sixth and seventh years of Her late Majesty Queen Victoria, chapter thirty-seven, sections six and eight, duly prepared and laid before His Majesty in Council a scheme bearing date the ninth day of April, in the year one thousand nine hundred and eight, in the words and figures following, that is to say:—

"We, the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, in pursuance of the Act of the sixth and seventh years of Her late Majesty Queen Victoria, chapter thirty-seven, have prepared and now humbly lay before Your Majesty in Council the following scheme for authorizing the sale and disposal of certain properties in the parish of Heston, in the county of Middlesex, now

vested in us.

"Whereas under and by virtue of a certain indenture bearing date the thirteenth day of December, one thousand eight hundred and ninety-nine, and made or expressed to be made between Sarah Salmon, Elizabeth Salmon, and Rosina Salmon, all of the Grange, Heston, in the county of Middlesex, spinsters, of the first part, Frederick Wilkin, of Lower Cousley Wood, Wadhurst, in the county of Sussex, of the second part, William Wilkin, of Number 15, Hyde Parkstreet, Hyde Park, in the county of Middlesex, of the third part, the said Sarah Salmon of the fourth part, and us the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England of the fifth part, the lands and hereditaments situate in the said parish of Heston, described in the first part of the Schedule hereunto annexed became with their appurtenances and are now vested in us.

"And whereas under and by virtue of a certain other indenture bearing date the seventeenth day of December, one thousand nine hundred and three, and made or expressed to be made between the Reverend Benjamin Oswald Sharp, Vicar of the vicarage and parish church of Heston, in the county of Middlesex, of the first part, us the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England of the second and fifth parts, the Right Reverend Arthur Foley, Lord Bishop of London, the Patron of the said vicarage of Heston, of the third part, and the Governors of the Bounty of

Queen Anne for the Augmentation of the Maintenance of the Poor Clergy of the fourth part, the lands and hereditaments situate and arising in the said parish of Heston, described in the second part of the Schedule hereunto annexed, became with their appurtenances and are now vested in us.

"And whereas the said lands and hereditaments are not subject to any outstanding beneficial lease or grant, but are now in possession, but some portions thereof on account of their character or situation, are unsuitable or inconvenient to be held or applied for the purposes for which estates vested in us are applicable under the Acts by which our proceedings are

governed.

"And whereas with a view to the advantageous appropriation of the same, or of the proceeds thereof, for the ultimate improvement of our common fund it is expedient that the said lands and hereditaments or such part or parts thereof as we shall at any time and from time to time think fit, should be sold or disposed of, and accordingly that we should be empowered to sell or dispose of our interest in such lands and hereditaments or in any part or parts thereof, in such manner as shall appear to us advisable.

"Now therefore we humbly recommend and propose that we may be authorized and empowered by instrument or instruments, in writing, duly executed according to law from time to time to sell or dispose of and duly to convey according to the provisions of the said Act all or any part of the said lands and hereditaments so vested in us as aforesaid, with their appurtenances and all our estate right title and interest therein or in any part or parts thereof unto and to the use of any person or persons desirous or willing to pur-chase the same and his her or their heirs executors administrators or assigns or otherwise as he or they shall direct or appoint and for such consideration as shall upon due calculation and enquiry appear to us to be just and reasonable it being our intention to invest the proceeds of such sale from time to time as occasion may arise in the purchase of other lands tithes reut-charges tenements or hereditaments or of some estate or interest therein convenient to be held by us for the purposes of the Acts by which our proceedings are governed as aforesaid, and in the meantime to invest the said proceeds in some

public securities in England.

"And we further recommend and propose that nothing herein contained shall prevent us from recommending and proposing any other measures relating to the matters aforesaid or any of them in accordance with the provisions of the said Acts or of any other Act of Parliament."

"The SCHEDULE to which the foregoing

scheme has reference:-

"FIRST PART.

"All that piece or parcel of land situate at North Hyde, in the parish of Heston, in the county of Middlesex, containing twenty-five acres or thereabouts, bounded on the north side by the private canal there, which said land is delineated and coloured pink on the plan drawn on the said indenture of the thirteenth day of December, one thousand eight hundred and ninety-nine, together with the free and uninterrupted right in common with others entitled thereto to use free from obstruction the whole of the said private canal, the position of which is indicated on the said plan, and also in manner aforesaid to use the canal intended to be made to lead from Heston Farm into the said private canal if and when the same shall be made, and also the free right of passing and repassing with horses, carts, waggons and other vehicles, or on foot for all purposes upon, through and over the road marked on the said plan extending from the public road leading from Heston at the point marked A on the said plan to the public road leading to Cranford at the point marked B on the said plan, and through or over the towing paths by the side of the said private canal and proposed canal and through and over the road intended to be made from Hoston Farm into the high road to Heston aforesaid, and also all such estate and interest or respective estates and interests as the said several persons parties to the aforesuid indenture of the thirteenth day of December, one thousand eight hundred and ninety-nine, of the first, second, third and fourth parts respectively are possessed of or entitled to, of and in all that piece or parcel of land covered with water forming part of the said private canal and delineated and coloured blue on the said plan.

"SECOND PART.

" All those pieces or parcels of land containing two hundred and forty-six acres one rood and twenty-one perches or thereabouts situate in the said parish of Heston, together with the messuages and buildings erected and being thereon, which said pieces or parcels of land and hereditaments are delineated and coloured pink and green on the plan drawn on the said indenture of the seventeenth day of December, one thousand nine hundred and three, together with the full benefit of an annual rent of thirty pounds secured by and of the covenants and conditions contained in a certain indenture bearing date the twenty-fifth day of July, one thousand nine hundred and one, and made or expressed to be made between the Vicar of Heston of the one part and the Governor and Company of the New River brought from Chadwell and Amwell to London of the other part, whereby certain rights and easements in, through, upon, under and over the strips of land shown by the green colour on the said plan were granted to the said Company."

And whereas the said scheme has been approved by His Majesty in Council: Now, therefore, His Majesty, by and with the advice of His said Council in June 2014. of His said Council, is pleased hereby to ratify the said scheme, and to order and direct that the same and every part thereof shall be effectual in law immediately from and after the

"We, the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, in pursuance of the Act of the sixth and seventh years of Her late Majesty Queen Victoria, chapter thirty-seven, have prepared and now humbly lay before Your Majesty in Council the following scheme for authorizing the sale and disposal of certain property in the parish of Godmanchester, in the county of Huntingdon,

now vested in us.

"Whereas under and by virtue of the several indentures, particulars whereof are set forth in the schedule hereunder written, the lands and hereditaments situate in the parish of Godmanchester aforesaid, and particularly described in the same indentures and schedule became with their appurtenances and are now vested in us.

"And whereas none of the said lands and hereditaments are subject to any outstanding beneficial lease or grant but are now in our possession, but some portions thereof on account of their character or situation are unsuitable or inconvenient to be held or applied for the purposes for which estates vested in us are applicable under the Acts by which our proceed-

ings are governed.

WHEREAS the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England have in pursuance of the Act of the seventh and eighth years of Her late Majesty Queen Victoria, chapter ninety-four; of the Act of the thirteenth and fourteenth years of Her said late Majesty, chapter ninety-four; and of the Act of the thirty-second and thirty-third years of Her said late Majesty, chapter ninety-four, duly prepared and laid before His Majesty in Council a scheme or representation bearing date the twenty-sixth day of March, in the year one thousand nine hundred and eight, in the words and figures following, that is to say:—

"We, the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, acting under the provisions of the Act of the seventh and eighth years of Her late Majesty Queen Victoria, chapter ninety-four, the Act of the thirteenth and fourteenth years of Her said late Majesty, chapter ninety-four, and the Act of the thirty-second and thirty-third years of Her said late Majesty, chapter ninety-four, have prepared and now humbly lay before Your Majesty in Council the following scheme or representation for altering the boundaries of the new parish of Saint Thomas, Brampton, the new parish of the Holy Trinity, Chesterfield, and the new parish of Saint John, Newbold with Dunston, all in the county of Derby and in the diocese of Southwell.

"Whereas by the authority of an Order of His late Majesty King William the Fourth in Council, bearing date the first day of August in the year one thousand eight hundred and thirty-two and published in the London Gazette on the twenty-third day of September in the year one thousand eight hundred and thirty-four, a consolidated chapelry was assigned to the consecrated church of Saint Thomas situate in the parish of Brampton, in the said county of Derby and at that time in the diocese of Lichfield and Coventry but now in the said diocese of Southwell, and the said consolidated chapelry was named 'The Consolidated Chapelry of Saint Thomas, Brampton.'

"And whereas by the authority of an instrument, hearing date the fourth day of November in the year one thousand eight hundred and forty-one and being under the hand and seal of the late Right Reverend James, Bishop of Lichfield, a particular district was assigned to the consecrated church of the Holy Trinity situate in the parish of Chesterfield, in the said county of Derby and at that time in the diocese of Lichfield, but now in the said diocese of Southwell, and the said particular district was named 'The Particular District of the Holy Trinity, Chesterfield,'

"And whereas by the authority of an Order of Her said late Majesty in Council, bearing date the fourth day of February in the year one thousand eight hundred and sixty-one and published in the London Gazette on the eighth day of the same month, a consolidated chapelry was assigned to the consecrated church of Saint John situate at Newbold in the said particular district of the Holy Trinity, Chesterfield, and the said consolidated chapelry was named 'The Consolidated Chapelry of Saint John, Newbold with Dunston.'

"And whereas the said consolidated chapelry of Saint Thomas, Brampton, the said particular district of the Holy Trinity, Chesterfield, and the said consolidated chapelry of Saint John, Newbold with Dunston, have become new parishes of the character contemplated by the Act of the sixth and seventh years of Her said late Majesty, chapter thirty-seven, by the Act of the nineteenth and twentieth years of Her said late Majesty, chapter one hundred and four, and by the above-mentioned Act of the thirty-second and thirty-third years of Her said late Majesty, chapter ninety-four.

"And whereas it has been represented to us, and it appears to us to be expedient that the boundaries of the said new parish of Saint Thomas, Brampton, the said new parish of the Holy Trinity, Chesterfield, and the said new parish of Saint John, Newbold with Dunston, should be altered in the manner which is hereinafter mentioned.

"Now therefore with the consent of the Right Reverend Edwyn, Bishop of Southwell, (in testimony whereof he has signed and sealed this scheme or representation) we, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners, humbly represent, recommend and propose that from and after the day of the date of the publication in the London Gazette of an Order of Your Majesty in Council ratifying this scheme or representation and without any assurance in the law other than such duly gazetted Order the boundaries of the said new parish of Saint Thomas, Brampton, the said new parish of the Holy Trinity, Chesterfield, and the said new parish of Saint John, Newbold with Dunston, shall be altered so that (firstly) all those portions of the said parish of Chesterfield and of the said new parish of Saint Thomas, Brampton, which are described in the first schedule hereunder written and are delineated and set forth upon the map or plan hereunto annexed and are thereon coloured pink, shall be dissevered from such parish and new parish respectively and shall be annexed to and shall in future form part of the said new parish of the Holy Trinity, Chesterfield, and (secondly) all those portions of the said new parish of the Holy Trinity, Chesterfield, and of the said new parish of Saint Thomas, Brampton, which are described in the second schedule hereunder written and are delineated and set forth upon the said map or plan hereunto annexed and are thereon coloured green, shall be dissevered from such new parishes and shall be restored to and shall in future form part of the said parish of Chesterfield, and (thirdly) all that portion of the said parish of Chesterfield, which is described in the third schedule hereunder written and is delineated and set forth upon the said map or plan hereunto annexed and is thereon coloured yellow, shall be dissevered from such parish and shall be annexed to and shall in future form part of the said new parish of Saint John, Newbold with Dunston.

"And we further represent, recommend, and propose that nothing herein contained shall prevent us from representing, recommending and proposing any other measures relating to the matters aforesaid or any of them in accordance with the provisions of the hereinbefore mentioned Acts or any of them or any other Act of Parliament.

"The SCHEDULES to which the foregoing Scheme or Representation has reference.

"THE FIRST SCHEDULE.

"The territory to be annexed to the new parish of the Holy Trinity, Chesterfield, in the county of Derby and in the diocese of Southwell, being:—

"I. All that portion of the parish of Chesterfield, in the said county and diocese, which is bounded upon the west by the said new parish of the Holy Trinity, Chesterfield, and upon the remaining sides, that is to say, upon the northwest, upon the north-east and upon the southeast, by an imaginary line commencing at the point in the middle of Lockoford-lane where the boundaries of the said new parish of the Holy Trinity, Chesterfield, the new parish of Saint John, Newbold with Dunston, in the said county and diocese, and the said parish of Chesterfield all meet, and extending thence eastward along the middle of Lockoford-lane for a distance of five chains and a half or thereabouts to the centre of the bridge which carries such lane across the Chesterfield Canal, and extending thence first northward and thence north-eastward along the middle of the said canal for a distance of seventeen chains or thereabouts to the centre of the bridge which carries the North Midland Branch Line of the Midland Railway across such cinal, and extending thence northward along the middle of the said line of railway for a distance of one chain or thereabouts to the point where such line of railway is crossed by the boundary which divides the parish of Brimington, in the said county and diocese, from the said parish of Chesterfield, and extending thence first northeastward and then south-eastward along the last mentioned boundary for a distance of thirtyeight chains or thereabouts to the point where such boundary crosses the middle of Chester-field-road, and extending thence first southwestward and then southward along the middle of Chesterfield-road for a distance of one mile or thereabouts to the centre of Tapton Bridge which carries such road across the River Rother upon the boundary which divides the said parish of Chesterfield from the said new parish of the Holy Trinity, Chesterfield.

"II. And also all that portion of the new parish of Saint Thomas, Brampton, in the said county and diocese, which is bounded upon the north by the said new parish of Saint John, Newbold with Dunston, upon the north-east and upon the east by the said new parish of the Holy Trinity, Chesterfield, and upon the remaining sides, that is to say, upon the south, upon the south-west and upon the west, by an imaginary line commencing upon the boundary which which divides the said new parish of the Holy Trinity, Chesterfield, from the said new parish of Saint Thomas, Brampton, at the junction of Foljamberoad with Ashgate-road, and extending thence first north-westward and then westward along the middle of Ashgate-road for a distance of thirty-two chains or thereabouts to the centre of the bridge which carries such road across Holme Brook, and extending thence first generally north-westward and then generally northward along the middle of Holme Brook for a distance of sixty-six chains or thereabouts to the centre

across the said brook upon the boundary which divides the said new parish of Saint Thomas, Brampton, from the said new parish of Saint John, Newbold with Dunston.

"THE SECOND SCHEDULE.

"The territory to be dissevered from the said new parish of the Holy Trinity, Chesterfield, and from the said new parish of Saint Thomas, Brampton, and to be restored to the said parish of Chesterfield, being:—

"All those contiguous portions of the said new parish of the Holy Trinity, Chesterfield, and of the said new parish of Saint Thomas, Brampton, which, taken together, are bounded upon the south and upon the east by the said parish of Chesterfield and upon the remaining sides, that is to say, upon the north and upon the southwest, by an imaginary line commencing upon the boundary which divides the said parish of Chesterfield, from the said new parish of the Holy Trinity, Chesterfield, at the junction of the street called Gluman-gate with the street called Salter-gate, and extending thence first westward, then north-westward and then again westward along the middle of Salter-gate and of Ashgate-road (thereby crossing the boundary which divides the said new parish of the Holy Trinity, Chesterfield, from the said new parish of Saint Thomas, Brampton), for a distance of fifty-six chains or thereabouts to the centre of the bridge which carries Ashgate-road across Holme Brook, and extending thence generally south-eastward along the middle of Holme Brook for a distance of forty-six chains or thereabouts to the centre of Wheat Bridge which carries Wheatbridgeroad across Holme Brook, upon the boundary which divides the said new parish of Saint Thomas, Brampton, from the said parish of Chesterfield.

"THE THIRD SCHEDULE.

"The territory to be annexed to the said new parish of Saint John, Newbold with Dunston, being:—

"All that portion of the said parish of Chesterfield, which is bounded upon the north-east by the said parish of Brimington, upon the north-west by the said new parish of Saint John, Newbold with Dunston, and upon the remaining sides, that is to say, upon the south and upon the south-east by an imaginary line commencing at the point in the middle of Lockoford-lane where the boundaries of the said new parish of Saint John, Newbold with Dunston, the said new parish of the Holy Trinity, Chesterfield, and the said parish of Chesterfield all meet, and extending thence eastward along the middle of Lockoford-lane for a distance of five chains and a half or thereabouts to the centre of the bridge which carries such lane across the Chesterfield Canal, and extending thence first northward and then north-eastward along the middle of the said canal for a distance of seventeen chains or thereabouts to the centre of the bridge which carries the North Midland Branch Line of the Midland Railway across such canal, and extending thence northward along the middle of the said line of railway for a distance of one chain or thereabouts to the boundary which divides the said parish of Chesterfield from the said parish of Brimington."

Brook, and extending thence first generally northward along the middle of Holme Brook for a distance of sixty-six chains or thereabouts to the centre of the footbridge which carries Brockwell-lane plated by such scheme or representation and

such Patrons and Incumbents have respectively

signified their assent thereto.

And whereas the said scheme or representation has been approved by His Majesty in Council: Now, therefore, His Majesty, by and with the advice of His said Council, is pleased hereby to ratify the said scheme or representation, and to order and direct that the same and every part thereof shall be effectual in law immediately from and after the time when this Order shall have been duly published in the London Gazette pursuant to the said Acts; and His Majesty's, by and with the like advice, is pleased hereby to direct that this Order be forthwith registered by the Registrar of the said diocese of Southwell.

ORDER OF THE BOARD OF AGRICULTURE AND FISHERIES. (DATED 5TH MAY 1908.)

CHESHIRE (SWINE-FEVER) ORDER OF 1908.

The Board of Agriculture and Fisheries, by virtue and in exercise of the powers vested in them under the Diseases of Animals Acts, 1894 to 1903, and of every other power enabling them in this behalf, do order, and it is hereby ordered, as follows:

Application of Swine-Fever (Regulation of Movement) Order of 1908 with Modifications.

1. From and after the commencement of this Order the provisions of the Swine-Fever (Regulation of Movement) Order of 1908 (hereinafter referred to as the principal Order) shall apply to the Scheduled Area described in the Schedule hereto, but subject to the modifications herein-after contained. Provided that the provisions of the principal Order relating to an Infected Area shall not apply to any part of the Scheduled Area, unless such part is for the time being declared by Order of the Board to be, or form part of, a Swine-Fever Infected Area.

Restriction on Movement of Swine in Scheduled Area.

2. Swine shall not be moved along, over, or across a highway or thoroughfare in the

Scheduled Area, whether in a vehicle or not, for the purpose of movement to premises in the Area or outside the Area, unless they are accompanied by a licence authorising movement to such premises granted under the principal Order or this Order.

Movement of Swine with Licence.

3.-(1.) A licence obtained under the principal Order authorising movement of swine shall be a sufficient authority for such movement along, over, or across a highway or thoroughfare in the Scheduled Area as is necessary for the movement authorised by the licence.

(2.) Where the proposed movement is not affected by the principal Order a licence authorising the movement may be granted under Article 5 of this Order or under and in accordance with one of the following provisions of this Article:

- (i.) A licence (Form A) may be granted by an Inspector of the Local Authority of the District in which the place of destination specified in the licence is situate, and the provisions of paragraphs (2) to (4) of Article 3 of the principal Order shall apply as if repeated in this Article. Where the place of destination is a market, fairground or saleyard the licence may also be granted by an Inspector of the Local Authority of the District in which the premises from which the swine are to be moved are situate.
- (ii.) A licence (Form D) may be granted on a Declaration (Form E) authorising movement of swine to a bacon factory or slaughterhouse, or to any lairs, market, or saleyard

specially authorised by the Local Authority of the District under Article 5 of the principal Order. This licence shall be principal Order. This licence shall be granted by an Inspector of the Local Authority of the District in which the premises from which the swine are to premise from which the swine are to premise from the swine are t be moved are situate. Movement with a licence under this provision shall be subject to the conditions contained in Article 5 of the principal Order, and the provisions of that Article shall apply accordingly, with the necessary adaptations, to swine moved with a licence under this provision.

(iii.) A licence (Form F) may be granted on a Declaration (Form B) authorising movement of swine from premises in the Scheduled Area to the nearest available railway station for the purpose of transit to a place of destination which is not in a Scheduled Area. The licence under this provision shall be granted by an Inspector of the Local Authority of the District in which the railway station specified in the

licence is situate.

(3.) A licence (Form A) granted under this Article, if expressly granted for the movement of swine for breeding purposes from any premises in the Scheduled Area to any other premises in the Scheduled Area, shall be available for the movement of the swine by the nearest available route and without unnecessary delay back to the premises from which they were moved under the licence: Provided that such movement shall take place within the six days or less period during which the licence is available.

(4.) A licence granted under this Article for movement from any premises for breeding purposes may be so granted without the prescribed declaration in any case in which the Inspector granting the same is satisfied that the pig since it was last returned to those premises after movement for breeding purposes has been

kept separate from all other swine.

Straying of Swine on Highways.

4. No pig shall be allowed to stray on a highway or thoroughfare or on the sides thereof in the Scheduled Area.

Regulation of Movement of Swine from Markets.

-(1.) The movement of swine from any market, fairground or saleyard in the Scheduled Area shall be subject to the following provisions of this Order.

(2.) In the case of swine moved into the market, fairground or saleyard from premises outside the Scheduled Area with a licence (Form A), the provisions of Article 4 of the principal Order shall apply to the subsequent movement of the swine.

(3.) If the market or saleyard is specially authorised by the Local Authority under the principal Order or under the Swine-Fever (Movement from Ireland) Order of 1904, the movement of the swine exposed at the market or saleyard shall be subject to the provisions of the Order under which the market or saleyard is so authorised.

(4.) In the case of any other movement of swine from a market, fairground or saleyard the movement shall be subject to the following

conditions :-

(i.) The swine shall be accompanied by a licence (Form C) granted by an Inspector of the Local Authority of the District in which the market, fairground or saleyard is situate.

(ii.) If the place of destination is outside the

or slaughterhouse, or the premises from which the swine were moved to the market, fairground or saleyard.

(iii.) The swine shall not, for a period of twenty-eight days after arrival at the place of destination specified in the licence, be moved from such place of destination except to a bacon factory or slaughterhouse, and only if accompanied by a licence (Form C) authorising such movement granted by an Inspector of the Local Authority of the District in which the swine are detained.

(iv.) Swine moved with a licence under this Article to a bacon factory or slaughter-house shall be there detained until they are

slaughtered.

(v.) Swine while detained under this Article shall be kept separate from all other swine.

Regulation of Markets, &c., in Scheduled Area.

6. No sale of swine shall be held in any market, fairground or saleyard in the Scheduled Area unless it is authorised by the Local Authority of the District (which authority the Local Authority are hereby empowered to grant).

Effect of Licences granted under this Order.

7. No licence shall be required under the. principal Order for the movement into a: Scheduled Area of swine which are being moved under and in accordance with a licence. granted under this Order.

Movement of Swine landed from Ireland in Scheduled Area.

8. Swine landed from Ireland at a port or place in the Scheduled Area may be moved free from any restrictions imposed by this Order from the landing-place forthwith by the most direct route to the nearest available railway station from which the swine can be moved to their place of destination.

Revocation of Existing Regulations.

9. Any regulation made by a Local Authority: of a District comprised in the Scheduled Area as to movement into or within their District which is in force at the commencement of this Order is hereby revoked as from that date.

Commencement.

10. This Order shall come into operation on the first day of June, nineteen hundred and eight.

Short Title.

11. This Order may be cited as the Cheshire (SWINE-FEVER) ORDER OF 1908, and shall in relation to the Scheduled Area be read as part of the principal Order.
