I, the undersigned, being a Veterinary Inspector of the Local Authority for the [county] of _____, do hereby give Notice to you as the occupier of the undermentioned premises, namely: [description of stable, shed, field or other premises], in which there is a [description of animal] which in my opinion is affected with parasitic mange, that by virtue of this Notice, and of the Selkirkshire (Parasitic Mange) Order of 1908 the following restrictions apply from the date of the service of this Notice until the Notice is withdrawn by a Notice in writing served by an Inspector of the Local Authority on the occupier of the premises.

Restrictions.

1. The above-mentioned animal shall not be moved out of the premises specified in this Notice, except with the written authority, and under the supervision, of an Inspector of the Local Authority and only to some other place of detention; and during the detention it shall from time to time, as often as may be necessary, be treated by the owner thereof with some dressing or other remedy for parasitic mange approved for that purpose by a Veterinary Inspector of the Local Authority.

2. No other horse, ass, or mule shall be moved out of the premises specified in this Notice, unless on each occasion immediately before the movement it is treated with some dressing or other remedy for parasitic mange approved for that purpose by a Veterinary Inspector of the Local Authority.

STAFFORDSHIRE (SWINE-FEVER) ORDER
OF 1908.

The Board of Agriculture and Fisheries, by virtue and in exercise of the powers vested in them under the Diseases of Animals Acts, 1894 to 1903, and of every other power enabling them in this behalf, do order, and it is hereby ordered, as follows:

Application of Swine-Fever (Regulation of Movement) Order of 1908 with Modifications.

1. From and after the commencement of this Order the provisions of the Swine-Fever (Regulation of Movement) Order of 1908 (hereinafter referred to as the principal Order) shall apply to the Scheduled Area described in the Schedule hereto, but subject to the modifications herein-after contained. Provided that the provisions of the principal Order relating to an Infected Area shall not apply to any part of the Scheduled Area, unless such part is for the time being declared by Order of the Board to be, or form part of, a Swine-Fever Infected Area.

Restriction on Movement of Swine in Scheduled Area.

2. Swine shall not be moved along, over, or across a highway or thoroughfare in the Scheduled Area, whether in a vehicle or not, for the purpose of movement to premises in the Area or outside the Area, unless they are accom-

panied by a licence authorising movement to such premises granted under the principal Order or this Order.

Movement of Swine with Licence.

3.—(1). A licence obtained under the principal Order authorising movement of swine shall be a sufficient authority for such movement along, over, or across a highway or thoroughfare in the Scheduled Area as is necessary for the movement authorised by the licence.

(2.) Where the proposed movement is not affected by the principal Order a licence authorising the movement may be granted under Article 5 of this Order or under and in accordance with one of the following provisions of this Article:

- (i.) A licence (Form A) may be granted by an Inspector of the Local Authority of the District in which the place of destination specified in the licence is situate, and the provisions of paragraphs (2) to (4) of Article 3 of the principal Order shall apply as if repeated in this Article. Where the place of destination is a market, fairground or saleyard the licence may also be granted by an Inspector of the Local Authority of the District in which the premises from which the swine are to be moved are situate.
- (ii.) A licence (Form D) may be granted on a Declaration (Form E) authorising movement of swine to a bacon factory or slaughterhouse, or to any lairs, market, or saleyard specially authorised by the Local Authority of the District under Article 5 of the
