NOTICE is hereby given, that the following Amendment of the Table of Ecclesiastical Fees and Payments settled by the Archbishop of Canterbury, the Lord High Chancellor, and the Archbishop of York, in pursuance of the Acts 1 and 2 Vict., cap. 106, and 30 and 31 Vict., cap. 135, has been this day submitted to His Majesty's Privy Council, under the provisions of the above mentioned Acts:—

TABLE OF ECCLESIASTICAL FEES.

It is ordered by the Archbishop of Canterbury, the Lord High Chancellor, and the Archbishop of York that the Orders of 10th December, 1895 (gazetted 2nd July, 1895), and of 29th November, 1907 (gazetted 29th November, 1907), shall be repealed, and that in pursuance of the provisions of 1 and 2 Vict. c. 106 and 30 and 31 Vict. c. 135 the following Table and Scales of Fees be ordained, settled, and established under the provisions of the said Acts.

Fees in respect of the Ordination of Deacons and Priests and of the Presentation, Nomination Collation, Institution, Installation, Induction, or Licence, or any instrument, matter or thing connected with the admission of any spiritual person to any Cathedral Preferment, or Benefice, throughout England and Wales, and on the consecration of Churches, Chapels, Cemeteries, and Burial-grounds, and on and incidental to the grant of Faculties to be taken by any Chancellor, Vicar-General, Registrar, Secretary, Clerk, Minister, or Officer to whom belong the duties of transacting or doing any of such matters and things, or preparing and sealing any of such instruments, and to the Chancellors or Vicars-General, Registrars, and other Officers of Archbishops and Bishops, and to Archdeacons and their Officials and other Officers on the Visitation of such Archbishops and Bishops and Archdeacons respectively, and costs of any Secretary of a Bishop and any Registrar of a Diocese under the "Incumbents Resignation Act, 1871" (34 and 35 Vict. cap. 44).

*Collation, Institution, Induction, Licence to Perpetual Curacy.*

The fees to be taken in respect of Collation and Induction, or Institution and Induction to a benefice with Cure of Souls and for a Licence to a Perpetual Curacy shall be in accordance with and be regulated by the following Scale:—

“Annual Value” means the Net Annual Value of the benefice as defined by the Pluralities Acts (1 and 2 Vict., cap. 106 and 13 and 14 Vict., cap. 93) and will in case of difference be certified by the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England (*vide* Rule 2).

“Chancellor” includes Vicar-General.

“Bishop’s Registrar” means the Registrar or other Officer by usage performing the duty.

“Secretary” means Secretary of Archbishop or Bishop.

*Other Fees of Apparitor, Sealer, and Record Keeper.*

The following fees may continue to be taken by any Apparitor, Sealer, or Record Keeper, who was appointed to his office before the 10th December, 1895, so long as he shall continue to discharge the duties of his office, but upon his death or resignation such fees shall wholly cease to be taken and shall not be claimed by or payable to the successor, if any, of such Apparitor, Sealer, or Record Keeper. These fees, where payable, are to be in addition to those hereinbefore prescribed, and payable to any Vicar-General, Chancellor, Registrar, or Secretary, respectively. Any demand or application for these Fees shall be in writing and shall state the name and address of the Apparitor, Sealer, or Record Keeper, claiming the fee and the date of his appointment.

### RULES.

#### *Disbursements.*

1. The fees include postages, telegrams, carriage, and transmission of documents, office expenses, stationers' charges, and all other similar disbursements.

#### *Annual Value.*

2. The net annual value of a Benefice shall, for the purposes of the Scale of Fees in respect of Collation, Institution, Induction, and Licence to a Perpetual Curacy be computed as provided by the Pluralities Acts, 1 & 2 Vict. cap. 106, and 13 & 14 Vict. cap. 98, and shall be the gross amount of the annual value of such Benefice after deducting all taxes, rates, tenths, dues, and permanent charges and outgoings to which such Benefice shall be subject, but without any deduction or allowance for any stipend or stipends to any stipendiary Curate or Curates, nor for such taxes or rates in respect of the house of residence of the Benefice or of the Glebe Land belonging thereto as are usually paid by tenants or occupiers, nor for moneys expended in the repair or improvement of the house or residence and buildings and premises belonging thereto.

Unless the fee payable under the said scale shall have been previously agreed between the Incumbent and the Secretary, the Incumbent shall within one week of the issue of the Bishop's notice under the Benefices Act, 1898, of intention to collate, institute or admit, furnish to the Secretary particulars in writing of the gross amount of the annual value of the Benefice and of the deductions to be made as aforesaid in estimating the net annual value thereof, and if thereupon the Incumbent and the Secretary mutually agree as to such net annual value such agreement shall be conclusive and the fee shall be computed and paid accordingly; but if the Incumbent omits to send to the Secretary such particulars as aforesaid, or if the Secretary claims that the Benefice is of a higher net annual value than the Incumbent estimates it to be, the Secretary shall furnish to the Incumbent a statement in writing of the gross and net annual values as computed by the Secretary and of the fee claimed, and if the Incumbent is not satisfied he shall transmit his own and the Secretary's statements of annual value to the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, who shall thereupon in a summary manner and upon such estimate as they may in their uncontrolled judgment think proper determine the amount of the fee to be paid, and their decision shall be final and conclusive and binding upon all parties, and a certificate under the hand of the Secretary or Acting Secretary for the time being of the Ecclesiastical Commissioners shall be sufficient evidence and record of such decision.

The net annual value of a Benefice in cases under the Incumbents Resignation Acts shall be the amount thereof as computed by the Commissioners appointed pursuant to the Incumbents Resignation Act, 1871, in ascertaining the amount of the pension to be allowed to the retiring Incumbent.

#### *Ordination.*

3. The Registrar's fee is for registering the names and titles of the candidates in the Register Books of the Diocese. The Secretary's fee is for correspondence with the candidates, the drawing of papers, and instructions prior to examination, attendance at the Ordination, preparing the letters of orders, and other necessary documents, and entering the names and titles of the candidates in the Bishop's Act Book.

#### *Collation.*

4. The Secretary's fee for Collation includes all charges for correspondence with the Clerk to be collated, for all searches in the Registry, for all communications with the Ecclesiastical Commissioners, for examining the letters of orders and letters testimonial, for all communications with the Registrar of the Diocese, for the entry of the Collation in the Bishop's Act Book, and obtaining the seal of the Bishop to the instruments connected with the Collation in all cases where the same are sealed with such seal, and the return to the Judges of the King's Bench Division of His Majesty's High Court of Justice, when made by the Bishop.

The fee of the Registrar, or other officer by usage performing the duty, includes all charges for preparing the sentence of Collation, for preparing the certificate of subscription to the 39 Articles, and all other necessary certificates, declarations, and instruments, for attending on the Bishop when the Collation takes place, and the necessary oaths and declarations are made, taken, and subscribed, for entering the Collation in the Register Books of the Diocese, and for preparing letters testimonial and the mandate of induction addressed to the Archdeacon, and obtaining the seal of the Vicar-General to those instruments in all cases where the same are sealed with such seal, and the return

to the Judges of the King's Bench Division of His Majesty's High Court of Justice, when not made by the Bishop himself.

*Institution.*

5. The Secretary's fee includes all charges for correspondence with the presentee for examining the deed of presentation, the letters of orders and letters testimonial, for all communications with the Ecclesiastical Commissioners, for preparing the Bishop's Fiat or his Commission when the latter is issued, for all communications with the Registrar of the Diocese, for the entry in the Bishop's Act Book, and obtaining the seal of the Bishop to the instruments connected with the institution in all cases where the same are sealed with such seal, and the return to the Judges of the King's Bench Division of His Majesty's High Court of Justice, when made by the Bishop.

The fee of the Registrar, or other officer by usage performing the duty, includes all charges for preparing the instrument of institution, for preparing the certificate of subscription to the 39 Articles, and all other necessary certificates, declarations and instruments, for attending on the Bishop or his Vicar-General when the institution takes place and the necessary oaths and declarations are made, taken, and subscribed, for drawing when necessary a notarial Act of the proceedings and entering the same in the Register Book of the Diocese, for preparing the letters testimonial and the mandate of induction to the Archdeacon, and obtaining the seal of the Vicar-General to the several instruments in all cases where the same are sealed with such seal, and making the return to the Judges of the King's Bench Division of His Majesty's High Court of Justice, when not made by the Bishop himself.

*Licences to Perpetual Curacies.*

6. The Secretary's fee includes all charges for correspondence with the Clerk to be licensed for examining the nomination, the letters of orders and letters testimonial, for all communications with the Ecclesiastical Commissioners, for preparing the Bishop's Fiat or his Commission when issued, for all communications with the Registrar of the Diocese, for the entry in the Bishop's Act Book and obtaining the seal of the Bishop to the instruments connected with the licence in all cases where the same are sealed with such seal, and the return to the Judges of the King's Bench Division of His Majesty's High Court of Justice, when made by the Bishop.

The fee of the Registrar, or other officer by usage performing the duty, includes all charges for preparing the licence, for preparing the certificate of subscription to the 39 Articles, and all other necessary certificates, declarations, and instruments, for attending on the Bishop or his Vicar-General when the necessary oaths and declarations are made, taken, and subscribed, and for entering the licence in the Register Book of the Diocese, and obtaining the Vicar-General's seal in all cases where the instruments connected with the licence are sealed with such seal, and making the return to the Judges of the King's Bench Division of His Majesty's High Court of Justice, when not made by the Bishop himself.

*Induction.*

7. The fee of the Archdeacon's Registrar is for preparing all necessary documents and transacting and doing all matters and things in relation to the induction and making the proper records thereof.

*Installation and Induction to Cathedral Preferment.*

8. The fee of the registrar, or other officer by usage performing the duty, includes all charges for preparing and engrossing all necessary instruments and certificates, for entering the several Chapter Acts and Schedules, for attendances, and for registering the whole proceedings in the Chapter Book.

*Consecration of Churches, Burial Grounds, or Cemeteries.*

9. The Chancellor's fee includes the approval of plans, the perusal of the petition and other papers, the settling the sentence, and the approval of the Draft Act. The Registrar's fee includes the perusal of the deeds of conveyance, the drawing and engrossing of the petition, and the sentence and the notarial Act, the necessary attendance at the Consecration, and the registering the deeds and the Act in the Register Book of the Diocese. The Secretary's fee includes the inspection of plans and correspondence prior to the papers being sent to the Registry. The Apparitor's fee includes all necessary citations and attendance on the Bishop at the Consecration.

*Faculties.*

10. The Chancellor's fee includes the perusal of the petition, the order for the notice of citation, as the case may be, the perusal of the certificate and other papers, and making the decree. The Registrar's fee includes the perusal of the minutes of the vestry and the petition, the drawing of the notice or citation and other necessary documents and attending the Chancellor for his order, the preparation of the certificate and attendance on the Chancellor for his decree, and the drawing and signing the faculty.

The Apparitor's fee includes the service of the notice or citation, but is exclusive of one shilling a mile for travelling expenses, if the citation is to be personally served in the country.

*Visitation.*

11. The Chancellor's fee includes the attendance of the Chancellor or his Surrogate, the examination of the presentments of the outgoing churchwardens, and the admission of the new churchwardens to office. The Registrar's fee includes the drawing and issuing of the inhibition and of the Mandate for the citation of the clergy, the preparation of the Visitation books and of the articles of inquiry, and the presentment papers, the attendance at the Visitation, and attesting the presentments and declarations of the churchwardens, the registering the papers exhibited by the clergy, the tabulating in the Registry the copies of the Register Books of Baptism and Burials, and other papers required to be annually transmitted. The Apparitor's fee includes the preparation and delivery of the citations to the clergy and churchwardens and the attendance at the Visitation.

Providing for the registration of all persons carrying on the business of keeper of a female domestic servants registry, and also for the registration of premises where such business is carried on; enabling the Local Authority to make bye-laws for the prevention of fraud or immorality in connection with such business, and other matters connected therewith.

Section 86. Providing for the registration of dealers in marine stores and old metal, and their places of business; the keeping of books showing description, source, and price of articles acquired; as to inspection by Local Authority, and as to penalty in certain cases.

Section 90. Enabling Local Authority to enter into agreements for the common use of fire engines and appliances, and for mutual assistance at fires.

Section 91. Prohibiting the erection of sky signs, and allowing the retention of existing sky signs for a period of three years only from the date of the Order, and during that period only if the license of the Local Authority is obtained.
