In pursuance of an Act for better preserving the navigation of the River Mersey (5 and 6 Vic., cap. 110), we, the Mersey Chemical Works Company Limited, of Bromborough, Cheshire, hereby give you notice that we propose to carry a line of 20" pipes across the foreshore to below low-water mark, chasing the rock forming the foreshore, inserting the pipes, and levelling up in concrete.

The pipe is for the purpose of conveying the usual waste water from the manufacture, into the River—a very small amount of sewage from the workmen's urinals and three cottages will pass into this pipe

The estimated flow through this pipe into the River is about 25,000 gallons per day, in addition to all rainwater from the roads and roofs.

The discharge into the River will be continuous.
