ORDER OF THE BOARD OF AGRICULTURE AND FISHERIES.

(DATED 8TH JULY 1908.)

(SWINE-FEVER INFECTED AREA.)

The Board of Agriculture and Fisheries, by virtue and in exercise of the powers vested in them under the Diseases of Animals Acts, 1894 to 1903, and of every other power enabling them in this behalf, do order, and it is hereby ordered, as follows:

Declaration of Swine-Fever Infected Area.

1. The Area described in the Schedule to this Order is hereby declared to be a Swine-Fever Infected Area for the purposes of the Swine-Fever (Regulation of Movement) Order of 1908.

Commencement.

2. This Order shall come into operation on the thirteenth day of July, nineteen hundred and eight.

An Area comprising the parishes of Barrowden, Tixover, South Luffenham, North Luffenham, Ketton, Tinwell, Tickencote, Great Casterton, Little Casterton, Ryhall, and Essendine, in the administrative county of Rutland, and also con-

prising the borough of Stamford, in the administrative county of the Parts of Kesteven Division of Lincolnshire.

WE, the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, acting in pursuance of the Act of the twenty-ninth and thirtieth years of Her late Majesty Queen Victoria, chapter one hundred and eleven, section five, do hereby, subject as hereinafter mentioned, grant to the Incumbent of the vicarage of Saint George, Barnsley, in the county of York and in the diocese of Wakefield, and to his successors, Incumbents of the same vicarage, one yearly sum or stipend of eight pounds, such yearly sum or stipend to be payable out of the common fund under our control, and to be calculated as from the first day of November, in the year one thousand nine hundred and seven, and to be receivable in equal quarterly portions on the first day of February, the first day of May, the first day of August, and the first day of November in each and every year: Provided always, that if at any time lands, tithes, or other hereditaments sufficient in our opinion to produce the said yearly sum or stipend, or any part thereof, shall be annexed by us to the said vicarage of Saint George, Barnsley, in substitution for such yearly sum or stipend, or for such part thereof, our liability for the payment of such yearly sum or stipend, or of such part thereof, as the case may be, shall thereupon and thereafter cease and determine.

WE, the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, acting in pursuance of the Act of the twenty-ninth and thirtieth years of Her late Majesty Queen Victoria, chapter one hundred and eleven, sections five and eleven, do hereby grant and appropriate out of our common fund to the vicarage of Brent Pelham with the vicarage of Furneaux Pelham annexed, in the county of Hertford and in the diocese of St. Albans, one capital sum of one hundred pounds sterling, to be applicable towards defraying the cost of improving the parsonage or house of residence belonging to the said vicarage according to plans and a specification approved or to be approved by us, such capital sum, or the balance thereof unapplied to such purpose, to remain in the meantime in our hands at interest after the rate of two pounds and ten shillings per centum per annum.
