[The Astronomical positions are approximate unless otherwise stated. The bearings are Magnetic, and those relating to lights are given from seaward. The visibility of lights is that in clear weather. Fog signals are sounded during thick or foggy weather unless otherwise stated. The depths are given at low-water ordinary springs. The heights are given above high water.]

No. 1050.—NEWFOUNDLAND, EAST COAST  
—TRINITY HARBOUR.

*Fort Point Light—Intended Alteration in  
Character.*

Subject.—On July 15th, 1908, the white fixed light exhibited from the lighthouse on Fort Point, Trinity Harbour, will be replaced by a light of the undermentioned character.

Position.—Lat. 48° 22' N., long. 53° 21' W.

Character.—White occulting every seven and a half seconds, thus:—Light  $6\frac{1}{4}$  seconds; eclipse  $1\frac{1}{4}$  seconds.

Remarks.—In other respects there is no alteration.

No. 1051.—NEWFOUNDLAND, SOUTH  
COAST—FORTUNE BAY.

*St. Jacques Island—Intended Light.*

Subject.—On July 14th, 1908, a light of the undermentioned character will be established on St. Jacques Island, Fortune Bay.

Position.—Lat. 47° 28 $\frac{1}{2}$ ' N., long. 55° 25' W.

Character.—White occulting every ten seconds, thus:—Light, 7 seconds; eclipse, 3 seconds.

Elevation.—131 feet.

Visibility.—15 miles.

Structure.—White cylindrical iron tower, 38 feet in height.

Remarks.—A white dwelling-house with flat roof will shortly be erected near the lighthouse. The exact position of the lighthouse on the island is not stated, but it is probably on the southern hill.
