The KING has been graciously pleased to make the following promotion in the Royal Victorian Order :-

To be Knight Commander: William Henry, Baron Desborough, C.V.O.

The KING has been pleased to grant unto Charles Terry, of One House Lodge, in the parish of Stowmarket, and county of Suffolk, Esquire, His Royal licence and authority that he and his issue may, in compliance with a proviso contained in the last will and testament of Roger Pettiward, late of Great Finborough Hall, in the said county, Esquire, deceased, take and henceforth use and bear the surname of Pettiward in lieu of that of Terry, and that he and they may bear the Arms of Pettiward, the said Arms being first duly exemplified according to the Laws of Arms, and recorded in His Majesty's College of Arms, otherwise the said Royal licence and permission to be void and of none effect:

And to command that the said Royal concession and declaration be recorded in His Majesty's said College of Arms.

brother of James Darling-Barker, late of Halnaker House, in the parish of Boxgrove, in the county of Sussex, Captain in the Royal Navy, deceased, His Royal licence and authority that he may, in compliance with a clause contained in the last will and testament of Anne Barker, late of Stockton. in the county of Durham, Widow, Stockton, in the county of Durham, Widow, deceased, take and use the surname of Barker in addition to and after that of Darling, that he may bear the Arms of Barker quarterly with those of Darling, and that such surname and Arms may in like manner be taken, borne and used by his issue; such Arms being first duly exemplified according to the Laws of Arms, and recorded in the College of Arms, otherwise the said Royal licence and permission to be void and of none effect:
