## ORDER OF THE BOARD OF AGRICULTURE AND FISHERIES.

(DATED SOTH JULY 1908)

The Board of Agriculture and Fisheries, by virtue and in exercise of the powers vested in them under the Diseases of Animals Acts, 1894 to 1903, and of every other power enabling them in this behalf, do order, and it is hereby ordered, as follows:

Where under any Order made or to be made by the Board of Agriculture and Fisheries swine may be moved to a slaughter-house or to a bacon factory in the city of Manchester, subject to a condition as regards a licence authorising such movement or to any other condition, the swine may be moved, subject to the like condition, to the Water-street Market, Manchester, if and so long as such market is specially authorised in accordance with the provisions of Article 5 of the Swine-Fever (Regulation of Movement) Order of 1908, and be moved therefrom under the provisions of that Article.

A copy of every licence granted under this Order shall be sent by the Inspector granting the same to the Town Clerk of Manchester.
