

which consent he has signed and sealed this scheme), we, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners, humbly recommend and propose that as from the day of the publication in the London Gazette of any Order of Your Majesty in Council ratifying this scheme the said Residentiary Canonry in the Cathedral Church of Ripon shall be wholly disannexed and disunited from the said Archdeaconry of Ripon.

"And we further recommend and propose that as from the date of the said disannexation we, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners, be authorized to pay by half yearly payments on the first day of January and the first day of July in every year out of the common fund created by the said Act of the third and fourth years of Her late Majesty Queen Victoria, chapter one hundred and thirteen, to the Archdeacon for the time being of the said Archdeaconry of Ripon the yearly sum of two hundred pounds, the payment so first becoming due being an apportioned part only of the said sum of two hundred pounds in respect of the period between the date of the publication in the London Gazette of any Order of Your Majesty in Council ratifying this scheme and the first half-yearly day of payment next ensuing: Provided always, that every payment in respect of the said yearly sum of two hundred pounds shall be made by us only after we shall have been satisfied that the Archdeacon who applies for the same has during the previous twelve calendar months complied with the conditions as to residence which for the time being are required by law and that he has not collected procurations, synodals, visitation fees or induction fees during the same period.

"And we further recommend and propose that whenever any Archdeacon who may be entitled to receive the said yearly sum of two hundred pounds shall resign or otherwise avoid his Archdeaconry such yearly sum shall be apportionable between such Archdeacon or his representative (as the case may be) and the Archdeacon who shall next be collated to the same Archdeaconry.

"And we further recommend and propose that nothing herein contained shall prevent us from recommending and proposing any other measures relating to the matters aforesaid or any of them in accordance with the provisions of the said Acts or of any of them or of any other Act of Parliament."

And whereas the said scheme has been approved by His Majesty in Council, now, therefore His Majesty, by and with the advice of His said Council, is pleased hereby to ratify the said scheme, and to order and direct that the same and every part thereof shall be effectual in law immediately from and after the time when this Order shall have been duly published in the London Gazette pursuant to the said Acts; and His Majesty, by and with the like advice, is pleased hereby to direct that this Order be forthwith registered by the Registrar of the said diocese of Ripon.

WHEREAS the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, have, in pursuance of the Act of the twenty-third and twenty-fourth years of Her late Majesty, Queen Victoria, chapter one

hundred and forty-two, duly prepared and laid before His Majesty in Council a supplemental scheme bearing date the sixteenth day of July, in the year one thousand nine hundred and eight, in the words following, that is to say:—

"We, the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, acting in pursuance of the Act of the twenty-third and twenty-fourth years of Her late Majesty Queen Victoria, chapter one hundred and forty-two, have prepared, and now humbly lay before Your Majesty in Council, the following supplemental scheme under the twenty-fifth section of that Act with reference to a fund for the provision of a parsonage house for the Incumbent of the united benefice and rectory of Saint Martin, Ludgate, with Saint Mary Magdalen, Old Fish-street, and Saint Gregory by Saint Paul, in the city and diocese of London.

"Whereas by an Order of Her said late Majesty in Council, dated the seventeenth day of May, in the year one thousand eight hundred and ninety, and published in the London Gazette on the twenty-seventh day of the same month, it was directed that a capital sum of seven thousand pounds should be appropriated towards the provision of a suitable parsonage house or rectory house for the Incumbent of the said united benefice; that pending the provision of such a house the said capital sum should be invested by us, and that the interest or dividends arising from such investment, and any accumulation thereof should be invested and added to such investment of the said capital sum; that if the whole of the capital sum and accumulations should not be required for the provision of the said house the unappropriated balance of such moneys should be added to the moneys which are invested in the names of the Incumbent, and any three of the churchwardens of the said united benefice, in order that the annual dividends or interest arising therefrom may be applied towards the maintenance of the fabric of the parish church of the said united benefice and of divine service therein, and that on the provision of such parsonage house or rectory house the annual allowance of thirty-five pounds, which under the authority of an Order in Council, dated the seventh day of August, in the year one thousand eight hundred and sixty-five, and published in the London Gazette on the following day, was payable in lieu of house rent to the Incumbent for the time being of the benefice of Saint Mary Magdalen, Old Fish-street, with Saint Gregory by Saint Paul, should absolutely cease and determine.

"And whereas the said capital sum of seven thousand pounds has been invested and is with the accumulations thereof available for the provision of a suitable parsonage house or rectory house as aforesaid but no such house has been provided, and it has been made to appear to Us, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners, that it is not at present possible to secure a suitable house either within or near to the united parish of Saint Martin, Ludgate, with Saint Mary Magdalen, Old Fish-street, and Saint Gregory by Saint Paul.

"And whereas it has been represented to us, and it appears to us to be desirable, that the accumulation of the dividends or interest arising from the investment of the said capital sum and the accumulations thereof should cease, and that such dividends or interest should be applied in the manner which is hereinafter mentioned.

"Now, therefore, with the consent of the Right Honourable and Right Reverend Arthur Foley, Bishop of London (in testimony whereof he has signed this scheme and affixed his episcopal seal thereto) with the consent of the Dean
