The KING's Most Excellent Majesty in Council.

HEREAS by section sixteen of the Pluralities Act, 1838, as amended by section eight of the Pluralities Act, 1850, it is, amongst other things, enacted, "That when ever it shall appear to the Archbishop of the Province, with respect to his own diocese, and whenever it shall be represented to him "by the Bishop of any diocese, or by the Bishops of any two dioceses, that two or "more benefices, or that one or more benefice or benefices, and one or more spiritual sinecure " rectory or rectories, vicarage or vicarages, in his "or their diocese or dioceses, being either in the same parish or contiguous to each other, and of "which the aggregate population shall not exceed
"one thousand five hundred persons, may, with
"advantage to the interests of religion, be united
"into one benefice, the said Archbishop of the "Province shall inquire into the circumstances of "the case; and if on such inquiry it shall appear "to him that such union may be usefully made, "and will not be of inconvenient extent, and that "the patron or patrons of the said benefices, "sinecure rectory or rectories, vicarage or vicarages respectively, is or are consenting thereto, such consent being signified in writing "under the hands of such patron or patrons, the said Archbishop shall, six weeks before certifying such inquiry and consent to His "Majesty as hereinafter directed, cause, with "respect to his own diocese, a statement in "writing of the facts, and in other cases a copy "in writing of the aforesaid representation to be "affixed on or near the principal outer door of "the church, or in some public and conspicuous "place in each of such benefices, sinecure "rectories, or vicarages, with notice to any "person or persons interested, that he, she, or they, may, within such six weeks, show cause "in writing under his, her, or their hand or "hands, to the said Archbishop, against such "union; and if no sufficient cause be shown "within such time, the said Archbishop shall "certify the inquiry and consent aforesaid to "His Majesty in Council, and thereupon it shall be lawful for His Majesty in Council to make and issue an Order or Orders for uniting such benefices, sinecure rectory or rectories, vicar"age or vicarages, into one benefice, with cure of souls, for ecclesiastical purposes only."

"of souls, for ecclesiastical purposes only."

And whereas the Lord Archbishop of Canterbury, pursuant to the provisions of the said Act, hath duly prepared and laid before His Majesty in Council a certificate in writing, bearing date the eleventh day of May, one thousand nine hundred and eight, in the words following, that is to say:—

"We the undersigned Randall Thomas, Archbishop of the Province of Canterbury, Primate of all England and Metropolitan, do hereby certify to Your Majosty in Council.

to Your Majesty in Council:—
"That the Right Reverend Augustus, Lord Bishop of Lichfield, as Bishop of the diocese within which are situate the benefice of Warslow and the benefice of Saint John the Baptist, Elkstone, both in the county of Stafford, having represented unto us that the said benefices being contiguous to each other and of which the aggregate population does not exceed fifteen hundred persons might with advantage to the interests of religion be united into one benefice we inquired into the circumstances of the case.

"That on such inquiry it appeared to us that such union might be usefully made and would not be of inconvenient extent and that Llewelyn John Price, Clerk, Bachelor of Arts, Vicar of the vicarage and parish church of Alstonfield, in the county of Stafford and diocese of Lichfield aforesaid, being the Patron or person entitled to present to both the said benefices of Warslow and of Saint John the Baptist, Elkstone, in case the same were now yacant has consented to the proposed union.

"That six weeks and upwards before certifying such inquiry and consent to Your Majesty in Council we caused a copy in writing of the aforesaid representation to be affixed on the principal outer door of the parish church of each of the said benefices with notice to any person or persons interested that he she or they might within such six weeks show cause in writing under his her or their hand or hands to us the said Archbishop against such union and no sufficient cause has been shown.

"The representation of the said Lord Bishop of Lichfield, our inquiry into the circumstances of the case, the statement of circumstances in reply thereto, the consent in writing of the Patron and the copies of the representation and notices before mentioned are hereunto annexed.

"And we do hereby certify the inquiry and consent aforesaid to Your Majesty in Council to the intent that Your Majesty in Council may in case Your Majesty in Council shall think fit so to do make and issue an Order for uniting the said benefices into one benefice with cure of souls for ecclesiastical purposes.

Now, therefore, His Majesty in Council, by and with the advice of His said Council, is pleased to order, as it is hereby ordered, that the vicarage of Warslow, situate in the county of Stafford and diocese of Lichfield and the perpetual curacy of Saint John the Baptist, Elkstone, in the same county and diocese, shall be united into one benefice with cure of souls for ecclesiastical purposes only.

WHEREAS in pursuance of the 582nd and 583rd sections of the Merchant Shipping Act, 1894, the Tees Pilotage Commissioners, being the Pilotage Authority for the District of the Tees, made and submitted for the consent of Her late Majesty, certain bye-laws, which were approved by an Order in Council dated the twenty-sixth day of October, one thousand eight hundred and ninety-six:

And whereas by the said sections of the Act it is enacted that a Pilotage Authority may, by bye-law made under Part X. of that Act, do all or any of the things specified in Section 582; but that a bye-law so made shall not take effect until it is submitted to His Majesty in Council and confirmed by Order in Council:

And whereas the said Pilotage Commissioners have made and submitted for the consent of His Majesty certain new bye-laws in substitution for the bye-laws approved by the said Order in Council of the twenty-sixth day of October, one thousand eight hundred and ninety-six, which said new bye-laws are set forth in the schedule hereto annexed:

And whereas it has been made to appear to His Majesty that the proposed new bye-laws are

proper and reasonable:

Now, therefore, His Majesty, by virtue of the powers vested in Him by the Merchant Shipping Act, 1894, and by and with the advice of His Privy Council, is pleased to approve of and signify

His consent to the said bye-laws as set forth in the schedule hereto annexed in substitution, from and after the date of this Order, for the bye-laws approved by the Order in Council of the twenty-sixth day of October, one thousand eight hundred and ninety-six.

SCHEDULE.

BYE-LAWS made by the Tees Pilotage Commissioners for the Regulation and Government of the Pilots of the River Tees.

1. From and after the coming in force of these Bye-laws, all and every the Bye-laws, Rules, Orders, and Regulations heretofore in force with respect to the pilots and pilotage of the Tees shall be, and the same are hereby rescinded, and in lieu thereof the Tees Pilotage Commissioners do hereby make and ordain the following Bye-laws, namely:—

Pilot Superintendent.

- 2. The duties of the Pilot Superintendent shall be as follows:—
 - (a) To exercise supervision and control, under the Board, over all the Pilots and Pilots' Assistants, so as to see that the Pilot Acts and these Bye-laws and the resolutions and orders of the Commissioners are duly observed.

(b) To obtain from the pilots reports of all occurrences affecting the service on which the Commissioners or the Superintendent may require information.

(c) To hear and determine such differences as may arise between the Pilots and the Pilots' Assistants.

(d) To prevent the employment of unlicensed

pilots.

(e) To inquire into complaints made against pilots by masters and owners of vessels and others interested, and into the circumstances attending cases of collision or loss when vessels

have been under charge of a pilot.

(f) To take soundings of the bar and channel from time to time, and especially to draw the

earliest attention of the Harbour Masters to the River Tees Conservancy Commissioners, and of the Pilotage Commissioners, to any alterations in the condition and depth thereof.

(g) To keep a daily journal, and to enter therein daily the direction and nature of the wind, the marking of the barometer, and swell at the entrance to the harbour.

(h) To assist in obtaining the daily returns from the pilots of the vessels piloted, docked, undocked moored or transported by them.

undocked, moored, or transported by them.
(i) To see that pilots' cobles are duly licensed and properly numbered in figures of not less than nine inches in length, commencing at No. 1, and continuing in numerical order.

(7) To keep a register and character book, in which shall be recorded the name and description of each pilot's assistant, the date of his entering the service, and his character, and any particulars of conduct during the service.

(k) To introduce steady, sober, and qualified young men, not under 21 years of age, as they stand in the register book for examination for licenses.

(l) To assist in the examination of persons applying for licences.

(m) To carry out all orders and regulations of the Tees Pilotage Commissioners, which may be from time to time issued, relative to the

piloting of vessels or to other matters within the scope of his duties.

(n) To report to the Tees Pilotage Commissioners, from time to time, in a book to be kept for that purpose, on all the above subjects, and also on all cases of misconduct or breach of the Bye-laws that may come to his knowledge on the part of any of the pilots.

(o) All instances of neglect of duty shall be brought before the Tees Pilotage Commissioners, and the Pilot Superintendent shall not

compromise any offence by any pilot.

Secretary.

The Secretary shall keep a record of the sentence or punishment passed or imposed upon the pilots.

Pilots.

- 3. The number of Pilots shall be limited to such number as the Commissioners may from time to time direct.
- 4. There shall be two classes of pilots, namely, first and second class, of which there shall be two orders, namely:—

First class Pilots to pilot both in and out of the Tees.

Second class Pilots to pilot both in and out of the Tees.

First class Pilots to pilot inwards only.

Second class Pilots to pilot inwards only.

First class pilots may conduct vessels

First class pilots may conduct vessels of any tonnage. Second class pilots may conduct vessels of the following tonnage, namely:—

- (a) During the first year, vessels not exceeding 500 tons net register. During the second year, vessels not exceeding 600 tons net register; and during the third year, vessels not exceeding 800 tons net register.
- (b) When, in case of necessity, a second class pilot shall be in charge of a vessel exceeding his tonnage, then he must keep the Jack flying, with his pilot flag underneath the Jack. In case of a breach of this section the pilot shall be liable to forfeit the pilotage, and in such case the amount shall be paid into the pilotage fund.
- (c) Any vessel exceeding the above tonnage which may from necessity take on board a second class pilot, shall, if possible, exchange him for a first class pilot out of any licensed boat she may meet; and the Pilot Master shall decide what proportion of the pilotage shall be paid to such Pilot for the service he has rendered; and every pilot shall state his true position in the service to the master of any vessel he may take in charge.
- 5. Every pilot when required to pilot any ship or vessel shall, if under engagement to any other ship, forthwith make known such engagement, and specify the particulars thereof truly and faithfully to the person calling for or requiring such pilot's service; and in case of any concealment, misrepresentation, or falsehood, in respect of such alleged previous engagement, the pilot offending shall be subject to a penalty of ten pounds.
- 6. Every pilot shall use his utmost care and diligence to conduct the ships and vessels under his charge without damage or doing injury to others; and shall behave with strict sobriety and due respect towards the owners, masters and officers thereof; and shall not leave an in-

ward bound vessel until she is safely moored in Harbour, River or Dock; and shall within twenty-four hours after his leaving such vessel, report to the pilot superintendent all accidents which may have happened to such vessel while under his direction. He shall always have with him when on duty a copy of these bye-laws, his license, Part X. of the Merchant Shipping Act, 1894, and a pilot flag as described in the thirty-second of these bye-laws. On taking charge of a vessel, he shall if required exhibit his license to the officer in command. In the case of vessels outward bound from the river or from any dock, he shall repair on board at least two hours before high water, or when required by the master, to ascertain if the vessel of which he is about to take charge is ready for sea, or to moor in the river, and he shall not leave a vessel piloted seawards until she is fairly clear of the entrance to the harbour unless required so to do by the master of the vessel. He shall obey and execute all orders received from the Commissioners or the examining committee, the secretary or the pilot superintendent. No pilot shall absent himself from duty without permission of the pilot superintendent.

- 7. Every pilot engaged to pilot a vessel lying in the river, and bound into the Dock, shall be on board at least one hour before high water to make ready for going into Dock.
- 8. Every pilot taking charge of a vessel shall be held responsible until the pilotage is completed; but in case such pilot shall obtain the services of a substitute who is accepted by the master of the vessel, such substitute shall continue in charge until the pilotage is completed, and shall be responsible as if he had been the pilot originally appointed.
- 9. In case a pilot is requested by the master, owner, or agent of a ship to proceed to some other port with a view of bringing such ship into the river Tees, the pilot must at once apply to the Pilot Superintendent for permission, and in no case will permission be granted for a pilot to proceed further north than Dundee, or further south than London.
- 10. No pilot shall board any vessel from an unauthorised boat or steamer except the steamer or other craft provided for the purpose by the Commissioners, except in cases of emergency to be allowed by the Board.
- 11. Every pilot using the pilot steamer shall take his turn whether the vessel requiring a pilot be large or small, and if all the pilots obtain vessels and the pilot steamer has to return for a relay of pilots, then as soon as a sufficient number are on board, the pilot steamer shall immediately proceed to sea again.
- 12. When two or more licensed pilot boats are making for the same vessel, the pilot in the first or leading boat shall be entitled to board such vessel, and the other pilots in the vicinity shall not interfere in any way in the act of boarding, but shall keep off at a distance of at least one quarter of a mile.
- 13. No pilot shall be allowed to be towed outwards by any steamer, steam tug, or vessel towed by steam power. This rule is not to prevent any pilot being towed down as far as the barge, provided that he does not wilfully tow past another pilot with the object of cutting him out from a ship. Nor is it to prevent any pilot

being towed homeward, and if while so doing, he should fall in with any vessel requiring a pilot, he shall be at liberty to board and take charge of such vessel.

- 14. Every pilot to be licensed by the Commissioners shall, upon receiving his license, pay the sum of two pounds to the said Commissioners, and shall also for the renewal or confirmation of such license from time to time pay to them the sum of one pound; and for the renewal of any license in place of one lost, ten shillings. Every such license shall be renewed on the fourth day of August in each year. No pilot shall in any way alter his license or make any indorsement thereon.
- 15. The Commissioners shall not be bound to renew the license of any pilot, and the same may be withdrawn if the Commissioners consider that the pilot, either from physical disability or from any other cause, is unable to carry out his work in a satisfactory manner.
- 16. Every master and every mate in the merchant service obtaining from the Commissioners a pilotage certificate pursuant to Section 599 of the Merchant Shipping Act, 1894, shall on receiving his certificate pay to the Commissioners a fee of 40s., and for a renewal of any certificate 20s., and for the renewal of any certificate in place of one lost 10s.
- 17. In addition to persons qualifying for the pilot service as prescribed by the foregoing byelaws, the Commissioners shall have power to grant licenses to such masters in the merchant service not exceeding 35 years of age, and who hold certificates of competency granted by the Board of Trade under the Merchant Shipping Acts, as the Commissioners shall select as pilots, subject to such person before being licensed under this bye-law serving for a period of twelve months as an assistant in the pilot service under the direction of the Commissioners, and passing the examination prescribed by the 26th bye-law, and a further examination for a first class pilot should he at the first examination only get a second class certificate. But this provision shall not in any way prevent or debar the Pilotage Board from licensing other pilots' assistants to act as pilots who in the opinion of the Board are qualified to act as pilots.
- 18. Persons who have served as apprentices to licensed pilots shall be preferred for pilots' licenses to other pilots' assistants, and shall likewise be preferred over masters applying for licenses under the 17th bye-law.
- 19. Each pilot shall, within 24 hours of the performance of the service, make returns, on forms to be furnished at the office of the Commissioners, of the vessels piloted by him.
- 20. Every pilot who shall observe any alteration in the sands or channels, or that any of the buoys or beacons placed within the jurisdiction of the Commissioners are driven away, broken down, or out of place, shall forthwith deliver a statement thereof, in writing, to the Pilot Superintendent for the time being.
- 21. When a vessel touches the ground the pilot in charge shall within 24 hours report the occurrence, in writing, to the Pilot Superintendent, and such report shall specify the place and time of the occurrence, the state of the weather, the direction of the wind, time of tide, quantity

of cable riding by, and whether the cable was slipped or parted with, and the quantity lost.

22. Every pilot shall, from time to time, conform strictly to all directions which shall be given to him by the respective harbour masters of Stockton-on-Tees and Middlesbrough touching the mooring, unincoring, placing or removing of any ship or vessel under his charge, as long as such ship or vessel shall be lying and situate within the limits of the authority of such harbour masters respectively.

Pilot's Apprentices.

- 23. Candidates for apprenticeship must not be less than 16 or more than 20 years of age and will be required to prove that they are able to read and write correctly, and that they have a competent knowledge of arithmetic before they can be considered eligible for the pilot service.
- 24. All apprentices to the pilot service shall be bound for not less than five years to a first class pilot who has a boat of his own; and no apprentice shall leave the service of the pilot to whom he is bound without permission from his master and the Commissioners; and on application for examination for a pilot's license, proof shall be required in all cases of the satisfactory completion of the term of such service. Each such assistant shall serve six months of the above term, after the first three and a half years, as seaman on board a sailing ship or ships, and shall serve six months of the above term on board a steam ship or ships, and shall serve six months of the above term on board a steam tug plying on the Tees, or in such other craft as may be approved from time to time by the Pilot Superintendent. No apprentice shall be bound until the consent of the Pilot Superintendent has been obtained. Provided always that in case the Pilot Superintendent shall refuse to sanction the binding of any apprentice, the pilot shall have the right to appeal to the Commissioners, who may if they think fit overrule the decision of the Pilot Superintendent.
- 25. The proposed indentures and satisfactory testimonials, including a Surgeon's Certificate of sound health, and a Board of Trade Certificate as to his ability to distinguish colours, shall in every case be submitted to the Tees Pilotage Commissioners, and after the indentures have been signed by the master and apprentice, shall not be cancelled or altered except by permission of the Tees Pilotage Commissioners. The Comof the Tees Pilotage Commissioners. missioners shall have power to break such indentures, and to dismiss any apprentice from the pilot service at any time upon any misconduct on the part of the apprentice deserving in the judgment of the Commissioners such punishment. The name and age of every candidate for a pilot's license shall be entered in the Pilot Superintendent's register and character book on his first entering the service, and his character shall be therein yearly entered up by the Pilot Superintendent; and, unless otherwise ordered by the Commissioners, vacancies in the pilot service shall be filled up according to priority of the date of entry as aforesaid, and in accordance with the place where the vacancy occurs.
- 26. If after the expiration of his said apprenticeship and performance as a seaman, and if he has attained the age of twenty-one years and produces a certificate as required by Bye-law No. 25, the applicant shall on examination by the Commissioners or Examining Committee of Pilots be

approved, the Commissioners may grant him an acting order for three years to pilot vessels in accordance with Bye-law No. 4.

27. If at the expiration of the said three years the applicant shall, on further examination by the Commissioners or Examining Committee, be deemed competent, a full pilot's license may be granted to him by the Commissioners. He must, at such examination, be able to explain the rule of road at sea and to give a correct and seamanlike description of the harbour, docks, and piers, and must know the course and distance between any two places within the pilotage districts of the Tees, the rise and set of the tides, the depth and character of the soundings, the best anchorages, the sand banks, rocks, shoals, and other dangers, the landmarks, buoys, and lights, and the marks on the deep sea line, the variation and the deviation of the compass; he must, also, understand the complete management of a vessel, to bring her to anchor, and to keep her clear of her anchor in a tideway, to moor, to unmoor, and get under way, and how to handle a vessel under any circumstances.

Pilot Boats and Flags.

28. Every pilot boat must be kept in good repair, and well found with masts, rigging, sails, anchors, cables, and every other necessary material, and must have her number and the letters painted on each bow, in white, in figures and letters not less than nine inches in length; together with the name of her owner, and the port to which she belongs shall likewise be painted upon her stern; and in the case of cobles belonging to the Hartlepools, where the owners possess a Tees license, the word "Tees" and the number shall also be painted on amidships in addition to the above.

29. All cobles and other boats, if any, now or hereafter to be regularly employed in the pilotage service in the river or at sea, must, pursuant to the 611th Section of the Merchant Shipping Act, 1894, before being so employed, be approved and licensed by the Commissioners besides being numbered as directed by bye-law No. 28.

30. The Commissioners may from time to time purchase or hire on such terms and for such periods as the Commissioners shall think fit, one or more steam cutters or other vessels, of such namely:—

size, burthen and equipment, and at such cost as the Commissioners shall from time to time think fit, for the use of the pilots, and to enable them to keep the sea in every state of weather and also for river service, with all necessary cobles and other boats, gear, machinery, and appliances and may keep any and every such cutter or other vessel insured and indemnified against all insurable risks, and may repair, maintain and navigate every such cutter or other vessel and may employ and pay and discharge, remove and substitute masters, crews and engineers, and may at the discretion of the Commissioners and for any of the purposes by these bye-laws authorized enter into all charter parties and other contracts.

31. All pilots are prohibited from using in the pilotage service, at sea or in port, any coble, boat, steam tug or other vessel of any description not licensed as aforesaid, excepting only the pilot steamer or steamers or other craft provided by the Commissioners, and excepting in such special and individual cases of emergency as shall be allowed by the Commissioners as sufficient excuse.

32. Every pilot shall provide himself with a red and white flag, three feet long by two feet broad. On taking charge as pilot of any vessel, he shall cause his flag to be hoisted on board such vessel at the gaff-end under the ensign, or wherever it may be most conspicuously seen (except on the foremast), and he shall keep his flag constantly flying until he leaves the vessel. This bye-law shall apply to all vessels outward or inward bound, at sea or in port, under way or at anchor, and under all circumstances so long as she is in charge of a pilot.

33. All pilots shall obey the Bye-laws for the time being and all orders, resolutions and directions of the Commissioners; and all proper orders that may be given to them by the Harbour or Dock Masters or their assistants relative to the docking, towing, transporting, or removing of vessels under their charge, and shall strictly conform to the Bye-laws of the Tees Commissioners for the navigation and regulation of the traffic in the river.

Rates of Pilotage.

34. The following pilotage rates shall be paid, namely:—

Vessels of over nine hundred tons gross registered tonnage shall pay one farthing per ton on the excess of tonnage over nine hundred gross register tons, from the Sea to the Acklam Wharf or any intermediate distance and vice versâ.

Vessels of over nine hundred tons gross registered tonnage shall also pay one farthing per ton on the excess of tonnage over nine hundred gross register tons, from the Acklam Wharf to Stockton Bridge and vice versâ, in addition to the farthing mentioned in the clause above, making one halfpenny per ton on the excess tonnage, from Sea to Stockton Bridge, or for any distance beyond Acklam Wharf.

Vessels mooring or unmooring at the Fifth Buoy shall pay seven shillings and sixpence, in addition to the above rates.

Vessels having lee-boards shall pay five shillings, in addition to the above rates.

From Redcar Wharf to any point between Newport Wharf and Stockton Bridge or vice versâ, 2s. for every foot of water and one farthing per ton on the gross tonnage in excess of nine hundred gross register tons.

From any point between Redcar Wharf and Acklam Wharf to any point between Newport Wharf and Stockton Bridge or vice versâ, 1s. 6d. for every foot of water and one farthing per ton on the gross tonnage in excess of nine hundred gross register tons.

- 35. In the event of any vessel being unable to proceed direct to her discharging or loading berth owing to insufficient water, or the berth being occupied, or by other unforeseen circumstances, and the vessel is safely moored elsewhere, the pilotage is to be considered finished.
- 36. In case any pilot in charge should by the law of quarantine, or at the request of the master or owner of the vessel, be detained at sea or river or in dock, on board thereof, beyond the time necessary for safely berthing such vessel he shall be paid by the said master or owner for such detention, over and above the above-mentioned dues, at the rate of 7s. 6d. per tide or part of a tide, and also have his provisions supplied to him.
- 37. Any outward bound ship in charge of a pilot which owing to stress of weather has to put back after reaching the Fifth Buoy Low Light shall pay the full outwards pilotage rates to sea, and in addition one third of the inwards pilotage rates from sea to the point to which such ship returns.

Docking or Transporting.

38. The rates for docking and transporting shall be as follows, namely:—

From anywhere between Eston Jetty and Acklam Wharf or between Connal's Wharf and Newport Wharf, or between Newport Wharf and Stockton Bridge, and vice versâ.

- 39. In the case of vessels exceeding nine hundred tons gross register two-thirds only of the above rates to be charged for moving vessels from tier or wharf to tier or wharf, or from tier or wharf to any dry dock or slipway within the distance of 300 yards.
- 40. For a pilot continuing in charge on request whilst a vessel's compasses are being adjusted ten shillings and sixpence extra for such service.
- 41. For pilot's attendance in harbour when required on any vessel, whether ultimately engaged for such vessel or not, seven shillings and sixpence per day or part of a day.
- 42. Any disputes as to the foregoing rates to be settled by the Pilot Superintendent.
- 43. Travelling expenses to or from any of the undermentioned places will be allowed according to the following scale in addition to any pilotage rates to pilots who have to find their way back to Middlesbrough, from, or be required to proceed from Middlesbrough to any of the undermentioned places when on pilotage duty, but the Commissioners may increase any of the following allowances to meet the special circumstances of any particular case, viz.:—

All other charges for pilotage or travelling expenses, etc., shall be determined by the Commissioners as the Pilotage Authority of the Tees Ports.

Launches.

44. For attending at the launch of any vessel in the River Tees, such fee as may be agreed between the ship builder and the pilot.

Complaints.—How to be made.

45. All complaints of offences of whatever kind against the Act of Parliament, or these Bye-laws, or any of them, shall be made in writing, signed by the party aggrieved, and delivered to the Secretary to the Pilotage Commissioners, or left at the Commissioners' office, as soon as practicable, and the Secretary shall summon all such persons as the Commissioners or any Committee may desire to examine, to attend a meeting of the Commissioners or Committee.

Turn Ships.

46. All ships, whether sailing or steam ships, which are brought into the Tees by a pilot having an inward license only, or by an unqualified pilot, shall be considered turn ships, and shall be put down on the turn-list, in accordance with the order in which they are reported to the pilot superintendent. Such turn shall not be altered, unless the captain of a vessel selects some other pilot, in which case, the pilot whose turn it originally was, shall receive half the outward pilotage. Ships of 500 tons and under, shall be reserved as turns for second-class pilots.

Pilots using Shelter to take Turns.

- 47. In case of bad weather, when pilot boats cannot get over the Tees bar, pilotage must be by turn, and pilots must go on board the Barge to place themselves on turn. Second-class pilots will have the preference of second-class ships. This rule is not to prevent Hartlepool pilots from boarding ships from their own boats, when Tees pilots cannot get off. Nor is it to prevent Hartlepool men being put aboard Tees bound ships by the Hartlepool steam tug.
- 48. A turn book shall be kept by the person in charge of the Pilot Barge, and each pilot on boarding shall enter his name therein and the time at which he goes on board, and on any vessel being sighted requiring the services of a pilot, the first pilot on turn shall take charge of such vessel according to his class of certificate, and in rotation. In the event of there being more than one pilot in a boat, and in case there is not a third boat at the barge before the first ship takes a pilot, then the second pilot in number 1 boat takes number 3 turn.

Preferred Pilots.

49. In the case of any vessel at sea inward bound to the River Tees, where any owner or captain has a special or preferred pilot, if such pilot is not at the vessel within the limits of an imaginary line, drawn between Seaton Buoy, the Fairway Buoy, and the outer Bar Buoy, in time to take charge thereof, the pilot who first speaks the vessel and offers his services shall receive half of the pilotage due in respect of such vessel if the captain does not employ him and afterwards engages another pilot to take his vessel inwards. To entitle him to this division he must not, after his services have been refused and another pilot to the pilot performing of same shall be made engaged, pilot any other vessel until the next

flood tide, otherwise he will forfeit his claim upon the pilotage of the ship first spoken.

- 50. Every pilot shall make daily returns on forms to be prescribed by and furnished at the office of the Commissioners of any vessel or vessels piloted, docked, undocked, moved or in any way transported or attended by him, showing the amount of earnings of every description earned each day. Such returns shall be made by each pilot to the Secretary at his office, and in default of his so doing he shall in each case be subject to a deduction from his share of pilotage of a sum not exceeding ten shillings, and be liable to have his license withdrawn or suspended.
- 51. A pilot engaged in general terms at sea who pilots a vessel into the harbour, but is there superseded by another pilot, shall be entitled to receive, in addition to the pilotage from sea into the harbour, half of the further pilotage to her destination.
- 52. Every pilot is prohibited from receiving from any owner, consignee, agent or master any pilotage dues or earnings of any description.
- 53. Every pilot earning any pilotage dues, or earnings of any description, shall, on completion of his services, tender for signature to the master or other person in charge of the vessel a form of order on the owner, consignee, or agent for payment of the pilotage dues earned, to be in such order specified, and shall forthwith, on receipt of such order, deliver the same to the Secretary, or such other official, and at such place and time as the Commissioners shall from time to time prescribe.
- 54. All masters, owners, consignees and agents within the district of the Tees Pilotage Commissioners are hereby required to pay all pilotage dues of every description to the Secretary or other official appointed by the Commissioners, and not to any pilot. This bye-law is not to be construed to abridge or affect the liability of owners, masters, consignees, or agents to pay pilotage dues as prescribed by the Merchant Shipping Acts, 1854 to 1894, but is intended to provide for payment of pilotage dues to the Commissioners' Collector instead of to the pilots as heretofore.
- 55. From the gross amount of pilotage earnings received by the Commissioners there shall, from time to time, be deducted—

1st. The contributions of pilots under the 58th bye-law.

2nd. The cost of collection of the earnings of all the pilots.

3rd. The contributions of pilots under the 59th bye-law.

Such deductions, or any of them, may in the first place be upon estimate subject to subsequent quarterly or other adjustment, and it shall not be open to any pilot to receive from the Commissioners any deductions made from the gross pilotage by virtue of this or any other Bye-law.

56. The net amount of all pilotage earnings of every description received by the Commissioners shall, after the deductions mentioned or referred to in the 55th and 59th bye-laws, be handed over to the pilot performing the service, and payment of same shall be made as soon as practicable after the work is completed.

- 57. No action shall be brought or claim set up against the Commissioners by any pilot in respect of the collection, apportionment or division by the Commissioners, from time to time, of the pilotage earnings.
- 58. In lieu of the contributions hitherto paid by the pilots to the Commissioners on the ships piloted by them, a deduction of not exceeding in the discretion of the Commissioners, five pounds per centum shall be made from the gross amount of pilotage earnings of every description earned by the pilots. The amount thus from time to time deducted shall be placed to the credit of the "General Pilotage Fund," and shall be applied in the same manner as the other moneys belonging to this fund, being nevertheless primarily applicable to the cost of the pilotage service.
- 59. Should the requirements of the Port at any future time necessitate the building or employment of a steam pilot cutter or cutters, the Commissioners may with the approval of the majority of the pilots make a further deduction towards the expenses of maintaining such cutter or cutters, but such deduction shall not exceed 3½ per cent. of the gross earnings of such pilots.
- 60. Every master and every mate in the merchant service obtaining a pilotage certificate enabling him to pilot his vessel within any portion of the Tees pilotage district, pursuant either to Section 599 or Section 600 of the Merchant Shipping Act, 1894, shall for each occasion he shall navigate his vessel within the waters of the said district to which his certificate applies, pay to the Commissioners as hereinafter mentioned, a sum not exceeding, in the discretion of the Commissioners, five pounds per centum of the gross amount of pilotage dues payable in respect of the vessel to a qualified pilot on each occasion. Every such payment shall be placed to the credit of the General Pilotage Fund. Provided always that such payments shall not entitle any such master or mate, nor his widow or children, to any benefit by way of pension or superannuation. Provided also that such payment shall not be made in respect of the same vessel, more than four times per month for outward, and four times per month for inward pilotage.
- 61. Every such master or mate certificated as aforesaid, shall make monthly returns within seven days after the end of the month, of the ships navigated by him within the Tees Pilotage District, and at the same time, shall pay to the Secretary or collector, the amount due from him under bye-law 60.

Pilots' Committee.

62. The Commissioners shall have power to appoint a committee of first class pilots for the purpose of examining all candidates for a pilot's license. This committee shall consist of such number of first class pilots as the Commissioners may from time to time direct and one or more members of the Commission, and shall at all times be presided over by a Commissioner. For the present and until the Commissioners shall otherwise appoint the committee shall consist of five first class pilots and two Commissioners, of whom three shall form a quorum. Each member

of the committee shall hold office during the pleasure of the Commissioners, and in case of death or resignation of any member of the committee the vacancy shall be filled by the Commissioners. Any Commissioner may be present at any meeting of the committee.

Investment of Funds.

- 63. All funds now in, or hereafter coming into the possession of the Commissioners in respect of the Tees Pilotage District, may after payment of working expenses, be and remain, at the discretion of the Commissioners, invested, and may be from time to time invested upon any of the following securities:—
 - (1) Upon loan to the Tees Conservancy Commissioners, or upon any of the securities on which these Commissioners are from time to time authorized by law to borrow money.
 - (2) In any post office savings bank.
 - (3) In the public funds.
 - (4) Upon real securities of freehold or copyhold tenure in England or Wales.
 - (5) Upon the debentures or debenture stock of railway companies authorized by law to borrow money upon debenture or debenture stock.
 - (6) Upon securities offered by any Municipal Corporation, Body of Commissioners, or other Corporation aggregate in England authorized by law to borrow money.
- (7) In the purchase of real property situate in England.
- (8) In addition to the foregoing, upon any of the securities upon which a trustee is authorized to invest funds by "The Trustee Act, 1893," or other statutory authority in force for the time being applicable to trustee and trust funds.

Penalty for Breach of Bye-laws.

- 64. Every pilot or apprentice offending against or contravening any of the preceding bye-laws with respect to pilots, pilot boats, and pilotage, shall for every such offence, forfeit and pay a penalty not exceeding five pounds.
- 65. The Commissioners shall assess the amount of penalty to be paid in each case, and shall have power to deduct the same from any money in hand or which may hereafter be earned by the pilot offending.

Note.—In addition to this penalty, any pilot acting contrary to the provisions of any of these Bye-laws, or of any resolution or order of the Commissioners, or of any proper order of the Pilot Superintendent, is liable under the Act of Parliament to have his license suspended or cancelled by the Commissioners.

OTICE is hereby given, that in pursuance of section 28 of the Rhondda Urban District Council (Tramways, &c.) Act, 1902, the Rhondda Urban District Council (hereinafter called "the Council") propose with the consent of the Board of Trade by lease to be approved of by the Board of Trade, to demise to the Rhondda Tramways Co. - 6. To permit the Council to enter upon the demised premises to examine the state of repair and condition thereof.
- 7. To maintain in repair in accordance with the provisions of section 28 of the Tramways Act, 1870, such parts of the roadway as are specified in the proposed lease.
- 8. To insure the demised premises against fire.
- That all posts, standards, and brackets shall be erected in accordance with the requirements of the Council.
- 10. That the Council may have the free use of the tramways for the Council's watercarts and rotary brushes during the hours mentioned in the proposed lease.
