ORDER of the Local Government Board : . Motor Car Act, 1903. Regulations under Section 9 (1).

COUNTY OF HERTFORD.

URBAN DISTRICT OF WATFORD.

To the County Council of Hertford :----

And to all others whom it may concern.

Whereas by Sub-section (1) of Section 9 of the Motor Car Act, 1903 (hereinafter referred to as "the Act"), it is enacted that, within any limits or place referred to in regulations made by Us, the Local Government Board, with a view to the safety of the public on the application of the local authority of the area in which the limits or place are situate, a person shall not drive a motor car at a speed exceeding ten miles per hour;

And whereas the County Council of Hertford, having made application to Us to make a Regulation in pursuance of the said Subsection putting the above-mentioned provisions of that Sub-section in force within the limits comprising certain roads or parts of roads situate within the Urban District of Watford, in the County of Hertford, We directed a Local Inquiry to be held into the matter by one of Our Inspectors, and the Inquiry was held accordingly, and Report has been made to Us thereon:

Now therefore, in pursuance of the powers given to Us in that behalf, We do, by this Our Order, make the following Regulations :---

ARTICLE I.—The provisions of Sub-section (1) of Section 9 of the Act with respect to the driving of a motor car at a speed not exceeding ten miles per hour shall apply and have effect within the limits comprising the roads or parts of roads within the Urban District of Watford which are specified in the Schedule hereto.

ARTICLE II.—These Regulations shall come into operation on the twenty-first day of September, one thousand nine hundred and eight.

SCHEDULE.

Chalk Hill, extending from its junction with High-street to its junction with Villiers-road;

So much of Pinner-road as extends from its junction with High-street to its junction with Capel-road;

So much of Aldenham-road as extends from the northern boundary of the School Premises situate therein to its junction with Pinner-road;

So much of High-street as extends from its junction with Chalk Hill to its junction with Upton-road;

So much of King-street as extends from its junction with High-street to its junction with George-street;

George-street, extending from its junction with King-street to its junction with Vicarageroad;

So much of Queen's-road as extends from its junction with High-street to a point in the road situate 10 yards north of its junction with Derbyroad.
