WILD BIRD (ENGLAND).

The Wild Birds Protection (County Borough of Merthyr Tydfil) Order, 1908.

Dated 9th September, 1908.

In pursuance of the powers conferred on me by the Wild Birds Protection Acts, 1880 to 1908, and upon application by the Council of the County Borough of Merthyr Tydfil, I hereby make the following Order:—

Title.

I. This Order may be cited as "The Wild Birds Protection (County Borough of Merthyr Tydfil) Order, 1908."

BIRDS.

Additions to the Schedule of the Act of 1880.

II. The Wild Birds Protection Act, 1880, shall apply within the County Borough of Merthyr Tydfil to the following species of Wild Birds in the same manner as if those species were included in the Schedule to the Act:—

Common Buzzard, Golden Eagle, Peregrine Falcon, Kestrel, Kite, House Martin, Nuthatch, Raven, Redstart, Siskin, Wren.

Certain Birds protected throughout the County Borough during the whole of the Year.

III. During the period between the 31st day of July in any year and the 2nd day of March following, the killing or taking of the following species of Wild Birds is prohibited throughout the County Borough of Merthyr Tydfil:—

Bittern, Common Buzzard, Chough, Golden Eagle, Peregrine Falcon, Goldfinch, Kestrel, Kingfisher, Kite, Wood Lark, House Martin, Merlin, Nightingale, Nightjar (Goat Sucker, Night Hawk or Fern Owl), Nuthatch, Golden Oriole, Little Owl, Long-eared Owl, Short-eared Owl, Tawny Owl (Brown Owl, Wood Owl), White or Barn Owl, Raven, Siskin, Green Woodpecker, Great Spotted Woodpecker, Lesser Spotted Woodpecker.

All Birds protected on Sundays.

IV. During that period of the year to which the protection afforded by the Wild Birds Protection Act, 1880, does not apply, the killing or taking of Wild Birds on Sundays is prohibited throughout the County Borough of Merthyr Tydfil.

EGGS.

Certain Eggs protected throughout the County Borough.

V. The taking or destroying of the eggs of the following species of Wild Birds is prohibited throughout the County Borough of Merthyr Tydfil:—

Bittern, Common Buzzard, Chough, Kentish Dotterel, Golden Eagle, Peregrine Falcon,

Goldfinch, Kestrel, Kingfisher, Kite, Sky Lark, Wood Lark, House Martin, Nightingale, Nightjar (Goat Sucker, Night Hawk or Fern Owl), Nuthatch, Golden Oriole, Ring Ouzel, Water Ouzel, Little Owl, Long-eared Owl, Short-eared Owl, Tawny Owl (Brown Owl, Wood Owl), White or Barn Owl, Raven, Redstart, Siskin, Lesser Tern, Green Woodpecker, Great Spotted Woodpecker, Lesser Spotted Woodpecker, Wren.

The Wild Birds Protection (City and County Borough of Cardiff) Order, 1908.

Dated 9th September, 1908.

In pursuance of the powers conferred on me by the Wild Birds Protection Acts, 1880 to 1908, and upon application by the Council of the City and County Borough of Cardiff, I hereby make the following Order:—

Title.

I. This Order may be cited as "The Wild Birds Protection (City and County Borough of Cardiff) Order, 1908."

BIRDS.

Certain Birds protected during the whole of the Year.

II. During the period between the 31st day of July in any year and the 2nd day of March following, the killing or taking of the following species of Wild Birds is prohibited throughout the City and County Borough of Cardiff:—

Bittern, Brambling, Cirl Bunting, Common (or Corn) Bunting, Reed Bunting (Reed Sparrow), Yellow Bunting (Yellow Hammer), Buzzard, Honey Buzzard, Chaffinch, Chiffchaff, Coot, Corn Crane (Land Rail), Cuckoo, Pied Flycatcher, Spotted Flycatcher, Goldfinch, Little Grebe, Gulls, Hawfuch, Hobby, Jay, Kestrel, Kingfisher, Lark, Linnet, Magpie, House Martin, Sand Martin, Merlin, Nightingale, Nightjar (Goat Sucker, Night Hawk or Fern Owl), Nuthatch, Osprey, Owls, Redpole, Redstart, Shrikes, Siskin, Sniew, Starling, Stonechat, Swallow, Swift, Terns, Bearded Tit (Reedling or Reed Pheasant), Long-tailed Tit, Grey Wagtail, Pied Wagtail, White Wagtail, Yellow Wagtail, Blackcap Warbler, Garden Warbler, Reed Warbler, Sedge Warbler, Willow Warbler, Wood Warbler, Whinchat, Whitethroat, Lesser Whitethroat, Green Woodpecker, Great Spotted Woodpecker, Lesser Spotted Woodpecker, Wren, Golden-crested Wren, Wryneck (Cuckoo's Mate or Snake Bird).

EGGS.

Certain Eggs protected.

III. The taking or destroying of the eggs of the following species of Wild Birds is prohibited throughout the City and County Borough of Cardiff:—

Bittern, Brambling, Cirl Bunting, Common (or Corn) Bunting, Reed Bunting (Reed Sparrow), Yellow Bunting (Yellow Hammer), Buzzard,
