COUNTY OF GLOUCESTER.

Supplementary Bye-law made by the County Council of the Administrative County of Gloucester, under the Locomotives Act, 1898.

NOTICE is hereby given that after the expiration of one calendar month from the 21st day of September, 1908, application will be made to the Local Government Board for the confirmation of a Supplementary Bye-law under the Locomotives Act, 1898, made and adopted by the Gloucestershire County Council; and notice is also hereby given that a copy of such Bye-law will be kept at the office of the Clerk of the said County Council, at Gloucester, and be open to the inspection of the ratepayers of the said County, without fee or reward, on any week day other than Thursday, between the hours of 10 A.M. and 5 P.M., and on Thursday between the hours of 10 A.M. and 1 P.M., during the period of one calendar month from the said 21st day of September, 1908; and notice is also hereby given that a copy thereof, at a charge of 6d. for every 100 words, will be furnished by the Clerk of the said County Council to any applicant.

BOROUGH OF IPSWICH.

PUBLIC HEALTH ACTS AMENDMENT ACT, 1907.

NOTICE is hereby given, that by their Order, dated the 11th day of September, 1908, the Local Government Board have declared and directed that on and after the 30th day of October, 1908, Parts II, III, IV, V and VI, and Sections 92, 93 and 95 comprised in Part X of the Public Health Acts Amendment Act, 1907, shall be in force in the Urban Sanitary District of Ipswich.

Where any of the said parts comprises a section to which reference is made in the first column of the schedule hereunder written, the section shall be in force subject to the following conditions and adaptations, that is to say:—

Unless and until the said Board otherwise direct, the said section in its application to the district, and in relation to the exercise of the powers and to the discharge of the duties of the Local Authority under that section, shall have effect as if the words set forth in the second column of the said schedule opposite to the reference to that section in the first column of that schedule were added to and formed part of the section.

And notice is hereby also given, that the Secretary of State has made an Order, dated

24th August, 1908, under Section 3 of the Public Health Acts Amendment Act, 1907, declaring sections 78, 79, 80, 81, 83, 84, 85 and 86 of Part VII, and Parts VIII and IX of that Act, to be in force in the Borough of Ipswich.

PART II.	
Section twenty-five.	"The power of making or enforcing bye-laws under section one hundred and fifty-seven of the Public Health Act, 1875, as extended by section twenty-three of the Public Health Acts Amendment Act, 1890, with respect to the paving of yards and open spaces in connection with dwelling - houses, shall cease to be exercisable."
Section twenty-seven.	"(7) Nothing in this section shall apply to any temporary building erected or set up for use by the Territorial Force."
PART III.	
Section thirty-five.	"This section, so far as it relates to the deposit of material, shall have effect subject to the first proviso to section ninety-one of the Public Health Act, 1875. "The power of making or enforcing bye-laws under section twenty-three of the Municipal Corporations Act, 1882, for the prevention and suppression of nuisances shall not be exercisable in relation to any subject matter of this section."
Section thirty-eight.	"Nothing in this section shall prejudicially affect any power or right exercisable by or attaching to an owner or occupier of premises by virtue of section twenty-two of the Public Health Act, 1875, or of section eighteen of the Public Health Acts Amendment Act, 1890."

Section fifty-nine.	"(6) Nothing in this section shall apply to a public or circulating library which is not within the district."
PART V.	
Section seventy-five.	"(3) The date of the Order of the Local Government Board by which this Part is declared to be in force shall be the beginning of the period within which the Local Authority shall give notice for the purposes of sub-section (1) of this section."
