COUNTY OF HERTFORD.

Borough of Hertford. Urban District of Hoddesdon. Parish of Hertingfordbury.

To the County Council of Hertford:—
And to all others whom it may concern.

Whereas by Sub-section (1) of Section 9 of the Motor Car Act, 1903 (hereinafter referred to as "the Act"), it is enacted that, within any limits or place referred to in regulations made by Us, the Local Government Board, with a view to the safety of the public on the application of the local authority of the area in which the limits or place are situate, a person shall not drive a motor car at a speed exceeding ten miles per hour;

And whereas the County Council of Hertford, having made application to Us to make a Regulation in pursuance of the said Subsection putting the above-mentioned provisions of that Sub-section in force within the limits comprising certain roads or parts of roads situate within the Borough of Hertford, the Urban District of Hoddesdon, and the Parish of Hertingfordbury, in the County of Hertford, We directed a Local Inquiry to be held into the matter by one of Our Inspectors, and the Inquiry was held accordingly, and Report has been made to Us thereon:

Now therefore, in pursuance of the powers given to Us in that behalf, We do, by this Our Order, make the following Regulations:—

ARTICLE I.—The provisions of Sub-section (1) of Section 9 of the Act with respect to the driving of a motor car at a speed not exceeding ten miles per hour shall apply and have effect within the limits comprising the roads or parts of roads which are specified in the Schedule hereto.

ARTICLE II.—These Regulations shall come into operation on the fifth day of October, one thousand nine hundred and eight.

So much of Molewood-road as extends from its junction with Cowbridge to its junction with Nelson-street;

Great Northern Station-road, for a distance of 60 yards from its junction with Cowbridge.

Urban District of Hoddesdon.

So much of High-street as extends from its junction with Amwell-street and Burford-street to a point situate 20 yards south of its junction with Lord-street;

Amwell - street, Burford - street, and Duke-street;

So much of Ware-road as extends for a distance of 100 yards from its junction with Duke-street;

So much of Stanstead-road as extends for a distance of 20 yards from its junction with Dukestreet;

So much of Hertford-road as extends from a point therein situate 100 yards south-east of its junction with College-road to its junction with Amwell-street.

Parish of Hertingfordbury.

So much of the main road from Bayford to Hertford as extends from a point therein situate 50 yards south of its junction with the road at the south corner of the Parsonage Grounds leading to Cole Green and Hatfield to the northern boundary of the Parish;

So much of the main road from Cole Green to Hertingfordbury Village as extends from the eastern end of the Allotment Gardens situate on the north side of the road to its junctions with the main road first above mentioned at the north and south corners of the Parsonage Grounds.

ORDER OF THE BOARD OF AGRICULTURE AND FISHERIES.

(DATED 22ND SEPTEMBER 1908.)

The Board of Agriculture and Fisheries, by virtue and in exercise of the powers vested in them under the Diseases of Animals Acts, 1894 to 1903, and of every other power enabling them in this behalf, do order, and it is hereby ordered, as follows:

- 1. The provisions of this Order shall apply to the vessel named in the Schedule hereto and to all animals carried in such vessel while this Order remains in force.
- 2. Any Inspector of the Board of Agriculture and Fisheries shall be permitted to examine the animals at such time or times as he may require while the vessel is in any port of Great Britain.
- 3. No person, except as hereinafter provided, shall, while the animals are in any port of Great Britain, enter a pen in which the animals are, or have recently been kept; Provided that Inspectors of the Board of Agriculture and Fisheries and all persons while actually engaged in tending the animals or cleansing or disinfecting the pens shall be exempted from the prohibition contained in this Article.
- 4. Every person upon leaving a pen in which the animals are or have recently been kept shall thoroughly wash his hands with soap and water and disinfect his boots with a five per cent. solution of carbolic acid, and every such person shall before landing from the vessel in Great Britain change or effectually disinfect his clothes.
- 5. The vessel shall, from time to time as and when required by notice signed by an Inspector of the Board of Agriculture and Fisheries, be cleansed and disinfected as follows:—
 - (i.) All parts of the vessel with which any animal or its dung have come in contact shall be scraped and swept and then thoroughly washed or scrubbed or scoured with water, and subsequently disinfected with—

(a) a one per cent. (minimum) solution of chloride of lime containing not less than thirty per cent. of available chlorine; or

(b) a five per cent. (minimum) solution of carbolic acid (containing not less than ninety-five per cent. of actual carbolic acid), followed by a thorough sprinkling with limewash; or

(c) a disinfectant equal in disinfective efficiency to the above-mentioned solution of carbolic acid, followed by a thorough sprinkling with limewash.

(ii.) All fittings, pens, hurdles, or utensils used for or about the animals shall be scraped and then cleansed and disinfected in the same manner as the vessel.

(iii.) While any part of the vessel is being cleansed or disinfected all animals shall be temporarily removed therefrom.

(iv.) The scrapings and sweepings shall be forthwith thoroughly mixed with quicklime, and then carried by water outside the port in which the vessel is lying, and there discharged into the sea.

6. While the vessel remains in any port of Great Britian, all dung of the animals, and all litter removed from the pens, shall at intervals not exceeding twenty-four hours be thoroughly

mixed with quicklime and then carried by water outside the port and there discharged into the

- 7. No animal shall be landed from the vessel in any port of Great Britain while this Order remains in force.
- 8. If anything is done or omitted to be done with respect to the vessel or the animals therein, in contravention of this Order, the owner and the charterer and the master of the vessel shall, each according to and in respect of his own acts or omissions, be deemed guilty of an offence against the Diseases of Animals Act, 1894.
- 9. In this Order, unless the context otherwise requires—
 - "Animals" means cattle, sheep and goats, and all other ruminating animals, and swine:

"Master" includes a person having the charge or command of a vessel:

"Port" includes a sub-port, haven or creek, and the limits of a port for the purposes of this Order shall be the limits declared under the Customs Consolidation Act, 1876.
