Rome, Octob. 25.

Ince the Publishing the Bull against Offices of the ber, another is made publick, by which the Pope, among other Things, declares, That all the Cardinals shall be obliged for the future to reside constantly at Rome, the better to support the Honour and Dignity of this See by their attendance on the Pope in Confiftories, Chapels, and other Publick Occasions; and for that reason they are to have no Bishopricks, but Pensions instead thereof; excepting the Cardinals who are Archbishops of Milan and Naples; and those that are employed as Legates abroad. The Spanish Ambassador having received this Week Letters by an Extraordinary Courier from Madrid, demanded thereupon an Audience of the Pope, which was granted him the same day; and according to all appearance the Differences between this Court and that of Spain, about the Prince of Tallis, and the Inquisition at Naples, will be speedily accommodated. We have an account from Naples, That the Popes Gallies, who were fent this last Summer to the Assistance of the Venetians, are arrived in that Port, and that they intended to Sail again from thence on the 20th inflant for Civital Feechia: where they are working with great diligence on the Aqueducts, and other publick Buildings, which the Pope will have finished this Winter; he intending to go thither himfelf soon after Easter.

The Senate have Venice, Octob. 31. resolved to give out Commissions for the railing 6000 Men, to reinforce their Army From whence we had an account by Letters of the 25th of the last month, That the Captain General had put the Forces, which were returned from the Siege of Canea, into Quarters of Refreshment; and had taken care to fecure the Pallage of the Ithmus of Corinth, which

Lemberg in Polind, Offeb. 16. The Circular Letters are gone out for Summoning a Diet, which is to meet at Grodno, the Capital City of Lithuania, on the 31st of December.
