Rome, Octob. 25.

Since the Publishing the Bull against Selling Offices of the Chamber, another is made publick, by which the Pope, among other Things, declares, That all the Cardinals shall be obliged for the future to reside constantly at *Rome*, the better to support the Honour and Dignity of this See by their attendance on the Pope in Consistories, Chapels, and other Publick Occasions; and for that reason they are to have no Bishopricks, but Pensions instead thereof; excepting the Cardinals who are Archbishops of *Milan* and *Naples*; and those that are employed as Legates abroad. The Spanish Ambassador having received this Week Letters by an Extraordinary Courier from *Madrid*, demanded thereupon an Audience of the Pope, which was granted him the same day; and according to all appearance the Differences between this Court and that of *Spain*, about the Prince of *Tessis*, and the Inquisition at *Naples*, will be speedily accommodated. We have an account from *Naples*, That the Popes Gallies, who were sent this last Summer to the Assistance of the Venetians, are arrived in that Port, and that they intended to Sail again from thence on the 20th instant for *Civita Vecchia*: where they are working with great diligence on the Aqueducts, and other publick Buildings, which the Pope will have finished this Winter; he intending to go thither himself soon after *Easter*.

Verice, Octob. 31. The Senate have resolved to give out Commissions for the raising 6000 Men, to reinforce their Army in the *Levant*. From whence we had an account by Letters of the 25th of the last month, That the Captain General had put the Forces, which were returned from the Siege of *Canea*, into Quarters of Refreshment; and had taken care to secure the Passage of the *Isthmus* of *Corinth*, which the Turks have lately attempted to force to give them an Inlet into the *Morea*. On Sunday last Sailed from hence a Con-

voy of 7 Ships laden with Provisions, &c. for the *Levant*.

Lemberg in *Poland*; Octob. 16. The Circular Letters are gone out for Summoning a Diet, which is to meet at *Grodna*, the Capital City of *Lithuania*, on the 31st of *December*. The Court continues still at *Pomorzan*; but is expected at *Jamarow* towards the end of this month; where a great Council will be held of the Senators and Generals of the Army. The Army is gone into Quarters, except 4000 Men that are posted near *Caminiec*, and the Troops that are marching under the Callian of *Chelm* to the Relief of *Sorocke*, which is still Besieged by the Tatars and Moldavians.

Dublin, Novemb. 6. Here has been lately Published a Proclamation by the Lord Lieutenant and Council, bearing date the 21st of the last month; which sets forth.

That whereas divers idle and dissolute Persons (of whom several are therein particularly named) have deserted their Habitations, and taken up Arms, and in a grievous manner disturbed the Peace of the Country by their Rebellions, Thefts, Burglaries, and other Outrages; His Excellency and the Council taking the same into their serious Consideration, and being resolved to bring the said Offenders to speedy and condign Punishment, have in order thereunto caused Commissions of Oyer and Terminer to be issued out, and lodged in every County of this Kingdom, for the Trial of such Criminals as shall be Apprehended; And for the more effectual and speedy suppressing of Tories, Thieves and Robbers; They do Charge and Command all their Majesties good Subjects not to Harbour, Relieve, Conceal, or Assist, any Thief, Robber, or Tory, or other Person whatsoever, that is, or shall be in Arms, and upon his keeping; and do likewise Charge and Require all Magistrates; and all Officers and Soldiers of the Army and Militia, and all other Their Majesties Subjects, to persecute, pursue, kill, and destroy all such Tories, Thieves, and Robbers, as shall be found in Arms, or be upon their keeping as aforesaid: And do declare, That the Person who shall kill any such Thief, Tory, or Robber, shall not only be Indemnified for the same, but shall also have a Reward of Five Pounds Sterling to be paid him by the Sheriff of the County; And if any Person shall take or apprehend any Thief or Tory in Arms, or any Harbourer of them, so as to bring him to Condign Punishment according to Law, he shall receive the Reward of Five Pounds
