REGULATIONS as to Cholera, Yellow Fever, and Plague; Mooring Station for certain Ships outside District of Sanitary Authority: Consent under Article VI.

> PORT OF CARLISLE (SILLOTH). Holme Cultram Urban District.

Whereas We, the Local Government Board, by a General Order dated the 9th day of September,

1907, in the exercise of the powers conferred upon Us by the Public Health Act, 1875, the Public Health (London) Act, 1891, the Public Health Act, 1896, and the Public Health Act, 1904, and every other power enabling Us in that behalf, made certain regulations (hereinafter referred to as "the Regulations"), with respect to Cholera, Yellow Fever, and Plague;

And whereas by Article VI of the Regulations it is provided that every Port Sanitary Authority and every other Sanitary Authority within whose district persons are likely to be landed from any ship coming from a foreign port shall, with the approval of the Chief Officer of Customs of the port, fix some place where the Master of any ship certified under the Regulations to be an infected ship or a suspected ship within the meaning of the Regulations shall, as required by Article X of the Regulations, moor or anchor the ship; and it is further provided by Article VI that the place to be fixed as aforesaid shall be some place within the jurisdiction or district of the Sanitary Authority, unless We otherwise consent; in which case the place so fixed shall, for the purposes of the Regulations, be deemed to be within that jurisdiction or district;

And whereas the Urban District Council of Holme Cultram being a Sanitary Authority within the meaning of the Regulations, and hereinafter referred to as "the Sanitary Authority," propose, with the approval of the Chief Officer of Customs of the Port of Carlisle, to fix the place hereinafter referred to, and indicated by a circle drawn in red on the map or chart in the Schedule to this Order, as the place where any ship, certified as aforesuid may be moored or anchored for the purpose of Article X of the Regulations, and such place being situate without their jurisdiction or district, have made application to Us for Our consent in the matter:

Now therefore, in pursuance of the powers conferred upon Us by the said Acts and by the Regulations, and of every other power enabling Us in that behalf, We do hereby Declare, Order,

and Direct as follows: ARTICLE I .- We Consent to the Sauitary Authority fixing, with the approval of the Chief Officer of Customs of the Customs Port of Carlisle, the waters included within the circle drawn in red on the Map or Chart in the Schedule to this Order as the place where any ship, bound to any place within the District of the Sanitary Authority, and certified as aforesaid, shall be moored or anchored for the purpose of Article X of the Regulations.

ARTICLE II.—The jurisdiction of the Sanitary Authority shall, for the purposes of the Regulations, be deemed to extend, and the Regulations shall apply, to any ship certified as aforesaid which, in pursuance of the Regulations or of any directions given thereunder, shall be moored at the place so fixed as a Mooring Station as hereinbefore mentioned, and to any such ship so certified which shall be on its way thither for

the purpose of being so moored.

ORDER of the Local Government Board; Motor Car Act, 1903; Regulation under Section 8.

COUNTY OF EAST SUSSEX,

URBAN DISTRICT OF NEWHAVEN.

To the County Council of East Sussex ;-And to all others whom it may concern.

Whereas by section 8 of the Motor Car Act, 1903, it is provided that We, the Local Government Board, may, by Regulations made under section 6 of the Locomotives on Highways Act, 1896, restrict the driving of any motor cars, or of any special kind of motor cars, on any specified highway, or part of a highway, which does not exceed sixteen feet in width, or on which ordinary motor car traffic would, in Our opinion, be especially dangerous;

And whereas the County Council of East Sussex, having applied to Us to make a Regula-tion in pursuance of the abovementioned sections restricting the driving of motor cars on part of a certain highway situate within the Urban District of Newhaven, in the County of East Sussex, We directed a Local Inquiry to be held into the matter by one of Our Inspectors, and an Inquiry was held accordingly, and Report has been made to Us thereon:

Now therefore, in pursuance of the powers given to Us in that behalf, We do hereby make the following Regulations:-


ARTICLE I.—A person shall not drive a motor car on the part of a highway described in the Schedule hereto, at a speed exceeding ten miles per hour.

ARTICLE II.—These Regulations shall come into operation on the twenty-first day of December, one thousand nine hundred and eight.

SCHEDULE.

So much of the main road from Brighton to Eastbourne within the Urban District of Newhaven, as extends from its junction with the Lewes Road to its junction with the road leading to the Harbour on the east side of the railway crossing.

REGULATIONS respecting Boy Clerks registered for Temporary Employment in Public Depart-

1. Two Registers of Boy Clerks for temporary employment in Public Departments will be kept by the Civil Service Commissioners.

- 2. These Registers will contain the names of boys who, being either natural-born or naturalized British subjects, are certified by the Civil Service Commissioners to be of good health and character, and duly qualified under the following regulations (3 and 4). One Register will contain the names of boys for service in London, Edinburgh, and provincial towns of England, Scotland, and Wales. The other will contain the names of boys for service in Dublin and provincial towns in
- 3. The limits of age are 15 to 16. examination begins in one of the first four months of any year candidates must be of the prescribed age on the first day of January in that year. If an examination begins in one of the second four months of any year candidates must be of the prescribed age on the first day of May in that year. If an examination begins in one of the last four months of any year candidates must be of the prescribed age on the first day of September in that year.
 - 4. The subjects for examination are :-
 - 1. Handwriting and Orthography.
 - 2. Arithmetic, including Vulgar and Decimal Fractions.
 - 8. English Composition.
 - 4. Copying Manuscript.

And any three of the following, except that not more than two languages may be taken:-

- 5. Geography
- English History.
 Latin.
- 8. French.
- 9. German.
- 10. Mathematics.
- 11. Elementary Science.

No candidate will be regarded as qualified who fails to obtain such an aggregate number of marks as may indicate in the judgment of the Civil Service Commissioners a competent amount

of general proficiency.

5. Open Competitive Examinations for the purpose of testing the qualifications of Candidates in the above-mentioned subjects will be held by the Civil Service Commissioners from time to time as may be necessary, and a certain number, regulated by the probable demand from the Public Departments, of those who show sufficient proficiency will be placed upon the Registers kept by the Commissioners, and will be available for employment as their services are required. The competitions for the Irish service will, as a rule, be held at the same time as the competitions for service in Great Britain, and the list of successful candidates for Ireland will be separate from that of the successful candidates for service in Great Britain. Candidates can enter for both competitions, when they are held simultaneously, paying only one fee. If successful in both they will be entered on the Register for Great Britain only, or on that for Ireland only, or on both Registers according to their choice.

6. The fee payable for attending an examina-

tion will be 5s.

7. Boy Clerks placed on these Registers will be summoned for employment in any of the Public Departments as they are wanted. When not wanted, they will have no claim to employ-ment. Refusing to serve when called upon, except for reasons satisfactory to the Civil Service Commissioners, they will be removed from the Registers. The order in which they may be employed, the Departments to which they may be assigned, and their retention generally on the Registers, will be determined by the Civil Service Commissioners; but they will be subject to the orders of the Departments in which they are serving during the time of their actual employment, and will be liable to dismissal from them by the authorities thereof, without notice, for inefficiency or misconduct.

Boy Clerks resigning, or procuring their own discharges from Departments, except for sufficient reasons proved to the satisfaction of the Civil Service Commissioners, will be removed from the

Registers.
Their assignment for service will, as a general rule, be according to their order of merit in the examination; but exceptions to this general rule may be made when the engagement offered is very short, or for other sufficient reasons.

8. Boy Clerks will usually be engaged and paid by the week of 39 hours, viz.:—7 hours a day on Mondays, Tuesdays, Wednesdays, Thursdays, and Fridays, and 4 hours on Saturdays; and they will be paid 15s. per week during the first year of their service. After a year of approved service, an increase of pay to 16s. a week may be allowed.

In any case of absence without pay a Boy Clerk's increment shall be postponed one day for every day of such absence absence without pay equally with the interval between two successive engagements not being reckoned as service for any purpose contemplated by the

Regulations.

Boy Clerks may also be engaged and paid by the hour at the rate of $4\frac{1}{4}d$. per hour during their first year of service; and at the rate of 5d. per hour thereafter. Any who may be engaged by the week and who may be required to attend for more than $7\frac{1}{2}$ hours on Monday, Tuesday, Wednesday, Thursday, or Friday, or more than $4\frac{1}{2}$ hours on Saturday, will be paid at the hourly rate for such overtime attendance. But in no case must overtime attendance exceed 6 hours in any one week. They may also be paid by the piece at such rates as may be fixed by the Civil Service Commissioners, with the approval of the Lords Commissioners of the Treasury.

9. No service in the capacity of Boy Clerk will confer any claim to superannuation or compensation allowance; and Boy Clerks will not be retained, as such, after they shall have reached the age of 18*; subject to the following provisos:

Boy Cierks, who entered the service by competitions earlier than May, 1906, will remain registered as hereto-fore on a single Register for Great Britain and Ireland.

^{*} Boy Clerks who have entered or may enter the service on the results of the competition of September 22, 1908, or any previous competition, may be, as htherto, retained on the Register up to the age of twenty.

(1) Boy Clerks who have had no opportunity of entering a Competition for Assistant Clerkships after reaching the age of 171, may be retained until the next Competition takes place and the result is announced. (2) Boy Clerks who reach the age of 18 after entering a Competition for Assistant Clerkships may be retained until the result is announced. (3) A Boy Clerk who has been declared successful in a Competition for Assistant Clerkships may be retained as a Boy Clerk until he is assigned to a vacant post as Assistant Clerk, unless he be rejected by the Civil Service Commissioners as not duly qualified in respect of age, health, or character for the

permanent situation.

10. If a public holiday, on which the office is closed, fall within the period of a Boy Clerk's engagement, he may be paid in respect of it as for a working day. Boy Clerks may, with the consent of the Department in which they are serving, or if not at the time serving, with the consent of the Civil Service Commissioners, be allowed holidays, with pay at the rate for the official day in the proportion of one day for every 24 full days of actual and approved service previously rendered by them as Boy Clerks. But no Boy Clerk shall be allowed to take more than 12 days' leave under these conditions, between the 1st day of January and the 31st day of December, both days inclusive, in any one year, and in calculating the leave to be allowed in any given year, no service rendered before the 1st day of January of the preceding year shall be counted.

Holiday pay can only be allowed for holidays

actually taken, not for days on which the Boy Clerk is drawing pay in respect of employment

in any capacity in the Public Service.
11. Boy Clerks who may fall ill serving in any Department, and whose illness may be attested by inedical certificate to the satisfaction of the authorities of such Department, may be allowed sick-leave, receiving threefourths of the rate of pay for the official day; provided that no Boy Clerk shall be paid for holidays and sick-leave, taken together, for more than 28 days within any one year, exclusive of public holidays.

12. Except in conformity with Regulations 10, 11, 14, and 15, Boy Clerks will only receive

pay for the hours, or parts of hours, during which they actually attend.

13. No person who has been trained, either wholly or partially, at the public expense, for the occupation of a teacher in schools in connexion with the Board of Education in England, the Committee of Council on Education for Scotland, or the Commissioners of National Education, Ireland, is eligible for employment as a Boy Clerk, until the consent of those Departments, given in conformity with rules sanctioned by the Lords of the Treasury, has been

notified to the Civil Service Commissioners.

14. If any case of infectious disease should occur in the house where a Boy Clerk is living, he must immediately report the fact to the Officer under whom he is employed, and must, if required, at once discontinue his attendance. cases of such enforced absence from his employment, it is in the discretion of the Head of the Department in which he has been serving to allow the Boy Clerk full pay at the usual rate for the period for which it is medically certified that his attendance at the office would be likely to be dangerous to his colleagues.

15. In any year in which an open Competition for situations as Assistant Clerk (Abstractor Class) in the Civil Service or for Clerkships of the Second Division is held, a Boy Clerk who obtains from the Head of the Department in which he is serving leave of absence to attend such Examination may also, at the discretion of the Head of the Department, be allowed pay, at the usual rate, for the days during which he is attending the Examination.

16. Service Marks for each full period of three calendar months of actual approved service in the capacity of Boy Clerk, subject to a maximum of eight sucli periods,* will be allowed to Candidates attending Examinations for the following

situations, viz.

Clerkships in the Second Division of the

Civil Service,

Second Class Clerkships (Lower Section) for Port Service in the Department of His Majesty's Customs,

Assistantships of Customs and Excise who are serving or have served as Boy Clerks; but the number of marks to be allowed for each period may be different at successive examinations.

17. In the promotions of permanent Civil Servants [Assistant Clerks (Abstractor Class) and others] under Clause 15 of the Order in Council of 29th November, 1898, not less than one and not more than two years' approved service as Boy Clerk or Boy Copyist may be allowed to reckou towards the six years' established service required by the said clause.

The Civil Service Commissioners further give notice that an Open Competitive Examination of Candidates for registration as Temporary Boy Clerks will be held, under the foregoing Regulations, in London, Edinburgh, Dublin, Birmingham, Bristol, Leeds, Liverpool, Newcastle-oh-Tyne, Southampton, Aberdeen, Glasgow. The number to be registered will depend partly on the requirements of the service, and partly on the number of Candidates who may show sufficient proficiency; but it is not likely to be less than 100, if so many shall be found competent: that is to say, 90 for service in London, Edinburgh, and provincial towns in England, Scotland, and Waies, and 10 for service in Dublin and provincial towns of Ireland exclusively.

1. Competitive Examinations of Candidates for situations in the different public Departments will be held at such times and at such places as may be deemed expedient. Before every such

examination Special Regulations will be issued, in which the particular conditions of the competition will be specified.

- 2. (d) Members of the Royal Irish Constabulary, of more than five years' service.

(e) Probationary Engineer Cadets in the Navy, and Apprentices in His Majesty's Dockyards.

(f) Persons who have been trained in Training Colleges at the public expense.

(g) Persons who have been trained in the Inland Revenue Branch of the Government Laboratory.

No person actually serving in the Army will be eligible unless he produces to the Civil Service Commissioners, when called upon to do so, the permission of his Commanding Officer to attend the examination, dated before the commencement of the competition and given in accordance with such orders as may from time to time be issued by or under the authority of the Army Council.

The Board of Agriculture and Fisheries, by virtue and in exercise of the powers vested in them under the Diseases of Animals Acts, 1894 to 1903, and of every other power enabling them in this behalf, do order, and it is hereby ordered, as follows:

Premises to which this Order applies.

- 1.—(1.) This Order shall apply to the premises described in the Schedule hereto, and also to any other premises in the city of Leeds, to which the Order may be applied by a Notice to that effect signed by an Inspector of the Board or of the Local Authority of the said city and served upon the occupier of the premises described in such Notice.
- (2.) This Order shall cease to apply to any premises upon service on the occupier thereof of a Notice to that effect signed by an Inspector of the Board or of the said Loca! Authority.
- (3.) A copy of every Notice served under this Article shall forthwith be sent to the Board by the Inspector signing the same.

Restriction on Movement of Swine from or to Premises to which this Order applies.

2. Swine shall not, except as expressly authorised by this Order, be moved from or to any premises to which this Order applies.

Movement of Swine for Immediate Slaughter.

- 8.—(1.) Swine (not being in a Swine-Fever Infected Place and their movement not being prohibited by Notice of an Inspector of the Local Authority or of the Board given under any Order of the Board) may be moved from any premises to which this Order applies in a float, cart or van to a slaughter-house situate in the city of Leeds, for the purpose of immediate slaughter if accompanied by a licence in the Form D set forth in the First Schedule to the Swine Fever (Regulation of Movement) Order of 1908 authorising such movement, granted by an Inspector of the Local Authority of that city, which licence shall be in force for not more than six days inclusive of the day of issue.
- (2.) Before a licence is granted by an Inspector under this Article the owner of the swine, or his agent authorised in writing for this purpose, shall sign, and deliver or send by post to the Inspector, a declaration in the Form E set forth in the First Schedule to the Swine-Fever (Regulation of Movement) Order of 1908, which shall be retained by the Inspector.
- (3.) The swine shall, before the movement is commenced, be marked by and at the expense of the owner by the painting with an indelible composition of red colour of a broad line down the back and another broad line across the loins of each of the swine thus +, each line being not less than nine inches long.

(4.) The swine moved under this Article shall be moved by the nearest available route and

without unnecessary delay, and shall, after their arrival at the slaughter-house, be there detained until they are slaughtered.

Cleansing and Disinfection of Vehicle used for Conveyance of Swine.

- 4.—(1.) Any float, cart or van which has been used for the conveyance of swine under the preceding Article, shall immediately after each occasion of such use be cleansed and disinfected by and at the expense of the owner of the float, cart or van as follows:
 - (i.) The floor of the float, cart or van and all other parts thereof with which the swine, or their droppings, have come in contact shall be scraped and swept, and the scrapings and sweepings, and all dung, sawdust, litter, and other matter shall be effectually removed therefrom; then
 - (ii.) The same parts of the float, cart or van shall be thoroughly washed or scrubbed or scoured with water; then
 - (iii.) The same parts of the float, cart or van shall be disinfected in one of the modes prescribed by the Diseases of Animals (Disinfection) Order of 1906.
- (2.) The scrapings and sweepings, and the dung, sawdust, litter, and other matter removed under this Article shall forthwith be well mixed with quicklime, and be effectually removed from contact with swine.

Movement of Swine to Premises to which this Order applies.

- 5.—(1.) Swine may be moved to any premises to which this Order applies if accompanied by a licence in the Form A set forth in the First Schedule to the Swine-Fever (Regulation of Movement) Order of 1908 authorising such movement, granted by an Inspector of the Local Authority of the city of Leeds, which licence shall be in force for not more than six days inclusive of the day of issue.
- (2.) Swine may also be moved to any premises to which this Order applies if such movement is authorised by a licence (Form A) granted under and in accordance with the Swine-Fever (Regulation of Movement) Order of 1908.
- (3.) Before a licence is granted by an Inspector under this Article, the owner of the swine, or his agent authorised in writing for this purpose, shall sign, and deliver or send by post to the Inspector, a declaration in the Form B set forth in the First Schedule to the Swine-Fever (Regulation of Movement) Order of 1908, countersigned as hereinafter provided.
- (4.) The declaration shall not be effective until it is countersigned by a police officer of the district where the swine are, who, before countersigning the declaration, shall, so far as is practicable, satisfy himself as to the correctness of the statements contained therein.
- (5.) The declaration shall be retained by the Inspector granting the licence thereon.
- (6.) The swine moved under this Article shall be moved by the nearest available route and without unnecessary delay.
- (7.) Swine while detained on premises to which this Order applies need not be kept separate from other swine.

Production of Licences; Names and Addresses.

6.—(1.) Any person in charge of a pig being moved, where under this Order a licence is

necessary, shall, on demand of a Justice, or of a constable, or of an Inspector or other officer of the Board or of a Local Authority, produce and show to him the licence, if any, necessary for the movement, and shall allow it to be read and a copy of or extract from it to be taken by the person to whom it is produced.

(2.) Any person so in charge shall, on demand as aforesaid, give his name and address to the Justice, or constable, or Inspector or other officer.

Local Authority to enforce Order.

7. The provisions of this Order shall be executed and enforced by the Local Authority.

Offences.

- 8.—(1.) If a pig is moved in contravention of this Order, the owner of the pig, and the person for the time being in charge thereof, and the person causing, directing, or permitting the movement, and the person moving or conveying the pig, and the consignee or other person receiving or keeping it, knowing it to have been moved in contravention as aforesaid, and the occupier of the place from which the pig is moved, shall, each according to and in respect of his own acts and defaults, be deemed guilty of an offence against the Act of 1894.
- (2.) If a pig is not marked as required by this Order, the owner, consignee, or other person for the time being in charge thereof, shall, each according to and in respect of his own acts and defaults, be deemed guilty of an offence against the Act of 1894.
- (3.) If anything is done or omitted to be done in contravention of this Order in respect of the cleansing and disinfection of any float, cart or van used for the conveyance of swine, the owner, or other person for the time being in charge of the float, cart or van shall, each according to and in respect of his own acts and defaults, be deemed guilty of an offence against the Act of 1894.
- (4.) If any person, with a view unlawfully to evade or defeat the operation of this Order, by washing, or in any other manner, takes out, effaces, or obliterates, or attempts to take out, efface, or obliterate, any mark painted on any pig as required by this Order, the person doing the same, and the person causing, directing, or permitting the same to be done, and the owner of the pig, and the person for the time being in charge thereof, shall, each according to and in respect of his own acts and defaults, be deemed guilty of an offence against the Act of 1894.
- (5.) If a person in charge of a pig being moved, where under this Order a licence is necessary, on demand made under this Order, fails to give his true name and address, or gives a false name or address, he shall be deemed guilty of an offence against the Act of 1894.



ORDER OF THE REGISTRAR-GENERAL IN ENGLAND.

(Dated 7th December, 1908.)

Whereas by the 21st section of the Births and Deaths Registration Act, 1874, it is enacted that the Registrar-General, with the sanction of the Local Government Board, may from time to time alter Registration Sub-Districts:—

1. And whereas it is expedient with a view to the ultimate assimilation of the Sub-districts of Nantwich Registration District to the Relief Districts of the Poor Law Union of the same name, that Minshull Church Civil Parish should be transferred from Bunbury Sub-district of that Registration District to Nantwich Sub-district of the same Registration District.

- 2. Now, therefore, I, Sir William Cospatrick Dunbar, Bart., C.B., Registrar-General of Births, Deaths, and Marriages in England, in exercise of the powers given me by the above mentioned Act, and with the sanction of the Local Government Board, do hereby order and declare that the foregoing alteration shall take effect accordingly.
- 3. This Order shall come into operation on 1st day of January, nineteen hundred and nine.
