ORDER of the Local Government Board; Motor Car Act, 1903; Regulations under Section 9 (1).

COUNTY OF MIDDLESEX.

PARISH OF SHEPPERTON.

To the County Council of Middlesex;— And to all others whom it may concern.

Whereas by sub-section (1) of section 9 of the Motor Car Act, 1908 (hereinafter referred to as "the Act"), it is enacted that, within any limits or place referred to in Regulations made by Us, the Local Government Board, with a view to the safety of the public on the application of the local authority of the area in which the limits or place are situate, a person shall not drive a motor car at a speed exceeding ten miles per hour:

And whereas the County Council of Middlesex, having made application to Us to make a Regulation in pursuance of the said sub-section putting the above-mentioned provisions of that sub-section in force within the limits comprising part of a certain road in the parish of Shepperton, in the county of Middlesex, We directed a Local Inquiry to be held into the matter by one of Our Inspectors, and the Inquiry was held accordingly, and Report has been made to Us thereon:

Now therefore, in pursuance of the powers given to Us in that behalf, We do, by this Our Order, make the following Regulations:—

ARTICLE I.—The provisions of sub-section (1) of section 9 of the Act with respect to the driving of a motor car at a speed not exceeding ten miles per hour shall apply and have effect within the limits comprising so much of the road through the parish of Shepperton as extends from Halliford Green to its junction with Ferry-lane.

ARTICLE II.—These Regulations shall come into operation on the first day of January, one thousand nine hundred and nine.
