Rome, Novemb. 1.

**T**HE Count de Rabucac, Envoy from France, had Audience of the Pope on Monday last, and the Cardinal d'Esiree, who has Instructions to assist him in his Negotiation here, two days after; They both gave him fresh Assurances of an entire Satisfaction in the Differences between the two Courts; and that the French King will by an Authentick Act cause all that was done in the Assembly of 1682, against the Authority of the See of Rome, to be Revoked; with which the Pope seems to be satisfied: They likewise renewed their Instances to engage him into a League, for preserving as they pretend, the Peace of Italy; but with the same success they had formerly, the Pope declaring that he looks upon the Measures they propose as tending more to disturb than preserve the quiet thereof. The Popes Gallies, who served this Summer in the Levant, are returned to Civita Vecchia in an ill Condition, having a great many sick Men on Board.

Milan, Novemb. 5. The Spanish Forces, who have made this Campagne in Piedmont and Dauphine, are returned to Navarre, where a Review is to be taken of them this day and to morrow in the presence of the Marquis de Leganex our Governor, and that being over they will march to their Winter-Quarters. There is no more talk of Count Caraffa's coming hither this Winter to settle the Quarters for the Germans, but the Count de Breizer, who has served this Summer as Commissary General, is appointed to take care of this matter; And we hear that he has already given notice to the Dukes of Mantua, Modena, and Parma, that they are to furnish the same Winter-Quarters they did the last year. The Deputies from the Swiss Cantons are gone home, with Satisfaction in the Business they came about, which was, to get the Prohibition to supply them with Corn taken off; and besides, they are promised a punctual Payment of their Annual Pensions, upon Condition they do not permit the French to make any Levies within their Territories. The Marquis de Pianezza continues to block up Casall. The Princess of Parma is lately brought to Bed of a Son, which has occasioned great Rejoycing at that Court.

Venice, Novemb. 7. On the first instant arrived here a Vessel from Cyprus, bringing Letters from Standardome of the 26th of July, which advise, That the Sickness was ceased at Aleppo; and that the Foreign Merchants, who by reason thereof had retired into the Country, were ready to return

thither: This Vessel touched at Zant; from whence they write of the 4th past, That the Captain General, since his return with the Fleet to Napoli di Romania, having received advice, that 10000 Turks had appeared near Lepanto, with a design as 'twas believed to attack that place, had sent thither four Gallies with a Reinforcement of Men, and a supply of Ammunition and Provisions: And that upon the News of their having received this Succor, the Turks retired without attempting any thing. The Senate give out Commissions daily for new Levies which are to be raised against the Spring. The Captain General Mocenigo is made Governor of Venetia, but no Body is yet appointed to succeed him in the command of the Army.

Madrid, Octob. 30. The King and Queen of Spain went on the 10th instant to the Escorial, where they will stay till the beginning of the next month. Our Fleet has Orders to Winter at Naples, and to be at Sea again early in the Spring. Don Pedro de Nunez Conde d'Arnedo is made President of the Revenues, his Predecessor being removed to be a Member of the Council of Castile. The Countess of Mansfeldt died here on the 23d of this month.

Lemberg in Poland, Octob. 30. The Forces of this Crown are now separated and gone into Quarters; 4000 men are entred into the New Fort at Larowitz between the two Rivers, about a League and half below Caminie; who are posted there to streighten that Garrison, and prevent their Excursions during the Winter. The Tartars in the mean time continue their Ravages on our Frontiers; but they have of late appeared only in small Parties, one of which had the boldness the last week to advance within 3 or 4 Leagues of Pamarzan, where the Court now is. The Turks and Moldavians have at last quitted the Siege of Scroocke on the Niefer; They set down before the place the 27th of September, their strength consisting of 4 or 5000 Turks, Commanded by a Bassa, 1500 Moldavians under their Hospodar, 500 Cossacks, and 3000 Tartars, with 20 pieces of Cannon; The next day they sent a Summons to the Governor to Surrender the Place, with an Offer of very Honorable Conditions, which being rejected by him, the Enemy began to attack the Town with their Cannon and Mortars; and afterwards made several Assaults, in some of which they were repulsd with great loss; and in others they succeeded so far that they made themselves Masters of the Old and New Town, the Garrison retiring into the Castle and the New Fort built by the present Governor, which the Enemy likewise Stormed, but were beaten off after an Attack of 4 hours: The Besieged pursued their advantage, and made several Sallies upon them with such Success
