#### MOTOR CAR ACT, 1903.

County of East Sussex.

Whereas by sub-section 1 of section 9 of the Motor Car Act, 1903, it is enacted that within any limits or place referred to in regulations made by the Local Government Board with a view to the safety of the public, on the application of the local authority of the area in which the limits or place are situate, a person shall not drive a motor car at a speed exceeding ten miles per hour:

The Board of Trade have received, through the Secretary of State for Foreign Affairs, a translation of a notice dated December 19th, issued by the Madrid Sanitary Authorities, stating that cases of plague in the Island of Mauritius have been on the increase, 43, of which 31 proved fatal, having occurred between August 4th and October 16th, 1908.

As ships take considerably more than 10 days to reach Spain from Mauritius, clean arrivals will not be affected by the Quarantine Regulations in force.

The Board of Trade have received, through the Secretary of State for Foreign Affairs; a copy of a Despatch, dated December 15th; from His Majesty's Representative at Constantinople; stating that there has been a further diminution in the cholera outbreak in Russia, and that the measures in force against Russian ports of the Black Sea have consequently been modified in the following manner.

Ordinary arrivals from those ports—Kherson and Taganrog excepted—are now subject only to
