[The following Order in Council was published in the Swaziland Official Gazette on 12th February, 1909.]

At the Court at Buckingham Palace, the 21st day of December, 1908.

PRESENT,

The KING's Most Excellent Majesty.

Archbishop of Canterbury. Lord President. Lord Chamberlain. Lord Fitzmaurice.

WHEREAS by treaty, grant, usage, sufferance, or other lawful means His Majesty the King has power, jurisdiction, and authority within the territory known as Swaziland:

And whereas it is intended that certain portions of land in the said territory shall be set apart and demarcated for the exclusive use and occupation of natives of the territory, and that the remaining portions of land in the said territory shall be granted or leased to European persons claiming rights thereto under and by virtue of concessions or grants made by the paramount chiefs of Swaziland or shall be held by His Majesty's High Commissioner for South Africa:

And whereas it is expedient that such remaining portions be vested as Crown Land in the said High Commissioner on behalf of His Majesty:

And whereas it is also expedient that all mineral rights in respect of any land in Swaziland which have not been lawfully disposed of by any such concession or grant as aforesaid be likewise vested as Crown Mineral Rights in the said High Commissioner on behalf of His Majesty:

Now, therefore, His Majesty, by virtue of the powers by "The Foreign Jurisdiction Act, 1890," or otherwise in His Majesty vested, is

pleased, by and with the advice of His Privy Council, to order, and it is hereby ordered, as follows:—

I. For the purposes of this Order (1) The expression "Crown Lands" shall mean (a) any land in the said territory not being laud set apart and demarcated by or on the authority of His Majesty's High Commissioner for South Africa for the sole and exclusive occupation of natives of the said territory which may be proclaimed by the High Commissioner as Crown Lands; (b) any land within the said territory which has been or may hereafter be lawfully transferred to or expropriated by the High Commissioner in exercise of the powers in him vested by proclamation or otherwise for the peace, order, and good government of the said territory. (2) The expression "Crown Mineral Rights" shall mean any right to precious or base metals, precious stones, minerals, or mineral products in respect of any land in Swaziland (a) which has not been disposed of by any concession or grant made by a paramount chief of Swaziland and confirmed by the Chief Court constituted under section four of the Swaziland (Organic) Proclamation, 1890; or (b) which has been or may hereafter be lawfully transferred to or expropriated by the High Commissioner in exercise of such powers as aforesaid.

II. All the rights of His Majesty in or in relation to any Crown Lands and all Crown Mineral Rights shall vest in and may be exercised by His Majesty's High Commissioner for South Africa for the time being on behalf of His Majesty.

III. The High Commissioner may make such grants or leases of Crown Lands or of Crown Mineral Rights according to any law in force in the said territory relating to the disposal of

Crown Lands or of Crown Mineral Rights on such terms and conditions as he may think fit subject to any directions received from one of His Majesty's Principal Secretaries of State.

IV. This Order shall be published in the Gazette of the High Commissioner for South Africa and shall thereupon commence and come into operation and the High Commissioner shall give directions for the publication of this Order at such places and in such a manner and for such time or times as he thinks proper for giving due publicity thereto within Swaziland.

V. His Majesty may at any time add to, alter,

or amend this Order.

VI. The Swaziland Crown Lands Order in Council, 1907, shall continue in force until the commencement of this Order, and shall thereupon be revoked without prejudice to anything lawfully done thereunder.

VII. This Order may be cited for all purposes as the Swaziland Crown Lands and Minerals

WHEREAS the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England have, in pursuance of the Act of the thirty-third and thirty-fourth years of Her late Majesty Queen Victoria, chapter thirty-nine, and of the Acts therein mentioned, that is to say, the Act of the third and fourth years of Her said late Majesty, chapter one hundred and thirteen, the Act of the fourth and fifth years of Her said late Majesty, chapter thirty-nine, and the Act of the thirty-first and thirty-second years of Her said late Majesty, chapter one hundred and fourteen, duly prepared and laid before His Majesty in Council a scheme bearing date the nineteenth day of November, in the year one thousand nine hundred and eight, in the words following, that is to say:—

"We, the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, in pursuance of the Act of the thirty-third and thirty-fourth years of Her late Majesty Queen Victoria, chapter thirty-nine, and of the Acts therein mentioned, that is to say, the Act of the third and fourth years of Her said late Majesty, chapter one hundred and thirteen, the Act of the fourth and fifth years of Her said late Majesty, chapter thirty-nine, and the Act of the thirty-first and thirty-second years of Her said late Majesty, chapter one hundred and fourteen, have prepared and now humbly lay before Your Majesty in Council the following scheme for effecting a transfer of the ownership of a part or share of the advowson or perpetual right of patronage of and presentation to the church and cure (hereinafter called 'the said benefice') of East Haddon, in the county of Northampton and in the diocese of Peterborough.

"Whereas two one-third parts or shares of and in the advowson or perpetual right of patronage of and presentation to the said benefice of East Haddon, that is to say, every turn or right of nomination or presentation to the said benefice which shall occur or arise on a vacancy of the said benefice happening after the date hereof for ever (with the exception of the next such turn or right of nomination or presentation and of every third succeeding turn or

right of nomination or presentation thereafter) are vested for an estate in fee simple without incumbrances in the Right Reverend William Edmund, Bishop of Lebombo, Cyril Randolph Smyth, of Santa Monica, California, Ethel Mary Julia Smyth, of Firwood, Chalford, near Stroud, in the county of Gloucester, Spinster, and Edith Loura Smyth, also of Firwood, Chalford aforesaid, Spinster, as tenants in common.

"And whereas the said William Edmund, Bishop of Lebombo, Cyril Randolph Smyth, Ethel Mary Julia Smyth, and Edith Loura Smyth, are desirous that the two one-third parts or shares of and in the advowson or perpetual right of patronage of and presentation to the said benefice of East Haddon now vested in them as aforesaid, should be transferred to and be vested in the Bishop for the time being of

the said diocese of Peterborough.

"And whereas the Right Reverend Edward Carr, now Bishop of Peterborough, is willing to accept such transfer, and in token of such his willingness and also in token that the same transfer has that consent of the Bishop of the diocese which by the Acts in the hereinbefore mentioned Act recited or by some or one of them is made necessary he, the said Edward Carr, Bishop of Peterborough, has executed this scheme as hereinafter mentioned.

"And whereas the transfer of the patronage of the said benefice of East Haddon which is hereinbefore mentioned and hereinafter recommended and proposed will in our opinion tend to make better provision for the cure of souls in the parish or district in or in respect of which the right of patronage or advowson so recommended and proposed to be transferred as aforesaid arises or exists, that is to say, in the

parish of East Haddon.

"Now therefore with the consent of the said William Edmund, Bishop of Lebombo, Cyril Randolph Smyth, Ethel Mary Julia Smyth, and Edith Loura Smyth (in testimony whereof they have respectively signed and sealed this scheme), and with the consent of the said Edward Carr, Bishop of Peterborough (in testimony whereof he has signed this scheme and sealed the same with his episcopal seal), we, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, humbly recommend and propose that upon and from the day of the date of the publication in the London Gazette of any Order of Your Majesty in Council ratifying this scheme and without any conveyance or assurance in the law other than such duly gazetted Order the two one-third parts or shares of and in the advowson or perpetual right of patronage of and presentation to the said benefice of East Haddon, that is to say every turn or right of nomination or presentation to the said benefice which shall occur or arise on a vacancy of the said benefice happening after the date hereof for ever (with the exception of the next such turn or right of nomination or presentation and of every third succeeding turn or right of nomination or presentation thereafter) which said two one-third parts or shares of and in the said advows n or perpetual right of patronage are now vested in them the said William Edmund, Bishop of Lebombo, Cyril Randolph Smyth, Ethel Mary Julia Smyth, and Edith Loura Smyth as aforesaid, shall be transferred to the said Edward Carr, Bishop of Peterborough, and his successors in the same Bishoprick and shall thereupon and thenceforth become and be absolutely vested in and shall and may from time to time be exercised by the said Edward Carr, Bishop of Peterborough, and by his successors in the same Bishoprick for ever.

"And we further recommend and propose that nothing herein contained shall prevent us from

recommending and proposing any further or other measures relating to the matters aforesaid or any of them in accordance with the provisions of the said Acts or of any of them or of any other Act of Parliament."

And whereas the said scheme has been approved by His Majesty in Council: now therefore, His Majesty, by and with the advice of His said Council, is pleased hereby to ratify the said scheme, and to order and direct that the same and every part thereof shall be effectual in law immediately from and after the time when this Order shall have been duly published in the London Gazette pursuant to the said Acts: and His Majesty, by and with the like advice, is pleased hereby to direct that this Order be forthwith registered by the Registrar of the said diocese of Peterborough.

The KING's Most Excellent Majesty in Council. HEREAS by the Burial Act, 1853, as amended by the Burial Act, 1900, it was enacted that, in case it appeared to His Majesty in Council, upon the representation of the Local Government Board, that, for the protection of the public health, the opening of any new burial-ground in any city or town, or within any other limits, save with the previous approval of the Local Government Board, should be prohibited, or that burials in any city or town, or within any other limits, or in any burial-grounds or places of burial, should be wholly discontinued, or should be discontinued subject to any exception or qualification, it should be lawful for His Majesty, by and with the advice of His Privy Council, to order that no new burial-ground should be opened in any city or town, or within such limits, without such previous approval, or (as the case might require) that, after a time mentioned in the Order, burials in such city or town, or within such limits, or in such burial-grounds or places of burial, should be discontinued wholly, or subject to any exceptions or qualifications mentioned in such Order, and so from time to time as circumstances might require; provided always that notice of such representation, and of the time when it should please His Majesty to order that the same be taken into consideration by the Privy Council, should be published in the London Gazette, and should be affixed on the doors of the churches or chapels of, or on some other conspicuous places within, the parishes affected by such representation, one month before such representation was so considered; provided also that no such representation should be made in

relation to the burial-ground of any parish until ten days' previous notice of the intention to make such representation should have been given to the Incumbent and vestry clerk or

churchwardens of such parish:

And whereas the Local Government Board, after giving to the Incumbent and the church-wardens of the parish of Saint Thomas, Colnbrook, in the county of Buckingham; and of the parish of Saint John the Baptist, Baston, in the Parts of Kesteven, ten days' previous notice of their intention to make such representations, made representations stating that, for the protection of the public health, no new burial-grounds should be opened in the civil parishes of Langley Marish and Baston, without the previous approval of the Local Government Board, and that burials should be discontinued in the said parishes as hereinafter directed:

And whereas His Majesty was pleased, by His Order in Council of the twenty-first day of November last, to give notice of such representations, and to order that the same should be taken into consideration by a Committee of the Lords of His Majesty's Most Honourable Privy Council, on the thirty-first day of December, one thousand nine hundred and eight, and such Order has been published in the London Gazette, and copies thereof have been affixed, as required by the said Act:

Now, therefore, His Majesty, by and with the advice of His Privy Council, is pleased to order, as it is hereby ordered, that no new burial-ground shall be opened in the said civil parishes without the previous approval of the Local Government Board, and that burials in the said parishes shall be discontinued as follows, viz.:

Langley Marish, Buckinghamshire.—Forthwith and entirely in the church of Saint Thomas, Colnbrook, in the county of Buckingham; and in the churchyard, except as

follows :-

In the said churchyard in certain grave spaces reserved and appropriated as burial places for the families of the Rev. F. P. Burnett, Dr. Southey, Mr. J. Wells, Miss Ratcliff, Mrs. Charles Pain, and Mr. S. Roberts, and in which no interment has heretofore taken place, the burial may be allowed of the body of any member of the said families, subject to the condition that no part of the coffin containing the body shall be at a depth less than three feet below the level of the surface of the ground adjoining the

Baston.—Forthwith and entirely in the parish church of Saint John the Baptist, Baston, in the Parts of Kesteven; and in the church-

yard, except as follows, viz. :

(a.) In any vault or walled grave now existing in the said churchyard burial may he allowed subject to the condition that every coffin buried in such vault or grave be separately enclosed by stonework or brick-

work properly cemented:

(b.) In the said churchyard, in any grave space in which no interment has taken place within the period of fourteen years prior to the date of this Order, the burial may be allowed of the bodies of Sarah Exton, Annie Rawley Arden, Alfred George Little, Catherine Whattoff, and Mary Marriott; subject to the condition that no part of the coffin containing the body shall in any case be at a depth less than three feet below the level of the surface of the ground adjoining the grave.

WILD BIRD (ENGLAND).

The Wild Birds Protection (Administrative County of East Sussex) Order, 1909.

Dated 17th February, 1909.

In pursuance of the powers conferred on me by the Wild Birds Protection Acts, 1880 to 1908, and upon application by the County Council of the Administrative County of East Sussex, I hereby make the following Order:—

Title.

I. This Order may be cited as the Wild Birds Protection (Administrative County of East Sussex) Order, 1909.

BIRDS.

Close Time Extended.

II. The time during which the killing or taking of Wild Birds is prohibited by the Act of 1880

shall be extended so as to be between the last day of February and the 1st day of September in any year, except with respect to the following birds:—

Curlew, Godwit, Wild Goose, Lapwing, Plover, Redshank and other Sand Pipers, Snipe, Wild Swan, Mallard, Teal and other Wild Duck, Whimbrel, Widgeon, Woodcock.

Additions to the Schedule of the Act of 1880.

III. The Wild Birds Protection Act, 1880, shall apply within the Administrative County of East Sussex to the following species of Wild Birds in the same manner as if those species were included in the schedule to the Act:—

Black-headed Bunting, Cirl Bunting, Corn Bunting, Reed Bunting, Snow Bunting, Yellow Bunting (Yellow Hammer), Bustard, Buzzard, Honey Buzzard, Chiffchaff, Corn Crake (Land Rail), Peregrine Falcon, Flycatcher (both species), Heron, Hobby, Kestrel, Martin (both species), Merlin, Nuthatch, Osprey, Kentish Plover, Raven, Redstart, Redbacked Shrike, Tree Sparrow, Stonechat, Swallow, Swift, Bearded Tit, Blue Tit, Coal Tit, Crested Tit, Great Tit, Long-tailed Tit, Marsh Tit, Wagtail (all species), Blackcap Warbler, Dartford Warbler, Garden Warbler, Grasshopper Warbler, Reed Warbler, Sedge Warbler, Willow Warbler, Wood Warbler, Wheatear, Whinchat, Whitethroat, Lesser Whitethroat, Fire-crested Wren, Golden-crested Wren, Wryneck.

IV. The Wild Birds Protection Act, 1880, shall

IV. The Wild Birds Protection Act, 1880, shall apply within the undermentioned area in the Administrative County of East Sussex to the Linnet (Brown and Green) in the same manner as if those species were included in the schedule to the Act.

The area referred to is bounded on the north by a line beginning on the sea coast at the boundary between the County Borough of Hastings and the Borough of Bexhill, proceeding along such boundary to its junction with the main road from Hastings to Bexhill, thence along the northern side of such main road, through Bexhill, Ninfield, Horsebridge, and Laughton, to the boundary of the Borough of Lewes, thence along the northern boundary of that Borough to its junction with the main road leading from Lewes to Offham, thence along the northern side of such main road through Ditchelling and Hurstpierpoint to the County boundary between Albourne and Woodmancote and is outlined in blue on a map deposited with the Clerk of the County Council, sealed with the Home Office seal, and dated the 12th February, 1909.

Certain Birds protected during the whole of the Year.

V. During the period between the 31st day of August in any year and the 1st day of March following, the killing or taking of any of the following species of Wild Birds is prohibited throughout the Administrative County of East Sussex:—

Avocet, Chough, Crossbill, Stone Curlew (Great Plover, Thick-knee), Common Bittern, Little Bittern, Buzzard, Honey Buzzard, Pied Flycatcher, Goldfinch, Great Crested Grebe, Heron, Hoopoe, Kingfisher, Common Kite, Wood Lark, Nightjar (Goat Sucker), Oriole, Osprey, White Owl, Raven, Redpole, Siskin, Tree Sparrow, Sponbill, Bearded Tit, Dartford Warbler, Wheatear, Green Woodpecker, Great Spotted Woodpecker, Lesser Spotted Woodpecker.

All Birds protected on Sundays except within a certain Area.

VI. During that period of the year to which the protection afforded by the Wild Birds Protection

Act of 1880, as extended, so far as certain birds are concerned, by Clause II of this Order, does not apply, the killing or taking of Wild Birds on Sundays is prohibited within the Administrative County of East Sussex, except in so much of the Poor Law Union of Cuckfield as is comprised in the parishes of Bolney and Twineham, which area is outlined in red on the map referred to in Clause IV of this Order.

Eggs.

All Eggs protected in certain Areas.

VII. The taking or destroying of the Eggs of any species of Wild Birds is prohibited within the undermentioned areas for a period of five

years from the date of this Order :--

(a.) An area bounded on the west by a line drawn due south from the eastern extremity of the sea wall at Seaford, on the east by a line drawn due south from the eastern extremity of the Coastguard Station at Meads, in the borough of Eastbourne, on the north by the front edge of the sea cliffs extending between those limits, and on the south by the sea.

(b.) An area bounded on the west by a line drawn due south from the western boundary of the parish of Rottingdean, on the east by a line drawn due south from the eastern extremity of the sea cliffs in the Urban District of Newhaven, on the north by the front edge of the sea cliffs extending between those limits, and on the south

by the sea.

Certain Eggs protected throughout the County.

VIII. The taking or destroying of the Eggs of the following species of Wild Birds is prohibited throughout the Administrative County of East Sussex:—

Avocet, Common Bittern, Buzzard, Honey Buzzard, Crossbill, Stone Curlew (Great Plover, Thick-knee), Goldfinch, Great Crested Grebe, Heron, Hobby, Hoopoe, Kestrel, Kingfisher, Common Kite, Wood Lark, Nightingale, Nightjar (Goat Sucker), Oriole, Owl (all species), Kentish Plover, Red-backed Shrike, Spoonbill, Bearded Tit, Dartford Warbler, Wheatear, Green Woodpecker, Great Spotted Woodpecker, Lesser Spotted Woodpecker, Golden-crested Wren, Wryneck.

Repeal of former Order.

IX. The Order of the 15th day of February, 1905, is hereby repealed.

The Wild Birds Protection (Administrative County of Oxford) Order, 1909.

In pursuance of the powers conferred on me by the Wild Birds Protection Acts, 1880 to 1908, and upon application by the County Council of the Administrative County of Oxford, I hereby make the following Order:—

Title.

I. This Order may be cited as the Wild Birds Protection (Administrative County of Oxford) Order, 1909.

BIRDS.

The Owl protected during the whole of the Year.

II. During the period between the 31st day of July in any year and the 2nd day of March following, the killing or taking of the Owl (all species) is prohibited throughout the Administrative County of Oxford.

III. The taking or destroying of the Eggs of the Owl (all species) is prohibited throughout the Administrative County of Oxford.

ARTICLE I.—The provisions of sub-section (1) of section 9 of the Act with respect to the driving of a motor car at a speed not exceeding ten miles per hour shall apply and have effect within the limits comprising the roads or parts of roads within the urban district of Barnet which are specified in the Schedule hereto.

ARTICLE II.—These Regulations shall come into operation on the twenty-second day of February, one thousand nine hundred and nine.

Power to make Regulations.

The Local Authority of any District specified in the Schedule to this Order may, in accordance with the provisions of this Order, make Regulations, with a view to the prevention of worrying of cattle (including sheep), for requiring that dogs or any class of dogs shall, during all or any of the hours between sunset and sunrise, be kept by the owners thereof under control in manner prescribed by the Regulations.
- (2.) The Regulations may apply to the whole or any part of the District, and may exempt any class of dogs either generally or under prescribed conditions.

Confirmation of Regulations.

- 2.—(1.) Regulations made under this Order shall not take effect unless and until they have been submitted to and confirmed by the Board of Agriculture and Fisheries.
- (2.) Unless the Board otherwise direct, the following provisions shall apply—
 - (i.) Notice of intention to apply for confirmation of any Regulations shall be given in one or more of the local newspapers circulating within the District in two successive issues two weeks at least before the making of the application.
 - (ii.) For two weeks at least before an application, a copy of the Regulations proposed to be confirmed shall be kept at the office of the Local Authority of the District, and be open during office hours thereat to the inspection of ratepayers of the District without fee or reward.
 - (iii.) The Clerk of the Local Authority shall on the application of any such ratepayer furnish him with a copy of the proposed Regulations on payment of sixpence.
- (3.) A copy of any Regulations made by a Local Authority under this Order, signed and certified by the Clerk of that Local Authority to be a true copy and to have been duly confirmed, shall be evidence, until the contrary is proved, in all legal proceedings, of the due making, confirmation, and existence of the Regulations, without further or other proof.

Seizure of Dogs where Regulations are Contravened.

3. Any dog in respect of which an offence is being committed against a Regulation made under this Order may be seized and treated as a stray dog under the powers conferred by section three of the Dogs Act, 1906.

Extension of Definition in Diseases of Animals Act, 1894.

4. Dogs shall be animals for the purposes of the following sections of the Diseases of Animals Act, 1894 (namely):—

Section forty-three (powers of police); Section forty-four (powers of inspectors);

and also for the purposes of all other sections of the said Act containing provisions relative to or consequent on the provisions of those sections and this Order, including such sections as relate to offences and legal proceedings.

Local Authority to enforce Order.

5. The provisions of this Order shall be executed and enforced by the Local Authority.
