district of Faversham; and (2) that where a section to which reference is made in the first column of the schedule to this Order is a section comprised in Part IV or Part V or in one of the sections by sub-section (1) of this article described as comprised in Part III and declared to be in force, the section shall be in force in the district subject to the following conditions and adaptations, that is to say:

Unless and until the Local Government Board, by a further Order, made on such application and after compliance with such requirements as are described and set forth in section 3 of the Act of 1907, otherwise declare, specify and direct the said section in its application to the district and in relation to the exercise of the powers and to the discharge of the duties of the Local Authority under that section shall have effect as if the words and figures set forth in the second column of the said schedule opposite to the reference to that section in the first column of that schedule were added to and formed part of the section.

Part III.

Section thirty-five. "This section, so far as it relates to the deposit of material, shall have effect subject to the first proviso to section ninety-one of the Public Health Act, 1875. "The power of making or enforcing bye-laws under section twenty-three of the Municipal Corporations Act, 1882, for the prevention and suppression of nuisances shall not be exercisable in relation to any subject-matter of this section."

Section thirtyeight.

"Nothing in this section shall prejudicially affect any power or right exercisable by or attaching to an owner or occupier of premises by virtue of section twenty-two of the Public Health Act, 1875, or of section eighteen of the Public Health Acts Amendment Act, 1890."

PART IV. Section fifty-nine.

"(6) Nothing in this section shall apply to a public or circulating library which is not within the district."

Halifax Approach—Experimental Fog-Signal Buoys.

Subject.—Three buoys fitted with fog-signals worked by an explosive, will shortly be placed for experiment in the approach to Halifax Harbour, as undermentioned.

(a) Position. - Near Sisters bell-buoy, eastward of Sambro Island; Sisters bell-buoy, lat. 44° 26½′ N., long. 63° 31′ W.

Description of fog-signal.—Bell, giving one

stroke every twenty or thirty seconds.

(b) Position.—Near Bell Rock buoy, southward of Chebucto Head; Bell Rock buoy, lat. 44°.29' N.,

long. 63° 30¾ W., on Chart No. 2410.

Description of fog-signal.—Whistle, giving one blast every minute and three-quarters or two minutes.

(c) Position.—Near Neverfail shoal light-buoy; Light-buoy, lat. 44° 33½′ N., long. 63° 30¾′ W., on Chart No. 2410.

Description of fog-signal.—Submarine bell, giving one stroke about every thirty seconds.

Remarks.—These buoys will be placed in position without further notice. The tests are expected to occupy a period of about three months.
