By the last Letters from Dalmatia we have advice, That the Morlaques have lately made several Incursions into the Enemies Territories towardsTrelign es and Fopoca, wherethey plundered and burnt divers Villages, and took a confiderable Booty, which they brought to Caftel-News; And that the Turks to revenge this Ravage advanced with a firong Party towards Zarine, with a design to spoil and destroy the Country thereabouts, but were prevented by the Moriaques, who upon notice of their match, drew together, and attackt the Enemy fo fuccessfully that they killed the greatest part of them, and took feveral Standarts.
