Whereas by sub-section (1) of section 9 of the Motor Car Act, 1903 (hereinafter referred to as "the Act"), it is enacted that, within any limits or place referred to in Regulations made by Us, the Local Government Board, with a view to the safety of the public on the application of the local authority of the area in which the limits or place are situate, a person shall not drive a motor car at a speed exceeding ten miles per

ORDER of the Local Government Board: District Auditors Act, 1879: Assignment of Duties and District (Supplemental):—

## METROPOLITAN BOROUGHS AUDIT DISTRICT.

To Arthur Carson Roberts, Barrister-at-Law, District Auditor;—

To the Metropolitan Water Board; And to all others whom it may concern.

Whereas by section 4 of the District Auditors Act, 1879, it is enacted that the Local Government Board may from time to time assign to District Auditors their Duties, and the Districts in which such Auditors respectively are to act, and may from time to time change wholly or in part such Duties or Districts;

And whereas by an Order dated the 23rd day of March, 1901, We, the Local Government Board, certified the appointment of Arthur Carson Roberts as a District Auditor, and assigned to him the duties therein mentioned and the District in which he should act as Auditor, which District in the said Order was termed "The Metropolitan Boroughs Audit District";

And whereas by virtue of Section 19 of the Metropolis Water Act, 1902, and of the enactments thereby applied, the Accounts of the Metropolitan Water Board and of any committee appointed by them, and of their Officers, are subject to be audited by a District Auditor, and it is desirable that the duty of auditing the said Accounts be assigned to the said Arthur Carson Roberts.

Now therefore, in pursuance of the powers given to Us by the Statutes in that behalf, We hereby Order and Prescribe that it shall, until we otherwise Prescribe, be the duty of the said Arthur Carson Roberts to audit the Accounts of the Metropolitan Water Board, and of any committee appointed by them, and of their officers, in conformity with the provisions contained in Article II of the above-cited Order, and that for the purpose of the Audit of the said Accounts the area within which the powers, authorities, and jurisdiction of the said Board may be exercised shall be deemed to be within the said Metropolitan Boroughs Audit District.

be such as the Guardians may by resolution prescribe.

OTICE is hereby given, that the Lord Mayor, Aldermen, and Citizens of the city of Birmingham, acting by the Council as the Local Authority and as the Promoters under the provisions of the Tramways Act, 1870, and by virtue of the said Act and of the Birmingham Corporation Act, 1903, did, on the 2nd day of March, 1909, make the following Bye-laws and Regulations with respect to tramways within the city, namely:-

## BIRMINGHAM CORPORATION TRAM-WAYS.

BYE-LAWS AND REGULATIONS made by the Lord Mayor, Aldermen, and Citizens of the city of Birmingham, acting by the Council as the Local Authority for the said city, and as the Promoters of the tramways authorised to be constructed therein, with respect to tramways within the said city, under the powers conferred on them by the Tramways Act, 1870, and the Birmingham Corporation Act, 1903.

#### Interpretation.

1. Throughout these Bye-laws the word "Corporation" means the Lord Mayor, Aldermen, and Citizens of the city of Birmingham; the word "tramways" means the system of tramways worked by the Corporation situate within the city of Birmingham; the word "car" means any

conveyance of passengers; the word "conductor" means any officer or servant of the Corporation having charge of, or helping in the charge of, a car; and the word "driver" means any officer or servant of the Corporation driving or helping to drive the car.

## Entering and leaving cars.

2. Every person shall enter or depart from a car by the step of the hindermost or conductor's platform, and not otherwise, unless so directed by the conductor.

All persons desiring to mount a car for the purpose of travelling thereon, shall first permit all persons to alight who may be intending

to do so.

#### Smoking.

3. No person shall smoke or carry lighted pipes, cigars or cigarettes in or upon any car, except in a compartment or on seats specially set apart for the purpose.

## Playing Musical Instruments.

4. No passenger or other person shall, while riding in or upon any car, sing or play or per-form upon any musical instrument.

## Objectionable Persons.

5. Any person who is in a state of intoxication, or who from that or any other cause is in the opinion of the conductor unfit to be a passenger on a car shall not be allowed to board or enter upon any car, and may be prevented from mounting or entering any car; and if any such person be found in or upon any car he shall forthwith at the request of the conductor leave the car.

## Notice regarding Spitting.

6. No person shall spit in or upon any car.

## Offensive Language or Conduct, &c.

7. No person shall swear or use obscene or offensive language, or conduct himself offensively whilst in or upon any car, or commit any nuisance in or upon or against any car or tramway station, or premises used in connection with the tramway system, or in any way wilfully inter-fere with the comfort of any passenger. No person shall distribute advertisements or tracts of any kind, or beg or collect alms, or subscriptions, or sell any article, or play any game, or gamble, or deposit remnants of food or fruit in or upon any car, waiting rooms, premises or buildings used in connection with the tramways.

## Damaging Cars.

8. No person shall wilfully cut, tear, soil or damage the seats, cushions, curtains, or linings, or remove or deface any number plate, printed or other notice, in or on any car, or break or scratch any window of, or otherwise wilfully damage any car. Any person acting in contra-vention of this regulation shall be liable, in addition to the penalty prescribed by these Byelaws, to pay the amount of any damage so done.

## Offensive Clothing.

9. Any person whose dress or clothing will, in the opinion of the conductor or other duly authorised officer of the Corporation, soil or injure the seats, lining or cushions of the car, or the dress or clothing of any passenger, or any person who may for any other reason be offensive to passengers, shall not be allowed to enter or remain in or upon any car, and may be prevented carriage or car run upon the tramways for the from mounting or entering such car, and any such person found in or upon any car shall, on the request of the conductor or other duly authorised officer of the Corporation, leave the car upon the fare (if previously paid) being returned. Provided that on cars specially run for artisans, mechanics and daily labourers, no person shall be prevented from entering or remaining in or on a car under the provisions of this Bye-law on the ground of the condition of his dress or clothing, if such condition is solely due to the nature of his employment.

## Payment of Fares.

10. Each passenger shall upon demand, and whether the fare shall have been demanded or not, before leaving the car, pay to the conductor or other duly authorised officer of the Corporation the fare legally payable for his journey, and obtain a ticket therefor. Any person leaving a car shall be deemed to have completed his journey. Any passenger who desires to take advantage of a through fare must ask for and obtain a ticket issued in respect of such through

No child under 5 years of age, who is sitting on the lap of a passenger, shall be liable to pay a fare, provided that this provision shall apply only to one such child accompanying any one passenger; any additional child, irrespective of age, accompanying such passenger shall pay the full fare legally demandable for the distance travelled by such child.

Any passenger paying for a stage less than the whole journey run by the car, shall be deemed to have completed his journey at the end of the stage paid for; if the passenger remains on the car he shall pay the fare legally payable for the remainder of his journey as a

new passenger.

## Tickets.

11. Each passenger shall immediately upon demand show his ticket to any officer or servant of the Corporation, and shall also when required so to do, either deliver up his ticket, or in default thereof pay the fare legally demandable for the distance travelled over by such passenger.

Tickets shall not be transferable, and shall only be available for the car on which they are

#### Luggage.

12. Any person entering or mounting upon any car and having any luggage (including the tools of an artisan, mechanic, or daily labourer), shall, if so requested by the conductor, place such luggage upon either of the platforms, and shall not take or place the same in the interior or on the upper deck of the car unless permitted by the conductor so to do.

No person shall bring on to any car luggage of a size or bulk which, in the opinion of the conductor, is likely to cause inconvenience,

hindrance or annoyance to passengers.

#### Travelling on Steps, &c.

13. No person not being an officer or duly authorised servant of the Corporation, shall travel or ride on the steps, platforms, outside rails, buffers, or guards of any car, and no person not being an officer or authorised servant of the Corporation shall stand on the platforms or on the upper deck of any car, or shall sit on the outside rail, on the upper deck, or on any part of any car not intended for passengers, and any person so travelling, riding, standing or sitting, shall cease to do so immediately on

request by the conductor or other duly authorised servant of the Corporation.

14. No person, except a passenger or intending passenger, shall enter or mount any car.

## Entering Full Cars.

15. When any car contains the full number of passengers which it is licensed to carry, the conductor may place a chain across the entrance to such car, and no person shall remove such chain or enter or board any such car. Any person in a car remaining unseated after the licensed seating accommodation of the car is filled shall leave the car immediately upon the request of the conductor.

## Disabled Cars.

16. If at any time a car becomes disabled, or in any way injured or damaged, or from any cause unable to proceed, the passengers shall, upon the request of the conductor, leave the same; and if such passengers have paid their fares, shall not be entitled to demand back the amount of their fares so paid, but on production of their tickets shall be entitled to travel by the next available car the remainder of the distance in respect of which they have paid their

Interference with the Duties of the Conductor or Driver.

17. No person, other than the conductor or driver, shall change or remove the route indicators or destination boards, or interfere with the controllers, brakes, lights, ventilators, trolley cord, platform chains, or any part of a car or its equipments, or signal a car to start. Any person acting in contravention of this Regulation shall be liable to the penalty prescribed by these Byelaws and Regulations, in addition to the liability to pay the amount of any damage done.

Entering or Leaving a Car when in Motion.

18. No person shall enter, board, or leave, or attempt to enter, board, or leave any car whilst in motion.

## Dogs.

19. No person shall take a dog or other animal into or upon any car after having been requested not to do so by the conductor. Any dog or other animal taken into or on any car in breach of this Regulation shall be removed by the person in charge of such dog or other animal from the car immediately upon request by the conductor, and in default of compliance with such request may be removed by or under the direction of the conductor.

## Firearms.

20. No person shall travel in or on any car with firearms, or dangerous articles or things, provided that nothing contained in this Bye-law shall apply to persons in the Naval, Military, Territorial, Reserve, or other of His Majesty's Forces carrying unloaded firearms.

Obstructing Officers in Exercise of their Duty.

21. No passenger shall wilfully obstruct or impede any officer or servant of the Corporation in the execution of his duty upon or in connection with any car or tramway of the Corporation.

## Impeding Traffic.

22. No person shall in any way wilfully impede or interfere with the traffic on any of the tramways of the Corporation.

Persons suffering from Disease not to Travel on Cars.

23. No person afflicted with any infectious or contagious disease shall board, enter, or travel on any car, or attempt so to do, and no driver or conductor shall wilfully or knowingly suffer or permit any such person so to do.

## Power to Remove Passengers committing Offence.

24. Any person who shall commit, whilst on any car, any legal offence, or any breach of these Bye-laws, shall, in addition to being liable to a penalty, be liable to be immediately removed from the car, and if such person shall have paid his fare, shall not be entitled to demand back the amount of his fare so paid.

Conductors and Drivers to Enforce Bye-laws.

25. Every Conductor or Driver shall to the best of his ability enforce these Bye-laws and Regulations, and prevent the breach thereof.

## Penalty.

26. Any person offending against or committing a breach of any of these Bye-laws and Regulations shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding forty shillings for each offence, and in the case of a continuing offence, to a penalty not exceeding ten shillings for every day during which the offence continues.

27. There shall be placed and kept placed in a | \* This date is to be fixed by the Board of Trade.

conspicuous position inside of each car in use, a printed copy of these Bye-laws and Regulations.

28. These Bye-laws and Regulations shall come into force on the\* day of 1909.

From and after the said\* day of 1909, the Bye-laws and Regulations relating to Tramways, which were made on the 1st day of June, 1886, by the Corporation as the Local Authority with respect to tramways within the borough of Birmingham or as the Promoters the Birmingham Corporation Tramways, which Bye-laws and Regulations were respec-tively confirmed by the Board of Trade on the 5th day of August, 1886, shall be severally repealed, so far as they relate to tramways worked by the Corporation within the City of Birmingham.
