

Law Unions named in the Schedule to this Order, the District or area subject to the jurisdiction of the Council of the Borough of Maldon acting as the Port Sanitary Authority aforesaid, and the Districts or areas subject to the jurisdiction of any such Authority as is mentioned in Paragraph (5) of Article I of this Order.

ARTICLE IV.—Any Order in force assigning a District to the District Auditor for the discharge of his duties or prescribing his duties, shall, on and after the date of the operation of this Order, be rescinded, but nothing in this Order shall affect or interfere with the existing duties and powers of the District Auditor as regards any Audit of which notice has already been given or any matters or proceedings already commenced.

ARTICLE V.—In this Order—

The term "Overseers of the Poor" includes Churchwardens and Assistant Overseers.

ARTICLE VI.—This Order shall come into operation on the first day of April, one thousand nine hundred and nine, provided that, for the purpose of the giving by the District Auditor of notices of any Audit, it shall operate from the date hereof.

GENERAL ORDER of the Local Government Board: Suspension in part of Consolidated Order: Medical Officer's Fees.

PARISH OF EAST STONEHOUSE.

To the Guardians of the Poor of the Parish of East Stonehouse;—

And to all others whom it may concern.

Whereas the Poor Law Commissioners, by a General Order bearing date the eighth day of December, one thousand eight hundred and forty-seven, made certain rules and regulations relating to the administration of relief to the Poor within certain Parishes, including the Parish of East Stonehouse; and by Articles 181 and 182 of the said Order provision was made for the payment of special fees to Medical Officers in certain cases;

And whereas it is expedient to suspend, as hereinafter mentioned, the operation of the said Articles as regards the Workhouse Medical Officer and District Medical Officer of the said Parish of East Stonehouse;

Now, therefore, We, the Local Government Board, in pursuance of the powers given to Us by the Statutes in that behalf, hereby suspend the operation, until We by Order shall otherwise direct, of Articles 181 and 182 of the above cited

Order with respect to the Workhouse Medical Officer and District Medical Officer for the time being of the said Parish of East Stonehouse.

ORDER of the Local Government Board: Motor Car Act, 1903: Regulations under Section 9 (1):—

COUNTY OF MIDDLESEX.

PARISH OF GREAT STANMORE.

To the County Council of Middlesex;—

And to all others whom it may concern.

Whereas by Sub-section (1) of Section 9 of the Motor Car Act, 1903 (hereinafter referred to as "the Act"), it is enacted that, within any limits or place referred to in regulations made by Us, the Local Government Board, with a view to the safety of the public on the application of the local authority of the area in which the limits or place are situate, a person shall not drive a motor car at a speed exceeding ten miles per hour;

And whereas the County Council of Middlesex, having made application to Us to make a Regulation in pursuance of the said Sub-section putting the above-mentioned provisions of that Sub-section in force within the limits comprising certain roads or parts of roads in the Parish of Great Stanmore, in the county of Middlesex, We directed a Local Inquiry to be held into the matter by one of Our Inspectors, and the Inquiry was held accordingly, and Report has been made to Us thereon:

Now therefore, in pursuance of the powers given to Us in that behalf, We do, by this Our Order, make the following Regulations:—

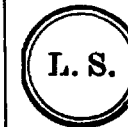
ARTICLE I.—The provisions of Sub-section (1) of Section 9 of the Act with respect to the driving of a motor car at a speed not exceeding ten miles per hour shall apply and have effect within the limits comprising the roads or parts of roads within the Parish of Great Stanmore which are specified in the Schedule hereto.

ARTICLE II.—These Regulations shall come into operation on the twelfth day of April, one thousand nine hundred and nine.

SCHEDULE.

Church-street and so much of Stanmore Hill as extends from its junction with Church-street to the Fountain at the junction of Stanmore Hill with Back-lane.
