WHEREAS His Majesty was pleased, by His Commission dated the second day of March, one thousand nine hundred and nine, to nominate and appoint His Royal Highness the Prince of Wales, in His Majesty's absence from His Realm in Foreign Parts, to hold, on His Majesty's behalf, His Privy Council, and to signify thereat His approval of any matter or thing whereunto His Royal Highness should be so authorized by writing under His Majesty's Sign Manual, and to do further on His Majesty's behalf any matter or thing for the purposes of the said Commission whereunto His Royal Highness should be authorized in manner aforesaid.

And whereas by section eighty-three of the Children Act, 1908 (in this Order referred to as the Children Act), it is enacted as follows:—

“The provisions of this part of this Act with respect to industrial schools shall, so far as applicable, apply to certified day industrial schools, subject to such modifications as are made therein by this part of this Act: Provided that His Majesty may by Order in Council make such further modifications of those provisions as may appear to His Majesty to be necessary or proper for adapting those provisions to day industrial schools, and any such Order may provide that a child may be punished for an offence by being sent to a

certified industrial school in lieu of a certified reformatory school, or may otherwise mitigate any punishment imposed by the provisions of this Part of this Act in relation to industrial schools.”

Now, therefore, His Royal Highness the Prince of Wales, being authorized thereto by writing under His Majesty's Sign Manual, and in pursuance of the above mentioned Act, doth hereby, by and with the advice of His Majesty's Privy Council, on behalf of His Majesty, order that the following provisions shall apply to certified day industrial schools:—

Effect of Withdrawal or Resignation of Certificate.

I. Section forty-nine of the Children Act shall, in its application to day industrial schools, take effect with modifications as follows:—

A child shall not be received into a certified day industrial school in pursuance of the Children Act after the date of the receipt by the managers of the school of a notice of withdrawal of the certificate for the school or after the date of a notice of resignation of the certificate; but the obligation hereinafter mentioned of the managers to provide with industrial training, elementary education, and one or more meals a day, any children detained in or attending the school at the respective dates aforesaid shall, except so far as the Secretary of State otherwise directs, continue until the withdrawal or resignation of the certificate takes effect, or until the discontinuance of the contribution out of money provided by Parliament towards the expenses of the children detained in the school, whichever may first happen: Provided that when a child is received in pursuance of section seventy-nine under an attendance order, or without an order, the obligation of the managers shall be suspended

if and so long as the parent fails to carry out the undertaking entered into by him.

Liabilities of Managers.

II. Section fifty-two of the Children Act shall, in its application to day industrial schools, take effect with modifications as follows:—

The managers of a certified day industrial school may decline to receive any child proposed to be sent to them in pursuance of the Children Act, but when they have once accepted any such child they shall be deemed to have undertaken to provide him with industrial training, elementary education, and one or more meals a day during the whole period for which he is liable to be detained in or to attend the school, or until the withdrawal or resignation of the certificate for the school or until the discontinuance of the contribution out of money provided by Parliament towards the expenses of the children detained in the school, whichever may first happen: Provided that when a child is received in pursuance of section seventy-nine under an attendance order, or without an order, the undertaking of the managers shall be suspended if and so long as the parent fails to carry out the undertaking entered into by him.

Choice of School.

III. Section sixty-two of the Children Act shall, in its application to day industrial schools, take effect with modifications as follows:—

The day industrial school to which a child is to be sent under a detention order shall be such school as may be specified in the order, being some certified day industrial school (whether situate within the jurisdiction of the court making the order or not) the managers of which are willing to receive the child, and which is within two and a half miles of the residence of the child.

Provided that, if it is found impossible to specify the school in the detention order, the school shall be such as a justice having jurisdiction in the place where the court which made the order sat may by endorsement on the detention order direct.

Period of Detention.

IV. Section sixty-five of the Children Act shall, in its application to day industrial schools, take effect with modifications as follows:—

The detention order shall specify the time for which the child is to be detained in the school, being such time as to the court may seem proper for the teaching and training of the child, but not in any case extending beyond the time when the child will, in the opinion of the court, attain the age of fourteen years.

V. Section sixty-six of the Children Act shall, in its application to day industrial schools, take effect with modifications as follows:—

(1) The court or justice, in determining the school to which a child is to be sent, whether under a detention order or an attendance order, shall endeavour to ascertain the religious persuasion to which the child belongs, and the order shall, where practicable, specify the religious persuasion to which the child appears to belong, and a school conducted in accordance with that persuasion shall, where practicable, be selected

(2) A minister of the religious persuasion specified in the order of the court as that to which a child sent to a school appears to belong, or specified in the undertaking of the parent, may visit the child at the school on such days, at such times, and on such conditions, as may be fixed by the Secretary of State, for the purpose of

affording him religious assistance and also for the purpose of instructing him in the principles of his religion.

(3) Where an order has been made for sending a child to a school which is not conducted in accordance with the religious persuasion to which the child belongs, the parent, legal guardian, nearest adult relative, or person entitled to the custody of the child may apply to a petty sessional court acting in and for the place in and for which the court which made the order acted, to remove or send the child to a certified day industrial school within two and a half miles of the residence of the child, conducted in accordance with the child's religious persuasion, and the court shall, on proof of the child's religious persuasion, comply with the request of the applicant:—

Provided that—

(i) the application must be made before the child has been sent to a certified day industrial school, or within thirty days after his arrival at the school; and

(ii) the applicant must show to the satisfaction of the court that the managers of the school named by him are willing to receive the child;

(iii) nothing in this section shall be construed as preventing any such person as aforesaid from making an application to the Secretary of State after the expiration of the said period of thirty days to exercise the powers of transfer conferred on him by the other provisions of the Children Act.

Placing out on Licence.

VI.—Section sixty-seven of the Children Act shall, in its application to day industrial schools, take effect with modifications as follows:—

(1) Where a child is sent to a certified day industrial school under a detention order, the managers of the school may at any time give him a licence exempting him from attendance at such school, but conditionally on his attending as a day scholar, in accordance with the bye-laws in force in the place where he resides, some school named in the licence, being a certified efficient school within the meaning of the Elementary Education Act, 1876.

(2) Any licence so granted shall be in force until revoked or forfeited by the breach of any of the conditions on which it was granted.

(3) The managers of the school may at any time by order in writing revoke any such licence, and order the child to return to the school.

(4) Any child refusing to return to the school when required to do so on the revocation or forfeiture of his licence, shall be liable to the same penalty as if he had wilfully neglected to attend the day industrial school.

(5) The time during which a child is absent from a day industrial school in pursuance of a licence under this section shall be deemed to be part of the time of his detention in the school: Provided that, where a child has failed to return to the school on the licence being forfeited or revoked, the time which elapses after his failure so to return shall be excluded in computing the time during which he is to be detained in the school.

(6) Where a licence has been revoked or forfeited and the child refuses or fails to return to the school, a court of summary jurisdiction, if satisfied by information on oath that there is reasonable ground for believing that his parent or guardian could produce the child, may issue a summons requiring the parent or guardian to

attend at the court on such day as may be specified in the summons, and to produce the child, and, if he fails to do so without reasonable excuse, he shall, in addition to any other liability to which he may be subject under the provisions of Part IV of the Children Act, be liable on summary conviction to a fine not exceeding one pound.

Discharge and Transfer.

VII. Section sixty-nine of the Children Act shall, in its application to day industrial schools, take effect with modifications as follows:—

(1) The Secretary of State may at any time order a child to be discharged from a certified day industrial school, whether committed by a detention order or an attendance order.

(2) The Secretary of State may order a child to be transferred from one day industrial school to another within two and a half miles of the residence of the child, or where there are different sections of the same school for different religious denominations, from one section to another.

(3) Where a child is so transferred the undertaking, if any, given by the parent shall continue in force as if the school or section of the school named in the order of transfer had been specified in the undertaking.

Refusal to conform to Rules.

VIII. Section seventy-one of the Children Act shall, in its application to day industrial schools, take effect with modifications as follows:—

If a child of the age of twelve years or upwards sent to a certified day industrial school under a detention order is guilty of a serious and wilful breach of the rules of the school, or of inciting other inmates of the school to such a breach, he shall be liable to be brought before a petty sessional court, and the court, if satisfied on inquiry that it is expedient so to deal with the child, may order him to be sent to a certified industrial school, and to be there detained, subject and according to the provisions of Part IV of the Children Act.

Wilfully neglecting to attend School.

IX. Section seventy-two of the Children Act shall, in its application to day industrial schools, take effect with modifications as follows:—

(1) If a child, of the age of twelve years or upwards, sent to a certified day industrial school under a detention order wilfully neglects to attend thereat, he may at any time before the expiration of his period of detention be brought before a petty sessional court, and the court, if satisfied on inquiry that it is expedient so to deal with the child, may order him to be sent to a certified industrial school to be there detained subject and according to the provisions of Part IV of the Children Act.

(2) If any person—

(a) knowingly assists or induces directly or indirectly a child sent to a certified day industrial school not to attend thereat:

(b) knowingly harbours, conceals, or prevents from returning to school, a child who has neglected to attend the school, or knowingly assists in so doing;

he shall on summary conviction, be liable to be imprisoned for any term not exceeding fourteen days, with or without hard labour, or to a fine not exceeding five pounds.

Reception of Child under Attendance Order or without Order.

X. Whereas it is enacted by section seventy-nine of the Children Act as follows:—

“The managers of a certified day industrial school may, upon the request of a local education authority and of the parent or

guardian of, or other person legally liable to maintain, a child, and upon the undertaking of the parent, guardian, or other person, to pay towards the industrial training and meals of the child such sum as a Secretary of State may authorize, receive the child into the school under an attendance order or without an order of a court.”

And whereas by the eleventh section of the Elementary Education Act, 1876, it is enacted in effect that any child under an attendance order requiring him to attend a certified day school shall attend that school every time that the school is open, or in any other regular manner as is specified in the order:

It is hereby ordered, with respect to an attendance order requiring attendance in a certified day industrial school, that the following provisions shall apply:

(a) The school shall be some certified day industrial school, the managers of which are willing to receive the child, which is within two and a half miles of the residence of the child;

(b) The attendance order shall specify the period for which the child is to attend the school, being such period as to the court seems proper, but not in any case extending beyond the time when the child will attain the age of fourteen years;

(c) The undertaking of the parent may be made in the form set forth in Schedule A hereto; and

It is further ordered with respect to a child received without an order of a court that the undertaking of the parent shall specify the religious persuasion to which the child belongs, and may be made in the form set forth in Schedule B hereto.

Contribution by Parents.

XI. Whereas by Section eighty-two of the Children Act, 1908, it is enacted as follows:—

“(1) Where a court orders a child to be sent to a certified day industrial school, the court shall also order the parent of the child, or other person liable to maintain him, to contribute to his industrial training and meals in the school such sum as is named in the order, not exceeding such sum as may be declared by Order in Council to represent approximately the average cost of industrial training and meals in day industrial schools in the locality in which the school to which the child is sent is situate.

“(2) It shall be the duty of the local education authority to obtain and enforce the order, and every sum paid under the order shall be paid over to the local education authority in aid of their expenses for elementary education under the Education Acts, 1870 to 1907.”

It is hereby declared that the following sums represent approximately the average cost of industrial training and meals in day industrial schools in the localities specified:—

Schools in London, Leeds, and Bristol, 2s. a week;

Schools in other towns in England, 1s. 9d. a week.

XII. Section seventy-five of the Children Act shall, in its application to day industrial schools, take effect with modifications as follows:—

(1) Every order requiring a parent or other person to contribute to the industrial training and meals of a child ordered to be sent to a day industrial school may specify the time during which the payment is to be made, or may direct

the payment to be made until further order, and shall be enforceable as an order of affiliation.

(2) Any such order may, on application being made either by the person on whom the order is made or at the instance of the local education authority, and on fourteen days' notice of such application being given to such authority or person on whom the order was made, be varied by any court which would have had power to make the order.

(3) Any such order shall be binding on the person on whom it is made:

Provided that if that person was not summoned to attend the sitting of the court at which the order was made, the order shall be served on him in manner prescribed by rules of court, and shall be binding on him unless he makes an application against it within the time prescribed by rules of court to the court by which the order was made, on the ground that he is not liable to maintain the child, and on any such application being made the court may confirm the order with or without modifications or may rescind it.

(4) Where a parent or other person has been so ordered to contribute to the industrial training and meals of a child, he shall give notice of any change of address to the local education authority, and if he fails to do so, without reasonable excuse, he shall be liable on summary conviction to a fine not exceeding two pounds.

(5) The local education authority may in their discretion remit wholly or partially any payment ordered to be made under this section.

(6) Where there is some person, other than the parent, for the time being liable to maintain a child, such an order as aforesaid may be made on that person, notwithstanding that there may be also a parent.

(7) Any court making an order for contribution by a parent or other such person may, in any case where there is any pension or income payable to such parent or other person and capable of being attached, after giving the person by whom the pension or income is payable an opportunity of being heard, further order that such part as the court may see fit of the pension or income be attached and be paid to the person named by the court. Such further order shall be an authority to the person by whom such pension or other income is payable to make the payment so ordered, and the receipt of the person to whom the payment is ordered to be made shall be a good discharge to such first-named person.

XIII. Section 88 (6) of the Children Act shall, in its application to day industrial schools, take effect with modifications as follows:—

A certificate purporting to be under the hand of the superintendent of the day industrial school or an officer of the managers, stating that any sum due from a parent or other person for the maintenance of a child is overdue and unpaid shall be evidence of the facts stated therein.

Miscellaneous.

XIV. All expressions used in this Order shall have the same meaning as in the Children Act, 1908.

XV. This Order shall not extend to Scotland or Ireland.

XVI. The Orders in Council of the 20th March, 1877, 25th October, 1881, 12th March, 1903, and 20th November, 1905, are hereby revoked as regards England and Wales.

Undertaking of Parent in the case of an Attendance Order.

Whereas a complaint has been made under the eleventh section of the Elementary Education Act, 1876, against *A.B.* of

, a child under the age of fourteen years, with a view to an order being made requiring him to attend a certified efficient school, and whereas *I, C.D.*, am the parent of the said *A.B.*

, I hereby undertake that if an attendance order be made requiring him to attend the certified day industrial school at , I will pay to the managers of the said school toward the industrial training and meals of the said *A.B.* in the said school the sum of per week so long as such attendance order is in force.

“The parent, or other person liable to maintain a youthful offender or child ordered to be sent to and detained in a certified school, shall, if able to do so, contribute to his maintenance therein a sum not exceeding such sum as may be declared by Order in Council to represent

approximately the average cost of maintenance of youthful offenders or children in the class of school to which such school belongs in the locality in which such school is situate."

Now, therefore, His Royal Highness the Prince of Wales, being authorized thereto by writing under His Majesty's Sign Manual, and in pursuance of the above mentioned Act, doth hereby, by and with the advice of His Majesty's Privy Council, on behalf of His Majesty, declare that the sums shown in the following table represent approximately the average cost of maintenance of youthful offenders or children in the classes of schools and in the localities therein mentioned; and order that the sums which the parent or other person may be ordered to contribute under section 75 of the Children Act, 1908, shall not exceed the sums so shown:—

THE MEXBOROUGH AND SWINTON TRAMWAYS COMPANY hereby give notice, that under the powers conferred on the Company by the Tramways Act, 1870, the following Bye-laws and Regulations shall, subject to the final approval of the Board of Trade, come into force on the eighteenth day of May, 1909:—

1. The Bye-laws and Regulations hereinafter set forth shall extend and apply to all carriages of the Company, and to all places with respect to which the Company have power to make Bye-laws and Regulations.

2. The expression "conductor" shall include any officer or servant in the employment of the Company, and having charge of a carriage.

The expression "interior of a carriage" shall not include the upper deck of covered carriages.

3. Every passenger shall enter or depart from a carriage by the hindermost or conductor's platform, and not otherwise. When a carriage stops, no person shall board the carriage until all passengers desiring to alight therefrom shall have done so.

4. No person shall enter, or mount, or leave, or attempt to enter, mount, or leave, any carriage in motion.

5. No passenger shall smoke in the interior of any carriage, and no person shall spit in, on, from, or against any carriage.

6. No passenger or other person shall, while travelling in or upon any carriage, play or perform upon any musical instrument or beg or

collect money, alms or subscriptions, or sell any article, or play any game or gamble, or deposit remnants of food or fruit in or upon the carriage.

7. A person in a state of intoxication, or affected with any infectious or contagious disease, shall not be allowed to enter or mount upon any carriage, and if found in or upon any carriage shall leave the carriage immediately on being requested to do so by the conductor.

8. No person shall swear or use obscene or offensive language whilst in or upon any carriage, or wilfully interfere with the comfort of any passenger.

9. No person shall commit any nuisance in, on, or against any carriage, tramway station, waiting room, or premises used in connection with the Company's tramways.

10. No person shall wilfully cut, tear, soil or damage the cushions or the linings, or remove or deface any number plate, printed or other notice, in or on the carriage, or break or scratch any window of or otherwise wilfully damage any carriage. Any person acting in contravention of this regulation shall be liable to the penalty prescribed by these bye-laws and regulations, in addition to the liability to pay the amount of any damage done.

11. A person whose dress or clothing might, in the opinion of the conductor, soil or injure the linings or cushions of the carriage, or the dress or clothing of any passenger, or who, in the opinion of the conductor, might for any other reason be offensive to passengers, shall not mount, enter or remain on or in any carriage, and may be prevented from doing so, and, if found on or in any carriage shall, on request of the conductor, leave the same, upon the fare, if previously paid, being returned: Provided that on carriages specially run for artisans, mechanics and daily labourers, no person shall be prevented from entering or remaining in or on a carriage under the provisions of this Bye-law, on the ground of the condition of his dress or clothing, if such condition is solely due to the nature of his employment.

12. Each passenger shall, upon demand, pay to the conductor or other duly authorized officer of the Company the fare legally demandable for the journey.

13. Each passenger shall show his ticket (if any), when required so to do, to the conductor or any duly authorized servant of the Company, and shall also, when required to do so, either deliver up his ticket or pay the fare legally demandable for the distance travelled over by such passenger.

14. A passenger not being an artisan, mechanic, or daily labourer, within the true intent and meaning of the statutory provisions relating to the Company, shall not use or attempt to use any ticket intended only for such artisans, mechanics, or daily labourers.

15. Personal or other luggage (including the tools of artisans, mechanics, and daily labourers) shall, unless otherwise permitted by the conductor, be placed on the front or driver's platform, and not elsewhere. The conductor may decline to take in or upon any carriage any luggage calculated to annoy or inconvenience passengers.

Personal luggage must not exceed 28 lbs. in weight. It will be conveyed at the passenger's own risk, and shall be placed as directed by the conductor.

16. No passenger or other person not being a servant of the Company shall travel on the steps or platforms of any carriage, or stand on the upper deck, or sit on the railing of any carriage,

and any person so travelling, standing, or sitting shall cease to do so immediately on request by the conductor.

17. No person, except a passenger or intending passenger, shall enter or mount any carriage.

18. No person shall hold or hang on by or to any part of any carriage, or travel therein or thereon otherwise than on a seat provided for passengers, except in the interior of the carriage with the consent of the conductor.

19. When a carriage contains the full licensed number of passengers, a conspicuous notice to that effect shall be placed on the carriage.

20. When any carriage contains the full number of passengers which it is licensed to contain, no additional person shall enter, mount, or remain in or on any such carriage when warned by the conductor not to do so.

21. No dog or any other animal shall be allowed in or on any car.

22. No person shall travel in or on any carriage of the Company with loaded fire-arms, or with any instrument or implement which may be dangerous or offensive to any passenger.

23. No passenger shall wilfully obstruct or impede any officer or servant of the Company in the execution of his duty upon or in connection with any carriage or tramway of the Company, and no person other than the conductor or driver shall change or remove the route indicators or destination boards, or interfere with the controllers, brakes, lights, ventilators, trolley cord or any other part of a carriage or its equipment.

24. If at any time a carriage becomes disabled or in any way damaged, or from any cause unable to proceed, the passengers shall, upon the request of the conductor, leave the same, and if such passengers have paid their fares, they shall not be entitled to demand back the amount of their fares so paid, but on production of their tickets shall be allowed to travel by the next available carriage the remainder of the distance in respect of which they have paid their fares. No person shall, except with the leave of the conductor, enter a disabled or damaged carriage.

25. Any person who shall commit, whilst in or on any carriage, any breach of these Bye-laws and Regulations, shall be liable, in addition to incurring the penalty hereinafter provided, to be immediately removed from the carriage by or under the direction of the conductor, and if such person shall have paid his fare, he shall not be entitled to claim its return.

26. The conductor and motorman shall enforce these Bye-laws and Regulations, and prevent the breach thereof to the best of their ability.

27. Any person offending against or committing a breach of any of these Bye-laws and Regulations shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding Forty Shillings.

28. There shall be placed and kept placed in a conspicuous position inside of each carriage in use a printed copy of these Bye-laws and Regulations.

29. These Bye-laws and Regulations shall come into force on the eighteenth day of May, 1909.

(Extension of Powers of London County Council of making By-laws with respect to Rotherhithe Tunnel, and provisions incidental thereto; Pensions or Compensation for persons employed at Feltham Industrial School; Confirmation of Agreement with Ecclesiastical Commissioners; Amendment of Acts.)

NOTICE is hereby given, that application will be made to Parliament by Petition for Additional Provision for leave to introduce into the Bill now pending in Parliament, under the title of the "London County Council (General Powers) Bill," promoted by the London County Council (hereinafter called "the Council"), provision for the following purposes, namely:—

To extend and enlarge the powers of the Council under the Thames Tunnel (Rotherhithe and Ratcliff) Act, 1900, of making by-laws and regulations for the control and protection of the tunnel authorised by the said Act, and of persons resorting to or using the same and for the management and direction of traffic therein, so as to enable the Council to make, vary, and enforce by-laws and regulations for the like purposes, or any of them, in respect of the approaches to the said tunnel.

To make provisions with respect to the making, confirmation, approval, publication, and evidence of any by-laws and regulations so made and to prescribe penalties for breaches of or failure to comply with any such by-law or regulation.

To extend and apply to the said approaches any such by-laws or regulations as aforesaid made by the Council with respect to the said tunnel, and for the time being in force, or to make provision for such extension and application.

To empower the Council, upon the discontinuance of the Feltham Industrial School, to grant pensions or allowances or pay compensation to persons employed by them in connection with the said school.

To confirm an agreement between the Council and the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for the purchase by the Council from the said Commissioners of certain lands in the parish and metropolitan borough of Lambeth, abutting upon and required for the purpose of widening Belvedere-road, and to provide for effect being given to the said agreement, notwithstanding any enactment conferring powers or imposing restrictions upon the said Commissioners with respect to the disposal of lands.

The Additional Provision will vary and extinguish all existing rights and privileges which would interfere with its objects, and will or may so far as may be necessary for the purposes aforesaid amend or alter the provisions of the said Thames Tunnel (Rotherhithe and Ratcliff) Act, 1900, and any other Act or Acts relating to the Council.
