N the 16th instant the Duke of Savoy had another lit of his Ague, (which for some time had left him,) but has had none fince, and is at prefent to well, that he has discharged his Phylitims; His Royal Highness went yesterday, for the hange of Air, from the Palace upon the Peto Revesliafie, about 5 or 6 miles from hence, where he intends to flay till he is quite recovered. The 17th arrwed here the Bavarian Regiments, whereof 2 Batthe next day towards Mondoui, where they are to have their Quarters. Francfort, Novemb. 30. We hear from Alface, That the French continue with great diligence their Recruits and new Levies in those Parts, forcing into theirService all the youngMen they think fit for it, by which means they have almost com-pleated the 2 Regiments that are raised and to be maintained by the Country of Alface. The Advices from Strasbourg fay likewise, That they are Building there divers Boats and small Vessels, which are to be finished in two Months; And that the Lieutenant General Marquis d'Uxelles, and the Lieutenant General Marquis de Chamilly, were in pursuance of the Orders they had received, gone to the French Court, having left the Marefchal de Camp Melac and the Count de Coizny to Command the French Troops in the Upper and Lower Alface. They write from Hydelberg, That: they continue to work very hard on the Fortificatincations of that City; And that the Confederate Forces quartered near the Rhine have Orders to be in readiness to draw together in case there, bo occasion.
