WILD BIRD (ENGLAND).

The Wild Birds Protection (City of Norwich) Order, 1909.

Dated 6th April, 1909.

In pursuance of the powers conferred on me by the Wild Birds Protection Acts, 1880 to 1908, and upon application by the Council of the City of Norwich, I hereby make the following Order:—

Title.

I. This Order may be cited as "The Wild Birds Protection (City of Norwich) Order, 1909."

BIRDS.

Additions to the Schedule of the Act of 1880.

II. The Wild Birds Protection Act, 1880, shall apply within the City and the County of the City of Norwich (which county includes all that part of Norwich without the walls and within the areas described in Clause V of this Order) to the following species of Wild Birds in the same manner as if those species were included in the schedule to the Act:—Little Bittern, Great
