

Bustard, Crossbill, Sand Martin, Bearded Reedling (Bearded Tit, Reed Pheasant).

Close Time extended.

III. The period during which the killing or taking of Wild Birds is prohibited by the Wild Birds Protection Act, 1880, shall be extended throughout the City and the County of the City of Norwich so far as regards the Birds mentioned in the schedule to the said Act or added thereto by the Act of 1881, or by Clause II of this Order, except Snipe, Teal, and all species of Wild Duck, so as to be between the 1st day of March and the 1st day of September in any year.

Certain Birds protected during the whole of the Year.

IV. During that period of the year to which the protection afforded by the Wild Birds Protection Act, 1880 (as extended by Clause III of this Order) does not apply, the killing or taking of the Bittern, Little Bittern, Great Bustard, Goldfinch, Kingfisher, Owl (all species) and Bearded Reedling (Bearded Tit, Reed Pheasant) is prohibited throughout the City and County of the City of Norwich.

All Birds Protected on Sundays.

V. During that period of the year to which the protection afforded by the Wild Birds Protection Act, 1880 (as extended by Clause III of this Order) does not apply, the killing or taking of Wild Birds on Sundays is prohibited within the City of Norwich, and within the County of the said City, namely, the parts without the walls, and the parts of the Rivers Yare or Wensum within the County of the said City, from the boundary of the County of the said City at Hellesdon to Hardley Cross, at Hardley, and from Trowse Hythe to, at, or near, Earlham Bridge, and the rands, skirts, and walls of all the before-mentioned rivers, and the fens, reed grounds, islands therein, and dykes within the said County communicating therewith.

Eggs.

All Eggs Protected in certain Areas.

VI. The taking or destroying of the eggs of any species of Wild Birds—except the House Sparrow—is prohibited during the period expiring on the last day of February, 1914, within the areas described in Clause V. of this Order.

Repeal of former Order.

VII. The Order of the 23rd April, 1906, is hereby repealed.

WILD BIRD (ENGLAND).

The Wild Birds Protection (Administrative County of the Isle of Wight) Order, 1909.

Dated 6th April, 1909.

In pursuance of the powers conferred on me by the Wild Birds Protection Acts, 1880 to 1908, and upon application by the County Council of

the Administrative County of the Isle of Wight, I hereby make the following Order:—

Title.

I. This Order may be cited as the Wild Birds Protection (Administrative County of the Isle of Wight) Order, 1909.

BIRDS.

Close Time Extended.

II. The time during which the killing or taking of Wild Birds is prohibited by the Act of 1880 shall be extended, so far as concerns the Administrative County of the Isle of Wight, so as to be between the last day of February and the first day of September in any year.

Additions to the Schedule of the Act of 1880.

III. The Wild Birds Protection Act, 1880, shall apply within the Administrative County of the Isle of Wight to the following species of Wild Birds in the same manner as if those species were included in the Schedule to the Act:—

Girl Bunting, Common Bunting, Reed Bunting, Chiffchaff, Peregrine Falcon, Spotted Flycatcher, Heron, Kestrel, House Martin, Sand Martin, Raven, Red-backed Shrike, Swallow, Swift, Missel Thrush, Wagtail (all species), Blackcap Warbler, Garden Warbler, Grasshopper Warbler, Sedge Warbler, Wood Warbler, Wheatear, Whinchat, Golden-crested Wren, Wryneck.

The Cormorant deprived of Protection.

IV. The Wild Birds Protection Act, 1880, shall not apply within the Administrative County of the Isle of Wight to the Cormorant.

Certain Birds protected during the whole of the Year.

V. During that period of the year to which the protection afforded by the Wild Birds Protection Act, 1880 (as extended by Clause II of this Order), does not apply, it shall be unlawful throughout the Administrative County of the Isle of Wight to kill or take any of the Wild Birds mentioned in the schedule of that Act, or added thereto by the Wild Birds Protection Act, 1881, or by Clause III of this Order, except only the Eider Duck, Gannet, Lapwing (Peawit or Green Plover), Mallard (Wild Duck), Plover, Snipe, Solan Goose, Summer Snipe, Teal, Widgeon, and Woodcock.

All Birds protected on Sundays in certain Areas.

VI. During the period between the 31st day of August in any year and the 1st day of March following, the taking or killing of Wild Birds on Sundays is prohibited in that part of the Administrative County of the Isle of Wight which lies within the district of the Rural District Council, and outside the several Urban Districts in the said Isle.

Eggs.

Certain Eggs protected throughout the County.

VII. The taking or destroying of the Eggs of the following species of Wild Birds is prohibited within the Administrative County of the Isle of Wight:—

Peregrine Falcon, Kestrel, Kingfisher, Nightjar, Owl, Raven,
