All Eggs protected within Certain Areas.

VIII. The taking or destroying of the Eggs of any species of Wild Bird is prohibited within the following areas for a period of five years from the date of this Order:—

The Red Cliff and Culver Cliffs, between the west side of the Red Cliff Fort on the west and the point of the Culvers forming the western boundary of Whitecliff Bay on the east, from the sea level to the Government boundary; the whole of the cliffs in the parishes of Freshwater and Totland from the westernmost point of Cave Bay, thence round the coast to Sconce Point, and a hundred yards inland from the top of such cliffs.

Repeal of former Order.

IX. The Order of the 19th December, 1903, is hereby repealed.
