

**ELEMENTARY SCHOOL TEACHERS
(SUPERANNUATION) ACT, 1898.**

With reference to the notice, which appeared in the London Gazette of 15th January last, of the proposed amendment of No. 10 of the Elementary School Teachers Superannuation Rules, 1899, in order to provide for the direct payment by teachers in Residential Training Colleges of their contributions to the Deferred Annuity Fund under the Elementary School Teachers (Superannuation) Act, 1898, notice is hereby given, in pursuance of the Rules Publication Act, 1893, that it is for the same reason proposed by the Treasury and the Board of Education to amend No. 12 of the above-mentioned rules by the omission of the words "or a residential training college in receipt of a grant."
