(SWINE-FEVER INFECTED AREA.)

Declaration of Swine-Fever Infected Area.

1. The Area described in the Schedule to this Order is hereby declared to be a Swine-Fever Infected Area for the purposes of the Swine-Fever (Regulation of Movement) Order of 1908.

Commencement.

2. This Order shall come into operation on the twenty-first day of April, nineteen hundred and nine.

(SWINE-FEVER INFECTED AREA.)

The Board of Agriculture and Fisheries, by virtue and in exercise of the powers vested in them under the Diseases of Animals Acts, 1894 to 1908, and of every other power enabling them in this behalf, do order, and it is hereby ordered, as follows:

Declaration of Swine-Fever Infected Area.

1. The Area described in the Schedule to this Order is hereby declared to be a Swine-Fever Infected Area for the purposes of the Swine-Fever (Regulation of Movement) Order of 1908.

Saving of Local Order.

2. This Order shall not affect the movement of swine which are being moved to or from premises to which the Leeds Allotment Gardens (Swine-Fever) Order of 1909 applies under and in accordance with a licence granted under that Order.

Suspension of Local Order.

3. So long as the county borough of Leeds continues to be, or be comprised in, a Swine-Fever Infected Area, the Order now in force, which declares that the provisions of the Swine-Fever (Regulation of Movement) Order of 1908
