

General Provisions as to Movement.

7. Sheep, while being moved under this Order, shall as far as practicable be kept separate from all other sheep, and, if moved with a licence, shall be moved by the nearest available route and without unnecessary delay to the place of destination specified in the licence, and not elsewhere.

Provision for Movement through Scheduled Areas.

8. For the purposes of this Order, sheep shall not be deemed to be moved out of a Scheduled Area in any case where they are moved through such Area by railway from a place outside such Area to another place outside such Area without unnecessary delay and without the sheep being untrucked within such Area.

Production of Licences; Names and Addresses.

9.—(1.) Any person in charge of a sheep being moved, where under this Order a licence is necessary, shall, on demand of a Justice, or of a constable, or of an Inspector or other officer of the Board or of a Local Authority, produce and show to him the licence, if any, authorising the movement, and shall allow it to be read and a copy of or extract from it to be taken by the person to whom it is produced.

(2.) Any person so in charge shall, on demand as aforesaid, give his name and address to the Justice, or constable, or Inspector or other officer.

Local Authority to enforce Order.

10. The provisions of this Order shall be executed and enforced by the Local Authority.

Offences.

11.—(1.) If a sheep is moved in contravention of this Order, the owner of the sheep, and the person in charge thereof, and the person causing, directing, or permitting the movement, and the person moving or conveying the sheep, and the consignee or other person receiving or keeping it knowing it to have been moved in contravention as aforesaid, and the occupier of the place from which the sheep is moved, shall, each according to and in respect of his own acts and defaults, be deemed guilty of an offence against the Act of 1894.

(2.) If any person, with a view unlawfully to evade or defeat the operation of this Order, by clipping, or washing, or in any other manner, takes out, effaces, or obliterates or attempts to take out, efface, or obliterate, any mark painted or stamped on any sheep, as required by this Order, the person doing the same, and the person causing, directing, or permitting the same to be done, and the owner of the sheep, and the person for the time being in charge thereof, shall, each according to and in respect of his own acts and defaults, be deemed guilty of an offence against the Act of 1894.

(3.) If a person in charge of a sheep being moved, where under this Order a licence is necessary, on demand made under this Order, fails to give his true name and address, or gives a false name or address, he shall be deemed guilty of an offence against the Act of 1894.

(4.) If any person fails to deliver up or send a licence as required by this Order, he shall be deemed guilty of an offence against the Act of 1894.

Interpretation.

12. In this Order, unless the context otherwise requires—

“Efficient sheep-dip” means a sheep-dip approved by the Board for sheep-scab, or purporting to be so approved:

“Inspector” includes Veterinary Inspector:

“The Board” means the Board of Agriculture and Fisheries:

“The Act of 1894” means the Diseases of Animals Act, 1894.

Application of Sheep-Dipping (Scotland and North of England) Order of 1907.

13. Nothing in this Order shall affect the operation of the Sheep-Dipping (Scotland and North of England) Order of 1907 in the Scheduled Areas.

Commencement.

14. This Order shall come into operation on the sixteenth day of May, nineteen hundred and nine.

Short Title.

15. This Order may be cited as the AYRSHIRE (CARRICK DISTRICT) (MOVEMENT OF SHEEP) ORDER OF 1909.

SCHEDULE.*Areas to which this Order applies.*

Areas in the county of Ayr:—

I. Commencing at a point where the main road crosses the Water of Girvan at Dailly Village; thence, northwards, along the east side of Dalquharran-road, from Dailly to Kilkerran Station; thence, excluding the premises of the Glasgow and South Western Railway, Kilkerran Station, easterly, along the south side of the road leading to Straiton, via Cloyntie, to the bridge crossing the Water of Girvan at Straiton; thence, southwards along the Water of Girvan to a point where Craigfad Farm marches with Dalmorton; thence westerly along the southern boundaries of the following farms: Craigfad, Dyke, Knockgardner, Shaws Knowe, Blair, Whitehill and Moorston, to the point where the southern boundary of Moorston Farm meets the Water of Girvan near Dailly Village; and thence along that stream to the point of commencement.

II. Commencing at Alton Albany Farm House, on the south side of the public road, near Barr Village; thence, south-westerly, along the south side of the road to its junction with the main road from Girvan to Barhill; thence, southerly, along the east side of the road to Blair, south-east of Barhill, as far as the southern boundary of Blair Farm; thence, easterly, along the south-eastern boundaries of the farms of Blair, Laggan, Darnacounar and Black Clachrie; and, thence along the eastern boundaries of the farms of White Clachrie and White Knowes to the point of commencement.
