Twelve Capital Burgesses and Commonalty of Sheffield aforesaid.

"Now, therefore, with the consent of the Right Honourable and Most Reverend Cosmo Gordon, Archbishop of York (in testimony whereof he has signed and sealed this scheme), we, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners, humbly recommend and propose that all that part of the said new parish of Darnall which is more particularly described in the schedule hereunder written and is delineated and set forth on the map or plan hereunto annexed shall upon and from the day of the date of the publication in the London Gazette of any Order of Your Majesty in Council ratifying this scheme become and be constituted a separate district for spiritual purposes and that the same shall be named 'The District of Saint Alban, Darnall.'

"And we further recommend and propose that the whole right of patronage of the said district so recommended to be constituted and when such district shall have become a new parish as aforesaid then of the said new parish and of the nomination of the Minister or Incumbent thereof shall without any assurance in the law other than this scheme and any duly gazetted Order of Your Majesty in Council ratifying the same and upon and from the day of the date of the publication of such Order in the London Gazette as aforesaid be assigned to and be vested in and shall be exercised by the said Twelve Capital Burgesses and Commonalty of the town and parish of Sheffield and their successors.

"And we further recommend and propose that nothing herein contained shall prevent us from recommending and proposing any other measures relating to the matters aforesaid or any of them in accordance with the provisions of the said Acts or of either of them or of any other Act of

Parliament.

"The SCHEDULE to which the foregoing scheme has reference.

"The district of Saint Alban, Darnall, being :-"All that part of the new parish (sometime district) of Darnall, in the county of York and in the diocese of York, which is bounded upon the east by the parochial chapelry of Tinsley, upon the north by the new parish of Saint Bartholomew, Carbrook, upon the north-west partly by the last named new parish and partly by the new parish of Attercliffe, all in the said county and diocese, and upon the remaining sides, that is to say, upon the south-west and upon the south-east, by an imaginary line commencing at the point in the middle of the aqueduct which carries the Sheffield and Tinsley Canal across Darnall-road where the boundary which divides the said new parish of Attercliffe from the said new parish of Darnall diverges from the middle of the said aqueduct, and extending thence along the middle of the said aqueduct for a distance of half a chain or thereabouts to the point where such aqueduct crosses the middle of Darnall-road, and extending thence south-eastward along the middle of Darnall-road for a distance of thirtytwo chains and a half or thereabouts to its junction with Basford-street, and extending thence north-eastward along the middle of Basford-street for a distance of eighteen chains or thereabouts to its junction with Copster-road, and extending thence first eastward and then south-eastward along the middle of Uopster-road for a distance of fourteen chains or thereabouts to its eastern end on the western side of Car Brook, and continuing thence south-eastward in the last mentioned direction and in a straight line to a point in the middle of the said brook upon the boundary which divides the said new

parish of Darnall from the said parochial chapelry of Tinsley."

And whereas drafts of the said scheme have, in accordance with the provisions of the firstly hereinbefore mentioned Act, been transmitted to the Patrons and to the Incumbent of the cure out of which it is intended that the district recommended in such scheme to be constituted shall be taken, and such Patrons and Incumbent have respectively signified their assent to such scheme.

And whereas the said scheme has been approved by His Majesty in Council: Now, therefore, His Majesty, by and with the advice of His said Council, is pleased hereby to ratify the said scheme, and to order and direct that the same and every part thereof shall be effectual in law immediately from and after the time when this Order shall have been duly published in the London Gazette pursuant to the said Acts; and His Majesty, by and with the like advice, is pleased hereby to direct that this Order be forthwith registered by the Registrar of the said diocese of York.

HEREAS the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England have, in pursuance of the Act of the fifty-ninth year of His late Majesty King George the Third, chapter one hundred and thirty-four; of the Act of the second and third years of Her late Majesty Queen Victoria, chapter forty-nine; and of the Act of the nineteenth and twentieth years of Her said late Majesty, chapter fifty-five, duly prepared and laid before His Majesty in Council a representation, bearing date the sixth day of May, in the year one thousand nine hundred and nine, in the words and figures following, that is to say:—

"We, the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, in pursuance of the Act of the fiftyninth year of His late Majesty King George the Third, chapter one hundred and thirty-four; of the Act of the second and third years of Her late Majesty Queen Victoria, chapter forty-nine; and of the Act of the nineteenth and twentieth years of Her said late Majesty, chapter fifty-five, have prepared, and now humbly lay before Your Majesty in Council, the following representation as to the assignment of a district chapelry to the consecrated church of All Saints, Sydenham, situate in the new parish (sometime consolidated chapelry) of Saint Michael and All Angels, Bell Green, Lower Sydenham, in the county of Kent and in the diocese of Southwark.

"Whereas it appears to us to be expedient that a district chapelry should be assigned to the said church of All Saints, Sydenham, situate as aforesaid.

"Now therefore, with the consent of the Right Reverend Edward Stuart, Bishop of Southwark (testified by his having signed and sealed this representation), we, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners, humbly represent that it would, in our opinion, be expedient that all that part of the said new parish of Saint Michael and All Angels, Bell Green, Lower Sydenham, which is described in the schedule hereunder written, all which part, together with the boundaries
