The Board of Agriculture and Fisheries, by virtue and in exercise of the powers vested in them under the Diseases of Auimals Acts, 1894 to 1903, and of every other power enabling them in this behalf, do order, and it is hereby ordered, as follows:

From and after the twenty-seventh day of August, nineteen hundred and nine, Article 3 of the Leeds Allotment Gardens (Swine-Fever) Order of 1909, which regulates movement of swine for immediate slaughter shall extend to movement to any part of the Victoria Cattle Market, known as the Pig Market, Gelderd-road, in the city of Leeds, specially authorised to be used under and in accordance with the conditions of Article 5 of the Swine-Fever (Regulation of Movement) Order of 1908, and, notwithstanding anything contained in the last-mentioned Article or in Article 5 of the first-mentioned Order, such swine may be moved from the said part of the Market either to a bacon-factory or slaughterhouse, or back to the premises whence they were moved thereto, if accompanied by the licence necessary for the purpose.
