Part II; Part III; sections 52 to 66 (both inclusive) and section 68, comprised in Part IV; Part V; and Part VI;

subject to the conditions and adaptations specified in the schedule to the Order and affecting sections 25, 27, 35, 38, 59 and 75 of the said Act.

PUBLIC HEALTH ACTS AMENDMENT ACT, 1907.

NOTICE is hereby given that, pursuant to section 3 of the Public Health Acts Amendment Act, 1907, the Local Government Board have issued an Order, dated the 2nd day of August, 1909, declaring that on and after the 13th day of September, 1909, Part II; Part III; sections 52, 53, 54, 55, 56, 57, 58, 59, 60, 62, 63, 64, 65, 66 and 68 comprised in Part IV; Part VI; and Part X of the said Act shall be in force in the urban district of Burnham; but that where a section to which reference is made in the first column of the schedule hereto is a section comprised in Part II, Part III, or Part X, or is one of the sections described as comprised in Part IV, and declared to be in force, the section shall be in force in the said district, and shall have effect until the Local Government Board by order otherwise direct, as if the words and figures set forth in the said schedule in reference to such section were added to and formed part of the section.

SCHEDULE.

Conditions and adaptations subject to which the sections named below respectively shall be in force in the said district.

PART II.

Section
twenty-five.

“The power of making or enforcing bye-laws under section 157 of the Public Health Act, 1875, as extended by section 23 of the Public Health Acts Amendment Act, 1890, with respect to the paving of yards and open spaces in connection with dwelling-houses, shall cease to be exercisable.”

Section
twenty-seven.

“(7) Nothing in this section shall apply to any temporary building erected or set up for use by the Territorial Force.”

PART III.

Section
thirty-five.

“This section, so far as it relates to the deposit of material, shall have effect subject to the first proviso to section 91 of the Public Health Act, 1875.

“Bye-laws made in pursuance of section 16 of the Local Government Act, 1888, for the prevention and suppression of nuisances shall not, in relation to any subject-matter of this section, be of any force or effect within the district.”

Section
thirty-eight.

“Nothing in this section shall prejudicially affect any power or right exercisable by or attaching to an owner or occupier of premises by virtue of section 22 of the Public Health Act, 1875, or of section 18 of the Public Health Acts Amendment Act, 1890.”

PART IV.

Section
fifty-nine.

“(6) Nothing in this section shall apply to a public or circulating library which is not within the district.”

PART X.

Section ninety-four,
Sub-section (5).

“Nothing in this subsection shall require the name of an owner to be painted on a boat or vessel which, in pursuance of any other enactment applicable to waters within the district, has the name of an owner, a master, or another person painted on the outside, and which, for the time being, is used, or is intended to be used, as a pleasure boat or pleasure vessel.”
