- THE MAYOR, ALDERMEN, AND BURGESSES of the BOROUGH OF WIDNES hereby give notice that under the powers conferred upon them by the Widnes Corporation Act. 1908, and the Tramways Act, 1870, the following Bye-laws and Regulations shall, subject to the final approval of the Board of Trade, come into force on the first day of November, 1909:—
- 1. Throughout these Bye-laws the expression "the Corporation" means the Mayor, Aldermen, and Burgesses of the borough of Widnes, acting by the Council; the term "motor omnibus," shall mean any carriage for the conveyance of passengers moved by mechanical power, including in that expression steam, electrical, and every other motive power not being animal power, which the Council may provide and run within the limits authorised by the Widnes Corporation Act, 1908, and the terms "driver" and "guard," shall respectively mean the driver and guard or other person having charge of any motor omnibus.
- 2. The Bye-laws hereinafter set forth shall apply to all motor omnibuses belonging to the Corporation, and to all places within which the Corporation are authorised by the Widnes Corporation Act, 1908, to provide and run motor omnibuses.
- 3. No person shall spit on the floor, platform, or roof, or on any part of any motor omnibus, or shall smoke or carry any lighted pipe, cigar, or cigarette inside any motor omnibus, except in a compartment or portion of a compartment specially set apart for the purpose.
- 4. A person in a state of intoxication, or suffering from any infectious or contagious disease, or whose dress or clothing may, in the opinion of the guard, soil or injure the coverings, linings or cushions of the motor omnibus, or a person who may for any reason be offensive to passengers, shall not be entitled to enter or remain in or upon any motor omnibus, and may be prevented from entering or mounting the same, and shall not enter or mount any motor omnibus after being requested not to do so by the guard, and if found in or upon the motor omnibus shall, on the request of the guard, quit the same upon the fare, if previously paid, being returned, and may be removed by or under the direction of the guard. Provided that, on motor omnibuses run for artisans, mechanics, or daily labourers, no artisan, mechanic, or daily labourer shall be prevented from entering or mounting, or requested to leave an omnibus under the provisions of this Bye-law on the ground of the condition of his clothing, if such condition is solely due to the nature of his employment.
- 5. No person shall swear or use obscene, profane, or offensive lauguage whilst in or upon any motor omnibus, or commit any nuisance in, or upon, or against any motor omnibus, or wilfully interfere with the comfort of any passenger,
- 6. No person, not being a servant of the Council, duly authorised in that behalf, shall touch, handle, or interfere with any machine or appliance in, under, upon, or about any motor omnibus.
- 7. Each passenger shall, upon demand, ray to the guard or other duly authorised officer of the Council, the fare legally demandable for the journey, and in any case, whether demanded or not, shall pay such fare before leaving the motor omnibus.
- 8. Each passenger shall show his ticket (if any) when required so to do to the guard or any

- duly authorised servant of the Council, and shall also, when required so to do, either show his ticket or pay the fare legally demandable for the distance travelled over by such passenger.
- 9. Luggage of a form or description which in the opinion of the guard is calculated to annoy or inconvenience any passenger shall not be taken in or upon any motor omnibus.
- 10. No passenger or other person, not being a servant of the Council employed in connection with a motor omnibus, shall travel on the steps of any motor omnibus, or stand either on the roof or platform, or in the interior of any motor omnibus, or sit on the outside rail, on the roof or platform of any motor omnibus.
- 11. No person shall hold or hang on by or to any part of any motor omnibus, or travel therein otherwise than on a seat provided for passengers.
- 12. When any motor omnibus contains the full number of passengers which it is authorised to contain, no additional person shall enter, mount, or remain in or on any such motor omnibus after being warned by the guard not to do so.
- 13. No dog or other animal shall be allowed inside any motor omnibus. Any dog or other animal taken into any motor omnibus in breach of this Regulation, shall be removed by the person in charge of such dog or other animal from inside the motor omnibus immediately upon request of the guard.
- 14. No person shall enter, get upon, or travel in or on any motor omnibus with loaded firearms, or with any article, instrument, or implement which may be dangerous or offensive to any passenger.
- 15. No passenger or other person shall wilfully obstruct or impede any officer or servant of the Corporation in the execution of his duty, upon or in connection with any motor omnibus.
- 16. A passenger not being an artisan, mechanic, or daily labourer shall not use or attempt to use any ticket intended only for such artisans, mechanics, or daily labourers.
- 17. The driver of a motor omnibus, on coming in sight of a vehicle standing or travelling on any part of the road so as not to leave sufficient space for the motor omnibus to pass, shall sound his bell or horn or whistle as a warning to the person in charge of such vehicle.
- in 18. If at any time a motor omnibus becomes disabled or in any way damaged or from any cause unable to proceed, the passengers shall, upon the request of the guard, leave the same, and if such passengers have paid their fares they shall not be entitled to demand back the amount of their fares so paid but ou production of their tickets shall be allowed to travel by the next available motor omnibus the remainder of the distance in respect of which they have paid their fares. No person shall, except with the leave of the guard, enter a disabled or damaged motor omnibus.
- 19. Any person offending against or committing a breach of any of these Bye-laws shall be liable to a penalty of not exceeding forty shillings.
- 20. There shall be placed and kept in a conspicuous position, inside of each motor omnibus in use, a printed copy of these Bye-laws and Regulations.
- 21. These Bye-laws shall come into force on the first day of November, one thousand nine hundred and nine.
