The KING has been pleased, by Letters Patent, dated the 8th September, 1909, passed under the Great Seal of the United Kingdom, to reconstitute the office of Governor and Commander-in-Chief of the Bahama Islands. and to make further provision for the Government thereof.

WILD BIRD (ENGLAND).

The Wild Birds Protection (County of Monmouth) Order, 1909.

Dated 1st October, 1909.

In pursuance of the powers conferred on me by the Wild Birds Protection Acts, 1880 to 1908, and upon application by the County Council of the Administrative County of Monmouth, I hereby make the following Order:—

Title.

I. This Order may be cited as "The Wild Birds Protection (County of Monmouth) Order, 1909."

BIRDS.

Certain Birds protected during the whole of the Year.

II. During the period between the 31st day of July in any year and the 2nd day of March following, the killing or taking of the Bittern, Peregrine Falcon, Goldfinch, Heron, Kestrel,

Kingfisher, Kite, and Owl is prohibited throughout the County of Monmouth.

Eggs.

The Eggs of the Goldfinch and Kingfisher protected.

III. The taking or destroying of the Eggs of the Goldfinch and the Kingfisher is prohibited throughout the County of Monmouth.

Repeal of former Order.

IV. The Order of the 27th May, 1907, is hereby repealed.
