Amsterdam, Aug. 7. There are lately arrived at the Vly Ships, and 20 others at the Texel, all of them from the Sounds, but as yet we have no news of our Greenland Fishermen, but only by a small Vessel of Middlebourg lately come infrom Hitland, we are told that the While-nilhing in those parts was much hindred by the great quantities of ice which had kept them off from those Coasts.

The first instant went off from the Texel 2 Ships bound for the Indies, and 2 for Sh. Huber. IT is said also that the Fleet designed for the streights, Portugal, and Spain, is put to see under the Convoy of Captain Van der Zaen.

From Swizzerland we are in ormed, that the Assembly or Dick of the Cantons is adjourned till November next enquing, at which time they intend to conferre with the Grifons and Valetiens with other their Allies, and then to come to a final resolution in reference to their assaus with France; and that they intend to send an Ambassador to His Most Christian Ma esty, to demand that the last Treaty made with them, may be put into execution, and the Alliance renewed, which is denied, they resolve to remand all the Swissesmployed in His Majesties, service.

Dublin, July 19. On Tucklay next, the body of the Right Honourable the Countels of Arran, who died later ly in this City, is to be folemnly laid in State, and after a moneths continuance here, will be with with much folemnity conveyed hence to Kilkenny, with all expressions of Honour fuitable to a Person of her Birth, Eminency and Meric.
