shall read it aloud or otherwise submit it to each witness, and shall request him to attach his signature as an indication that the report correctly represents the effect of his statements.

5. On receipt of a report from an officer, the Board shall scrutinise the same and may make such further inquiry or take such further steps as they deem necessary for the purpose of examining into the accuracy of the particulars contained therein, and in the event of the Board's being satisfied that the case is one for a notification under section three of the Act the notification shall be made by the Board in the form contained in the schedule annexed hereto or in a similar form, and shall be signed by the Chairman, or by the Secretary or other officer of the Board duly authorised for the purpose.

Provided that where notification by telegram is deemed necessary by the Board, nothing herein contained shall make it illegal to accept such notification embracing the particulars specified in the schedule annexed hereto as a valid notification under the Act; but it shall be the duty of the Board to confirm such notification in writing forthwith.

A copy of every such notification, and a list of the persons to whom it was sent, shall be entered by the Board in a register to be kept for the purpose.
